We will enjoy an organic pizza and salad lunch on the grounds and a short walking educational tour of the gardens and river on the whys and how of organic produce.


There will be a golf cart available for transport to and from car to handicap restroom and eating area.

Please join us on Sunday August 21st at Veterans Memorial Park Pavilion in Muskego,



Technical information......

Now is the time to think about getting your Model A ready to go on the road again. Below are listed some ideas to prepare your vehicle for the open road. Preventive maintenance is much easier than roadside repairs. It is also more convenient to fix a potential problem at home than by the side of the road.



A. At Each Fuel Stop

- 1. Check crankcase oil level
- 2. Check radiator water level
- 3. Perform a quick visual inspection of the engine compartment, the crankcase, the undercarriage, the tires and overall condition of your car

B. Before Beginning Your Ride

- 1. Check distributor point spacing
- 2. Check water pump for leaks and play
- 3. Check radiator, hoses and head gasket for water leaks
- 4. Check carburetor and fuel line for leaks
- 5. Visually inspect the engine compartment, crankcase and undercarriage for abnormal oil leaks or other irregularities
- 6. Check the hubs, wheels and tires for abnormalities
- 7. Be ever watchful for loose nuts, loose bolts or loose electrical connections

C. Weekly or Every 1,000 Miles

- 1. Check battery water level. If water is being boiled away, reduce the charging rate
- 2. Lubricate distributor bearings and distributor cam
- 3. Lubricate water pump bearings
- 4. Lubricate generator
- 5. Check fan for cracks. Is hub tight?
- 6. Check fan belt for tension and wear
- 7. Examine tires for breaks, cracks, or abnormal wear. Check air pressure
- 8. If necessary, re-torque all lug nuts

D. Every 2,000 Miles

- 1. Grease all lube fittings
- 2. Change crankcase oil and filter. Those without a filter may wish to change oil more frequently. Examine sludge on drain plug for any warning signs.
- 3. Check differential transmission and steering gear oil levels
- 4. Add grease to "U" joint (ONLY IF NECESSARY)
- 5. Drain carburetor bowl and sediment bowl. Examine deposits. Check fuel flow rate

E. Every 5,000 Miles

- 1. Remove, examine and re-gap spark plugs
- 2. Check compression
- 3. Check and adjust ignition timing
- 4. Inspect brake system. Readjust wedge at each wheel if necessary
- 5. Re-torque rear wheel axle nuts
- 6. Change differential and transmission oil

Our mystery technical seminar is no longer A mystery! Keith Jones brought us his front axle so we could demonstrate installing a king pin set in the front axle.

We found out we had to remove the spring perches so we could replace the axle. Once again we found out this is not an easy job. But, with the expertise of Tony's help from Mail Truck we were able to do this task. Most of this was done before the actual meeting because of time limitations.

Of course, as always, the replacement part did not fit. Thus we had to ream out the new bushings over and over. We still could not get the bushings to fit, so we had to use an oversize reamer. One of the reasons was they were not perfectly round. But, with saying a few sweet words to the part we made it fit. As usual a re-pro part can be made to fit if you work hard enough at it. Look for Keith driving down the road this year!

Looking Back in the Rearview Mirror

At our March 13th, 2016 indoor meeting Polly Huenink- Schellinger talked to the group about essential oils and where they come from. Essential oils are derived from different parts of plants (ie: flowers, leaves, stems, peels, roots, seeds and bark).
