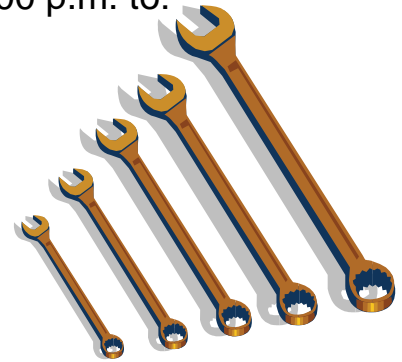

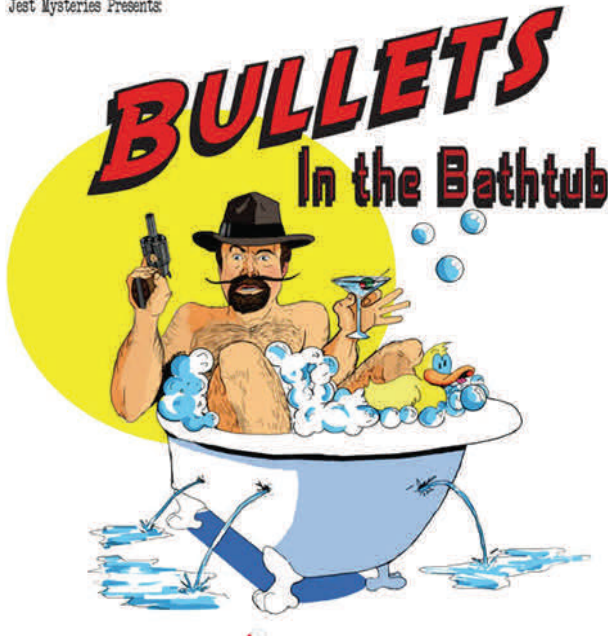

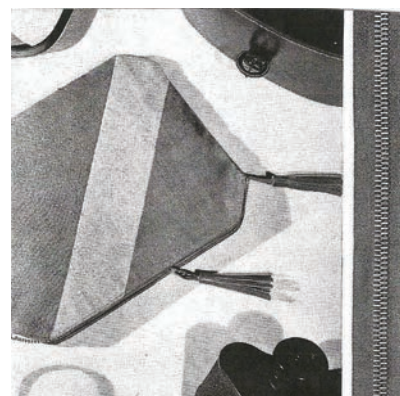

When we began to re-assemble his differential, we found that he had the wrong type bolts. John had to change his bolts to the type our old friend, Henry Ford, said to use.

Once again we had a very good question and answer session. Many good hints were shared back and forth.

A thanks to all who attended and helped work on the differential.

Start your New Year by coming to Mail Truck Model A in Oak Creek on Thursday, January 15, 2015. We will be continuing work on the 1930 Fordor. We will be refreshing our memories about wood graining. Mounting a Model A tire is also scheduled for the evening.

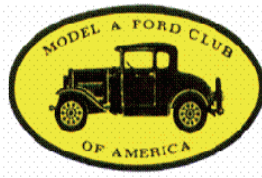
