57th Annual Model A Reunion July 26th-27th-28th, 2019 YOU AND YOUR FAMILY ARE INVITED...



This Model "A" Reunion is the greatest gathering of old Fords and old Ford enthusiasts in Wisconsin. This Reunion started in 1962, and is sponsored by four clubs: Central Wisconsin Chapter MARC/MAFCA, Nickle A Region MARC, Wisconsin Chapter MAFCA, and the Wisconsin Region MARC.

The meet consists of a weekend of enjoying Model A's and Model A fellowship, and includes a Tour around the Rapids area, People's Choice Awards, Car Games, Kids' Games, Adult Games, a Hubley Derby, Chapter Team Events, Rolling Pin Toss, a Dance, Fund-Raising Auctions, Shoe Box Swap Meet, as well as lots of surprises and fun.

The Reunion is held the last full weekend in July, unless it conflicts with a National MARC or MAFCA meet. The Central Wisconsin Chapter MARC/MAFCA hosts the reunion on their private 10-acre site, which includes a clubhouse, wooded campsites, and is close to many nice motels and restaurants.

Location: The clubgrounds are located 4 miles east of Wisconsin Rapids, or 11 miles west of Plover, just south of state Highway 54. Turn south on 72nd Street North (a dead end road). Watch for signs.

Weekend Activities

Refreshments are available throughout the weekend for registered participants.

Good Food: A potluck lunch will be held on Saturday and Sunday. Participants are asked to bring 2 dishes to pass (one for each day). Friday and Saturday evening, you may want to roast hot dogs at your campsite or go out for a relaxed dinner at one of the nearby restaurants with a group of your new friends.

Friday afternoon the registration table opens. An Auction will be held in the evening of Model A related items, as well as other donated items for the kids, ladies, and men. There will also be a corn roast.

Saturday morning starts with a Shoe Box Swap Meet, Technical Seminar. This will be followed by a Ski Race then a noon potluck, and then a driving tour. A Basket Raffle will be held throughout the day, with the drawing that night. There will also be a Slow Drive competition for the Model A's, a Hubley Derby Kids' Games and Adult Games. A dance will be held at the clubhouse for the evening's entertainment.

Sunday is a day of Car Games, Potluck Lunch, Chapter Team Events, and a Ladies Rolling Pin Toss, followed by the awards presentation and Raffle Drawings.

Primitive campsites are available on the grounds for \$15/site for the entire weekend. For an additional charge, a few sites have power, but is limited to the first 12 registered participants. 

March 10, 2019

The meeting was called to order at 1:34 p.m.

President - Deb - The Board received the newsletters from the reciprocating clubs. MAFFI sent a thank you note for the \$100.00 donation the club made. A letter was received from the Pasadena High School in California regarding a 1929 Model A roadster they are restoring and raffling off. 750 tickets are available for the raffle at \$100 each. The raffle will be April 20th, 2019 in Pasadena California. The winner will be responsible for picking up the car. Deb Lewis has the information, if you are interested. The club is invited to A Trio of Grand Events in Mackinaw Island Michigan. This event is a classic car event and is being held by The Collector Car Club of America (CCCA) May 31 through June 7th. The club received an invitation from the Gibraltar Historical Association in Fish Creek, Wisconsin, inviting the membership to display their cars at an event date to be determined, but possibly in August. The theme is weddings. The Wizard of Rods invited the club to a weekend car event. A variety of activities will be held June 14th through June 16th

Vice President – Deb for Jeana. Dan and Joyce Staehle, Brian Narlew, Al Miller, and Don Beaver submitted their application for membership. There were voted in as members at the Board meeting.

Secretary – Dave – A motion was made by Sue Quam and seconded by Dave Boucher to accept the February 10th, 2019 meeting minutes as written. The motion was put to a vote and it carried. 173 members have renewed their membership. 26 members have not renewed their membership. An email was sent to those members who did not renew their membership. Of the thirty emails sent, six responses were returned and several members renewed.

Treasurer – Steve – A report of the revenue and expenses from last month was given. A motion was made by Mike Quam and seconded by Karen Schmiechen to accept the treasurer's report. The motion was put to a vote and it carried. There were not any bills or income turned in. This year's audit of the finances has been completed and the clubs finances are in order. A copy of the financial report was given to the secretary for the clubs permanent records

Outdoor – Deb for Kate– Hosts are needed for the

2019 outdoor events. Only a few events have hosts. Ele Gapko and Jan Olsen are going to check out banquet facilities and other spots for the Memorial Day overnighter. Only 4 people have signed up for the event so far. Mark Ackermann mentioned that people will need to pre-register for the clubs annual picnic

Indoor – Deb for Vicki – A signup sheet is available to host the meetings for the next indoor season.

Swap meet report – The weather was not on the clubs favor. There was a decrease in attendance from 2,114 attendees to 1,100 attendees. The vendors felt they did well. All the vendor swap spaces were sold but because of the weather there were a few vacancies. The income for the event was \$19,000.00, expenses \$7,500.00, and the club will net approximately \$10,500. The club is waiting for a few more bills. A motion was made by Dave Boucher and seconded by Ken Baewer to give 25% of the swap meets profits as a donation to a charity of the Board of Directors choice. A discussion was held. The motion was put to a vote and the motion did not pass.

Old Business – Nothing to report

New Business – Richard Moschell and Jim Sinclair are going to hold a technical seminar in April on a Wednesday or Thursday night. The seminar will be held at Richard Moschell's facility in Union Grove near the Mars Cheese factory. Attendees should bring chairs. Further information will be available in the April issue of Wheeling the A and a mass email will be sent out. A discussion was held regarding the outdoor tours and the hosts stopping along the side of the road and waiting for others to catch up. There are concerns that accidents could happen. All participants should have maps /directions to each destination and must not stop on the side of the roadways to wait for others on the tour to catch up. The membership should review the safety tips and parade tips mentioned in the roster.

A motion was made by Steve Gapko and seconded by Mike Quam to adjourn the meeting. The motion was put to a vote and it carried. The meeting adjourned at 2:30 p.m.




