Our Greater Milwaukee Area Winter Swap Meet will be held <u>Sunday, February 25, 2018</u>, at Washington County Fair Grounds in West Bend, Wisconsin. We will use the West Pavilion and East Expo Center where each aisle vending space will be approximately 11' X 9' and is \$40. Wall spaces may vary in size depending on location in either building and are \$45.


We have space available for car clubs to help promote their special interest to the public. Clubs may use these spaces to sell their club merchandise and/or hand out club literature, <u>spot not to be used for selling car parts.</u> Those spaces are \$30 and are approximately 3' X 11" and include one free table (no credit given if table not used) and admittance for two people.

- 1.) Returning vendors will have the option to occupy the same space(s) they did in 2017, however your payment and completed application <u>must be returned us by November 7, 2017</u> to insure your same space(s).
- 2.) After November 7, 2017 any available spaces will be sold on a first come first serve basis. We will honor your space requests as best as we can, however, <u>WE DO RESERVE THE RIGHT TO ASSIGN VENDOR LOCATION.</u> WE ALSO RESERVE THE RIGHT TO DECLINE TO SELL SPACES TO PAST "NO SHOW" VENDORS.
- 3.) Maximum number of spaces for a vendor is limited to 6, to help ensure a more diverse selection of swap merchandise. <u>NEW this year</u>: Each vendor will receive 2 free admission wrist bands unless otherwise requested. Wrist bands must be worn at ALL times and be shown upon request.
- 4.) <u>NEW this year...</u> Vendors must use East side entrance for reentry and NOT the main entrance. Vendors must have wrist band.
- 5.) The event is advertised from 8:00 am til 2:00 pm. It is expected that all vendors will sell their wares until 2:00 pm. A drawing will take place at 2:30 pm for all vendors. You must be present to win. More details to come.
- 6.) Vendors MUST vacate building by 4:00 p.m.

All other spaces will be available until we are sold out.

You will receive a letter shortly after January 1, 2018, confirming your building, space location, your suggested arrival time and wrist bands for your space(s). Wearing your wrist band is required the day of the show.


Sue Quam had knee surgery on November 13. Wishing you the best as you recover from your second surgery.

# 'A' Trip Back to 1966

Board members for 1966: President – Jack Gunderson , Vice President – Alan Egelseer, Secretary – Betty Campbell, Treasurer – Jim Cerny.

Some of the events for 1966:

Jan – We had 60 members and wives attend our January  $29^{th}$  banquet. The cost was \$3.00/person. There was a bar open for the purchase of cocktails from 6:30-7:00. From 7:00-8:30 a delicious buffet dinner was served. Presentation of new officers followed dinner and there were gifts for all attendees. In addition, we had free beer and soda, music and dancing until the wee hours – all for three bucks!! The banquet was held at the Black Steer restaurant.

Feb – indoor meet at Stanton Hall. We had a 16mm sound and color movie from the Ford Motor Company entitled "The American Road", a story of the evolution of the automobile. Free refreshments were served after the business meeting.

March – our annual dance at Kuglitches Hall. Tickets were \$1.50 per person. Everyone was invited. There was free beer, music and many door prizes. Our coordinator for this activity was Fred Fischer. Everyone seemed to enjoy last year's music so we had the same band back again. A profit of \$90 was made from the dance.

April 23, a gloomy, overcast day was met head-on by nine members of our model 'A' club, eight members of the model 'T' club and various other fords as we paraded for the grand opening of Northwestern Ford. We had a police escort as we paraded through Whitefish Bay and the Bay Shore shopping center to Northwestern Ford where we enjoyed coffee and bakery. Mr. Rohrback of Northwestern Ford invited all of us and our families to Howard Johnson's for lunch.

May – your Wisconsin Chapter MAFCA club's appearance on the "Sports Club" TV show on channel 4, WTMJ is between 11:30 and 11:55. Jack Grundman and Larry Koser will be the spokesmen for the club. Weather permitting we will have multiple 'A's in the parking lot to be televised. If the weather does not cooperate we will have Larry's roadster inside the studio for televising.

Sept – Burlington Trophy meet, this is the largest trophy meet in Wisconsin. Entrance fee is \$1.50. Judging begins at 1:00 with 16 trophies in 5 classes plus 5 plaques to be awarded. Also, a costume contest and bingo for the ladies. Hot dogs and soda will be available for purchase.

Nov - the bowling party was hosted by Frank and Virg Nagorski. Cost was \$2.25/person includes three games of bowling. Everyone had a great time and there were many door prizes handed out throughout the evening. There was an excellent lunch served - hot beef and ham, raw beef, relishes, chips, cake and coffee, which really hit the spot! A total of 78 members and guests attended. Virg Cerny celebrated her birthday and Frank Nagorski brought out his accordion and played "Happy Birthday" for her.

Motor vehicles were first required to be registered in Wisconsin in 1905. The fee at the time was \$2 for the life of the car. The owner was assigned a number and he made his own "license plate". These usually consisted of an old board with the numbers painted or nailed on, or leather or metal made in the same manner. In 1909 fees went to \$2 annually and the first plate was actually issued by the state. In these early days it was the Secretary of State's office which processed and issued license plates. Fees were raised in 1911 to \$5 a year and this was the first year that the actual year was shown on the plate. In 1917 fees went to \$10 a year and in 1924 fees were based on the weight of the vehicle with fees going higher as the weight increased. The "weight" fees were adjusted in 1933 (when heavy cars paid as much as \$48) and fees remained the same until August 1, 1947 when the \$16 flat fee was established. "Except vehicles that were registered at a lower fee will remain at a lower fee." This is why model 'A's had some lower fees. The 1965 legislature increased fees from \$16 to \$18 (all cars and most truck fees went up \$2) effective with the January '66 renewals. Model 'A's will be \$11.75, \$12.50, or \$18 when relicensed in 1966.
