
Club Mission Statement




Friday evening will find us on the River Tyme for a 2 hour cruise on the beautiful Fox River. (We do plan to return . . . not like the Minnow)

Website update.....

In doing some website updating I took a peek into the analytics portion. I found some interesting facts. From the time we went live with the website to Jan. 17, 2019 we have had 1,992 visitors to our new site. Of those visitors I found they have come from United States 1,872, China 18, Canada 14, Nigeria 10, Norway 4, Ireland 3, France 2, India 2, Brazil 2, Australia 2, United Kingdom 2, Russia 1, Germany 1, Finland 1, Italy 1, Netherlands 1, Ukraine 1, and Sweden 1. How interesting is that !?!?



Finding our website was done via Google- 842 (42%), Direct - 728 (37%) (by typing the website address into the address bar), by using the link thru MAFCA.com -117 (6%) Bing search engine - 95 (5%) Others - (Yahoo, Explorer, etc) 210 (11%). 47% find us using a desktop or laptop computer, 42% using a mobile device and 10% via a tablet.

When people come to the website they are looking at more than one page, they are browsing around. To date we've had 5,349 page views. I found that the "welcome (home) page" gets the most traffic, then of all things, the 4th of July parade event is second, after that it's the calendar of events, photos, for sale and wanted page and newsletters for 2018. Our swap meet flyer page has had 388 clicks on the button to take people to our swap meet flyer. That's awesome!!! I'm still in awe of the 4th of July getting so many hits. Literally the second most visited page on the website!

The old website expired and is now gone from the internet. Thank you to Carl Doro for all his work in getting the old site up and running back in 2007 and keeping it going until his retirement. 



One of the most common problems with the Model 'A' is the ignition. Most of these problems arise from the point's rub block wearing away and as this happens the point gap changes and so does the timing. All it takes to prevent this is a little dab of distributor cam lube on the inside of the rub block next to the distributor cam.

HYLOMAR

Jim's technical tip

Radiator Hoses - Hard to Get On, Hard to Get Off!

For many years I had a hard time getting new radiator hoses on the engine to seal well. I would tighten the hose clamps to what I thought was reasonable, and they still seeped a bit of coolant. And years later, when I needed to remove the hoses, they seemed to be glued to the metal parts and I had to pry them off or cut them off

A Master Mechanic shared his secret with me years ago. Apply a very thin coating of a specialized gasket dressing called "Hylomar AF" to the inside of the new hoses where they will contact the metal just before installing them. Install and rotate each hose back and forth, to spread the sealant out evenly. Now tighten hose clamps and you are done. It will not seep or leak. And years later when you need to remove the hose, it will come right off!

I get the Hylomar AF (Advanced Formulation) -- originally developed by Rolls Royce for their jet engines -- from an industrial supply place near me called W.W. Grainger. It's also available on Amazon and other places on the Internet. Compare prices because some places price it like it's gold!

There are several variants of Hylomar. You don't want the original "Hylomar Universal Blue" or the "Racing Formula". The Hylomar AF works best for our application. I also put a little on my oil drain plug threads, on the transmission and differential drain plugs, etc., to stop the drips. It gives a good seal but never hardens, so it's easy to take it apart later.

SERVICE STATION ATTIRE IN THE MODEL A ERA

In the early years of the automobile, getting gas for the horseless carriage was no small feat. Dispensing gasoline evolved from bulk depots on the outskirts of towns, often requiring three people to fill the tank, to curb side pumps. As the popularity of the motor car increased and technology allowed larger quantities of fuel to be refined from the same amount of petroleum, merchants of all stripes, from bicycle shops, general stores, garages, and automotive dealers, installed gas pumps in front of their establishments. By 1920 approximately 15,000 gas stations were located in the United States. They were rudimentary at best, some little more than shacks, with advertisements littering their walls and the roads leading to them. They were considered by many to be an eyesore, and even worse, there was little confidence in the product they offered.

Major oil companies took note and began to standardize their stations, making them visually appealing to the motorist. Not only did the station need to look good, the service employees needed to project honesty, integrity, reliability and quality. What better way to do that than through the clothing they wore?
