


2008 Wisconsin Rapids Planning Meeting



February 2008 prez notes.....

By the time you read this issue of "Wheeling the A" the 2008 board of directors will be up and running. New board members Sue Quam, Dan Kane, Dave Neuman, Marty Janssen, and Roger Olsen are beginning two-year terms. Please congratulate them and help your new board members by stepping forward when volunteers are needed to host indoor events, outdoor events, and other activities on our club calendar in the coming year. As I've said many times before, our club thrives because of volunteers.

Coming up on Feb. 24 is the biggest volunteer event of the year, our annual swap meet at the Washington County Fairgrounds in Jackson, just up the freeway from Milwaukee County. Equally as important is to cross your fingers that it won't snow on the 24th!

And believe it or not, two weeks later on March 8 is our first outdoor event of the year, the annual Milwaukee St. Patrick's Day parade (yes, the parade is the 8th but St. Patrick's Day is the 17th; you'll have to ask the parade organizers about that one). Speaking of fresh tanks of gas, I read an interesting story in "AutoWeek" magazine that relates to our Model A's. As we know, all gasoline in the metropolitan Milwaukee area contains up to 10 percent ethanol. We've also heard talk good and bad about using this blended fuel in our cars, since ethanol alcohol as a solvent can attack our gas gauge floats, gas-tank lining materials, and other surfaces given the right circumstances. Personally, I haven't seen any evidence of 10 percent ethanol gasoline harming a Model A, but I'm no scientist.

A story in the Jan. 14 issue of "Auto Week" stated that Hagerty Insurance Co., which provides coverage to more than half a million owners of vintage cars, has commissioned a scientific study of ethanol-blend gasoline and its effect on vintage cars and motorboats.

The study will take a year to complete, but Hagerty reports that preliminary results may be announced this summer. Hagerty's website has other information on ethanol as it relates to vintage cars and boats on www.hagerty.com/ethanol/. DID YOU KNOW: The famed German highways without a speed limit actually have a lower death rate than US highways. FIFTY YEARS AGO, 1958 - There are no club events specified for February. However, a car and body list newsletter sent out by Schulze Restoring in West Allis to potential customers included this official notice. It was located at 1207 S. 91st St and sold Model A, B, and T parts.

NOTICE - THE FOLLOWING POLICY WAS ADOPTED – APRIL 4, 1957 AND HAS BEEN IN EFFECT TO DATE & WILL CONTINUE

Fee-\$3.00... Due to the large number of people that are coming here to ‘shop around’ – ‘fool around’ – ‘getting prices’ – ‘just checking’ – ‘just curious’ as well as ‘being entertained’ – There is now a \$3.00 fee for ‘showing & demonstrating’ the cars for sale here.. This helps to pay garage rent, advertising, barn facility, gas, anti-freeze, and maintenance of the cars for sale here and above all else MY TIME I spend showing you these cars, as well as transporting you a total of 10 miles to & from storage points. If you are serious & want a more rare and desirable body type, or CLEAN car you will gladly pay this, if not, you are the aggravating type to me and I’d rather not have you here at all. There is no such thing as something for NOTHING here...If you purchase a car here, the fee is refunded... By using this fee principle, the cars can be sold at the same price continually otherwise storage, advertising, etc. must be continually added to cars...




