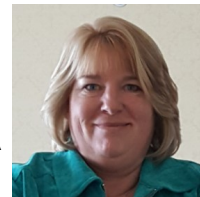

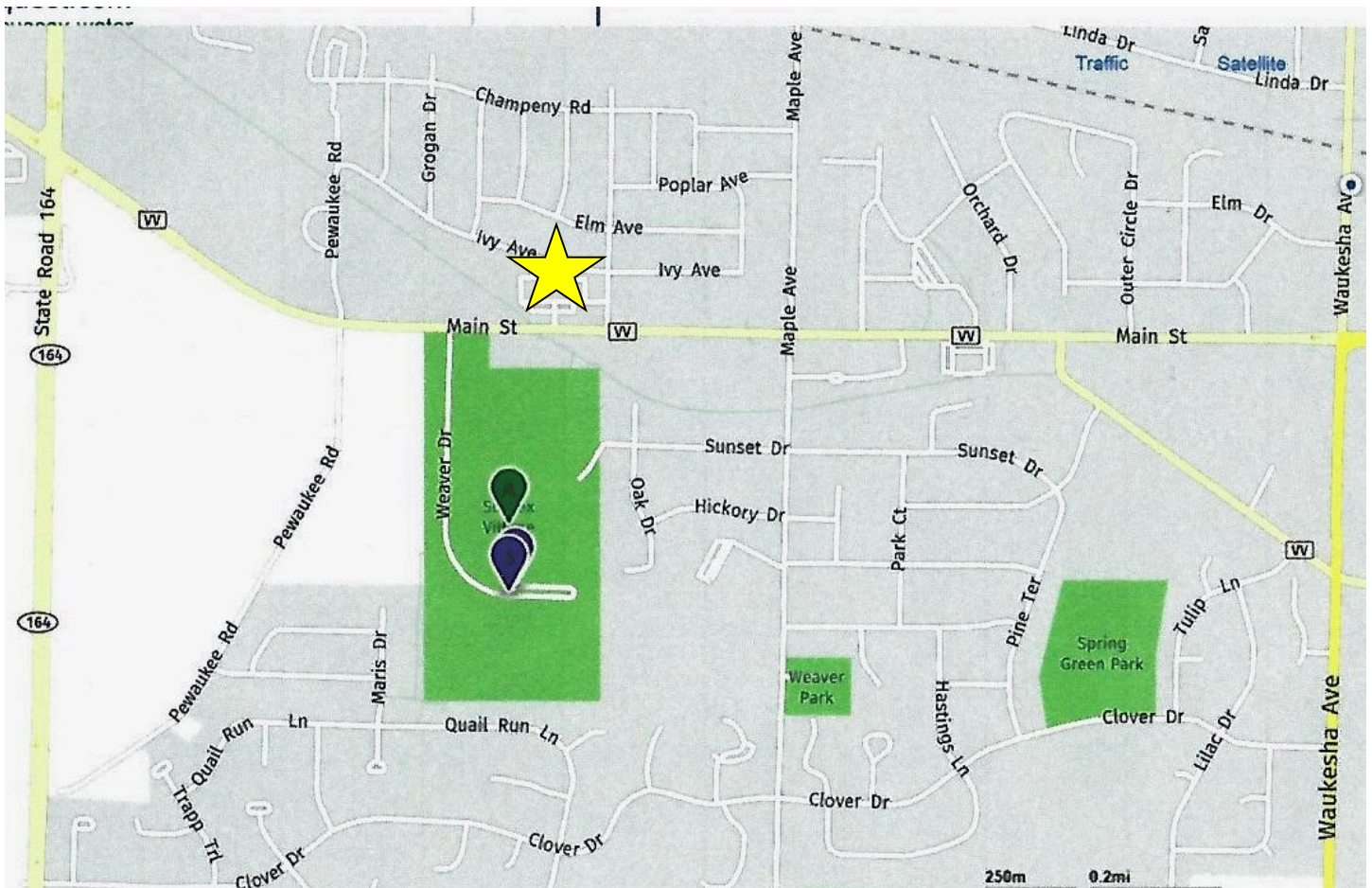

Jim's Tech Tip Installing the Horn Rod

When installing the small C-clip on the end of the horn rod, use an old wooden yardstick or something similar up at the steering wheel end to hold the horn button down. Slip the yardstick under the wheel on one side, go over the horn button, then gently flex the yardstick and slip the end under the steering wheel on the opposite side. The yardstick will hold the rod down while you work at the other end, pushing up on the spider against the spring, and inserting the C-clip keeper.

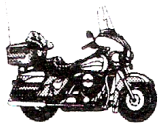

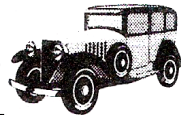

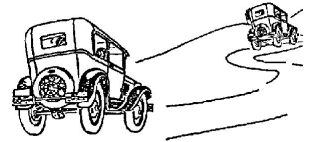

'A' Trip Back to August 2000

Wheeling the "A"

You remember the year 2000, right? Who could forget Y2K? Fears that every computer would crash as the world turned from 1999 to 2000. With the crash of every computer system worldwide, the world would become chaos, loss of electrical power, doors that wouldn't unlock, banks would fail, and maybe the world would come to an end.

Skip ahead to August 2000, when a not even a blink changed our world on that fateful January, and you will find Model A people doing what they always did..... planning a summer picnic at Glacier Hills County Park and Having Fun!



The August newsletter recounted the 2000 MAFCA National Meet (KC2000) held in Kansas City Missouri in July 2000. Evidently there were a few roadside seminars conducted on the trip out there. Electrical issues, out-of-gas, push-starting an A, gas line and carburetor problems, and proper use of a tow rope, to name a few. JR Manning, decked out as an American flag with a flag shirt and red pants led a version of "On Wisconsin" written by Stan Larson. Our delegates then bragged up Wisconsin and teased Illinois that their pizza is covered with Wisconsin cheese. There were car games, car judging and the Hubley Derby. Entrants included Ed Schultz's '29 Town Sedan and Stan Larson's '31 Pickup. There was a pancake breakfast, casino time, and BBQ. Good times, good food, good fun.

The Fourth of July Independence Day Parades were in Brown Deer, Franklin, Greendale, and Greenfield. Twenty-Seven participants brought Model A fun to hundreds of spectators who lined the routes.

The Trimborn Farms Car and Antique Show was an annual event. A self-guided tour of the barns and house were available. Families who participated were the Churchills, Carlins, Klappas, Doro, Grundmans, Blocks, Reiffs, Pierces, Lardinois', Millers, Lasts, Hammonds, Warners, LaMires, and Kendalls.

The Classifieds listed a 1929 Model A Fordor; complete, including title; needing restoration after 40 years in a garage. \$2000 OBO.

The Ladies page gave the club a recipe for Cherry Fluff Salad. Mix a can of sweetened milk with a can of cherry pie filling, drained pineapple chunks, and a tablespoon of Miracle Whip. Fold in Cool Whip, chill and serve.

"A" trips back further than 2000:

August 1980: The Mayfair Mall Show had a beautiful display of 20 cars that rolled into the mall from 9 p.m. on Thursday until 5 p.m. on Sunday. The summer picnic was attended by 45 families despite a lot of rain through that morning. Corn, ice cream, and games kept everyone happy.

August 1970: The annual picnic was held in Mukwonago Park. 100 people attended. There was a treasure hunt, Model "A" Quiz, water balloons, tire pumping and gas shut off and parts identification games.

August 1995: Picnic at Harnischfeger Park with hayrides and a beverage wagon. A perfect weather day brought out 200 people for corn, brats, hot dogs, and hamburgers.

On this month in history:

1944 – Anne Frank penned her last entry into her diary. "I keep on trying to find a way of becoming what I would like to be and what I could be, if there weren't any other people living in the world". Three days later Anne and her family were arrested and sent to Nazi camps. She died in the camp on March 15, 1945.

1779 – Francis Scott Key was born. After witnessing the British bombardment of Fort McHenry on September 1814 he was enthralled to see the American flag still flying over the fort at daybreak. He penned the poem *Defense of Fort McHenry* that became the Star-Spangled Banner.

1492 – Christopher Columbus set sail from Palos Spain with the *Nina, Pinta, and Santa Maria*.

1962 -- Apartheid opponent Nelson Mandela was arrested by security police in South Africa. He was then tried and sentenced to five years in prison. In 1964, he was placed on trial for sabotage, high treason and conspiracy to overthrow the government and was sentenced to life in prison. A worldwide campaign to free him began in the 1980s and resulted in his release on February 11, 1990, at age 71 after 27 years in prison. In 1993, Mandela shared the Nobel Peace Prize with South Africa's President F.W. de Klerk for their peaceful efforts to bring a nonracial democracy to South Africa. In April 1994, black South Africans voted for the first time in an election that brought Mandela the presidency of South Africa.

1962 -- Film star Marilyn Monroe died at age 36 from an overdose of sleeping pills. She made 29 films during her career and came to symbolize Hollywood glamour.

1945 – (August 6) The first Atomic Bomb was dropped over the center of Hiroshima at 8:15 a.m.. It was detonated 1800 feet above ground and killed over 105,000 people destroying the city. Another 100,000 persons later died of radiation effects. Another bomb was dropped August 9th on Nagasaki, killing 70,000 and destroying the city. Japan announced their intentions of surrender August 15.

1990 – Just five days after the Iraqi invasion of Kuwait, President George Bush ordered Desert Shield to prevent Iraqi advances.

1974 – President Richard M Nixon resigned as a result of Watergate.

1961 – The Berlin Wall came into existence after the East German government closed the border between east and west sectors of Berlin with barbed wire to discourage immigration to the West. The wire was replaced by a 12 foot concrete wall extending 103 miles. The wall was finally opened by an East German governmental decree in 1989 and torn down by the end of 1990.

1941 – President Roosevelt signed the Social Security Act. The Social Security system also provides financial aid to dependent children, the disabled, and the unemployed.

1969 – Woodstock began in a field near Yasgur's Farm in Bethel, New York.

1997 – Princess Diana died at age 36 from internal injuries suffered in a high-speed car crash.

August Birthdays: Barack Obama, 44th US President; Herman Melville author of *Moby Dick*; Louis Armstrong, jazz trumpet player; Raoul Wallenberg, saved 33000 Jews from the Holocaust; Alfred Lord Tennyson, British poet; Alexander Fleming, discoverer of penicillin; Matthew Henson, African American explorer accompanying Robert Peary on Arctic expeditions to the North Pole; Herbert Hoover, 31st US President; Alex Haley, *Roots* author; Cecil B. DeMille, film producer; Alfred Hitchcock, film director; Napoleon Bonaparte; Davy Crockett; Meriwether Lewis, explorer with William Clark; Bill Clinton 42nd US President; Benjamin Harrison, 23rd US President; Leonard Bernstein, composer; Lyndon Baines Johnson, 36th US President; Mother Teresa; Oliver Wendell Holmes, author.
