

FALL FOLIAGE TOUR SATURDAY OCTOBER 20TH, 2018

Join Linda and Dave Huenink on a scenic drive through the Kettle Moraine Forest, where the leaves will be in their full fall colors, as we make our way to Hawks Inn, in Delafield Wisconsin. For those of you unfamiliar with Hawks Inn:

It is Greek Revival Inn, built by Nelson P. Hawks, that has been described as an "unsurpassed example of an early stagecoach stop." It was the center of social and political life in the frontier village of Delafield, Wisconsin. Built two years before Wisconsin became a state, Hawks Inn welcomed farmers in search of a homestead, trappers, traders, territorial politicians, and miners in search of a strike in the lead mines of western Wisconsin."



We will then take "A" quick drive through St. Johns Military Academy to admire some of the great architecture and interesting sites on the grounds. From there we will head to Lapham Peak State Park, which is also a part of Kettle Moraine Forest. Lapham Peak is the highest point in Waukesha County at 1,233 feet in elevation and covers 1000 acres. The park itself is beautiful and enjoyable to drive through, especially in a Model A. You will be able to walk up the observation tower, were the view is truly incredible and breath taking. You can see Holy Hill, the US Bank Building and Northwestern Mutual Buildings in Milwaukee and Nembahbin Lake to list a few sites from the top of the observation town. If you are afraid of heights, no worries. Dave is also and made it to the top comfortably. There are other sites to see at Lapham Peak Park also or a great place to spend time with your friends in the club. For those not familiar with Lapham Peak, it was named after Increase Lapham after it was originally called Government Hill. Originally is was used for surveying purposes, and then became a site for the Federal Signaling Service Division of Telegrams and Reports and received meteorological observations from Pikes Peak in Colorado as an advanced warning system of approaching storms. There are trails available for those who want to do some walking and enjoy Kettle Moraine on foot. We will also serve some seasonal goodies at one of the picnic areas near the Observation Tower. (For those who attended our tour last year, no apple pies this year but something just a good?)

We will **meet at McDonalds at Hwy 164 and National Avenue** in Big Bend between 11:15 a.m. and 11:30 a.m. and depart sharply at 11:45 a.m.

Make sure your cars are gassed up, as we'll be traveling a distance before our first stop and the next gas station. This is the last tour of the year, and I can assure you, it will be an enjoyable drive and fun day, especially since we are with friends and driving our Model A's



Religion: Pope John Paul II publishes encyclical Veritatis splendor and visits Mexico, then the US; televangelist Robert Tilton divorces wife Marte; Mother Teresa is hospitalized with malaria.

Sad news: Train crash in a tunnel in Spain kills 12; tropical storm Brett ravages Venezuela, 218 killed; Hotel in Thailand collapses, 114 killed; Yak-40 crashes in Tadzjikistan, killing 79, one survivor; dam breaks in China, 223 killed.

- The Impromptu Tour that happened July 18th, was planned by Roger and Jan Olson. The route took everyone along the foggy lake. The tour ended up at the Racine Zoo with a guided tour.

August 1978 - The August picnic was held at Raebel's Friess Lake in Washington County so swimming could be included. A corn roast consisting of 35 dozen ears contributed in making the picnic one of the all time best. A favorite game included Tug of War with 1928-29 versus 1930-31, and water balloons.
