This Model "A" Reunion is the greatest gathering of old Fords and old Ford enthusiasts in Wisconsin. This Reunion started in 1962, and is sponsored by four clubs: Central Wisconsin Chapter MARC/MAFCA, Nickle A Region MARC, Wisconsin Chapter MAFCA, and the Wisconsin Region MARC.

The meet consists of a weekend of enjoying Model A's and Model A fellowship, and includes a Tour around the Rapids area, People's Choice Awards, Car Games, Kids' Games, a Hubley Derby, Chapter Team Events, Rolling Pin Toss, a Dance, Fund-Raising Auctions, Shoe Box Swap Meet, as well as lots of surprises and fun.

The Reunion is held the last full weekend in July, unless it conflicts with a National MARC or MAFCA meet. The Central Wisconsin Chapter MARC/MAFCA hosts the reunion on their private 10-acre site, which includes a clubhouse, wooded campsites, and is close to many nice motels and restaurants.

Location: The clubgrounds are located 4 miles east of Wisconsin Rapids, or 11 miles west of Plover, just south of state Highway 54. Turn south on 72nd Street North (a dead end road). Watch for signs.

Weekend Activities

Refreshments are available throughout the weekend for registered participants.

Good Food: A potluck lunch will be held on Saturday and Sunday. Participants are asked to bring 2 dishes to pass (one for each day). Friday and Saturday evening, you may want to roast hot dogs at your campsite or go out for a relaxed dinner at one of the nearby restaurants with a group of your new friends.

Friday afternoon the registration table opens. An Auction will be held in the evening of Model A related items, as well as other donated items for the kids, ladies, and men. There will also be a corn roast.

Saturday morning starts with a Shoe Box Swap Meet, Technical Seminar. This will be followed by a Ski Race then a noon potluck, and then a driving tour. A Basket Raffle will be held throughout the day, with the drawing that night. There will also be a Slow Drive competition for the Model A's, a Hubley Derby and Kids' Games. A dance will be held at the clubhouse for the evening's entertainment.

Sunday is a day of Car Games, Potluck Lunch, Chapter Team Events, and a Ladies Rolling Pin Toss, followed by the awards presentation and Raffle Drawings.

Primitive campsites are available on the grounds. Camping is open the Wednesday before the meet through the Monday after the meet. The fee per campsite is \$15 for the entire weekend. Vice President – Randy – No new members this month. All the awards are ready for the banquet.

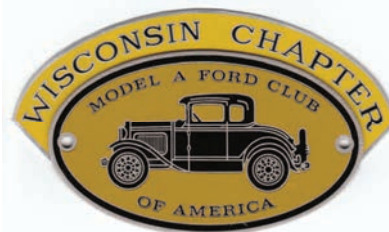

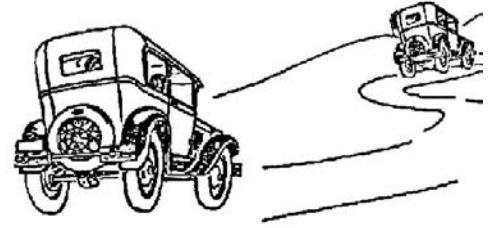

Total membership for 1972 is now 189.

Our December Christmas (1971) party had a capacity crowd at the Hubbard Lodge Hall. There was a puppet show and Santa showed up with gifts for all of the children. The ladies again brought their Christmas goodies and scrumptious cookies. Thanks to the Hicklings for coordinating the event.

This was the first issue of “Wheeling the ‘A’” without the Drake family in charge. We will follow the same format and extend our thanks to the Drake family, it will be a tough act to follow.

January 9th was the first meet of 1972. It was held at Cassidy’s Hall. A combination of movies, seminars, elections, good weather and no football made for a great turn-out. More than 50 members attended. The business meeting and elections were followed by Paul Moller’s film of his tour to Colorado and the 1971 High Country Tour. The shock absorbers and carburetor display by Jack Grundman and Carl Wussow drew much attention and a good exchange of ideas.

On January 23rd the Regional Planning Meeting was held at the Lake Geneva Playboy Club/Hotel. This meeting was to review and setup the 1972 Trophy Meet. The Wisconsin Chapter was represented by Gary Koser, Jim Stegner, Mike Brojanac, and Lee Spellman. The date for the meet has been set as May 20, 1972.

February 13 will be our indoor meet at Stanton’s Hall. This month we are having Al Dettlaff return with a few of his original movies of the Model ‘A’ era.

March 4th will be our Annual Dance at Gonzaga Hall from 9:00 pm to 1:00 am. Cost is \$2.00 per person. Bill Hermann, dance chairman has a great program lined up. Free beer and soda (bring your own liquor). Music will be provided by The Harmony Lads.

If your ‘A’ is running we hope to see you at the March 11th St. Patrick’s parade. This is a paid event for the club. We have guaranteed that 10 cars will be there. Plan to attend.

The Wisconsin Chapter’s 7th annual swap meet will take place on April 23rd. Lots of help will be needed from the members.

Did you know that January 14th 1972 was the 58th anniversary of Henry Ford's first use of the assembly line in the production of Model 'T's? (that's 104 years ago for those of you doing the math)

Ford attempted to build a city in the middle of the Amazon, but got defeated in his efforts. The town was an 18-hour riverboat trip from the nearest city, and intended to be a Utopia in the jungle. In 1927, he bought a chunk of property the size of Connecticut with the intention of building civilization around the business of harvesting rubber for car tires. There was a riot, resistance to the assembly line by native workers and devastation of the rubber crop by insects. It was called Fordlandia, and the town is still empty to this day.

Using wood scraps from his plants, Ford found he could make charcoal briquettes. When Ford's brother-in-law E.G. Kingsford brokered the site selection for Ford's charcoal manufacturing plant, Ford named the company Kingsford Charcoal in his honor.

Ford welcomed travelers-by-air to the Dearborn Inn, built in 1931 near the Ford Airport, which he established seven years prior. The luxury hotel featured Colonial architecture and design, and is still in operation, owned by Marriott.

Henry Ford created a sense of hype and mystery surrounding the release of the Model A Ford, relying on the media to reach the buying public and generate interest in the "New Ford Car." Shortly after the Ford Model A was made available to the public on December 2, 1927, orders for the new car far exceeded supply. Ford scrambled to increase production and by mid 1928, producing up to 4,000 cars per day, was still not meeting the buying public's demand. In an effort to meet demand, Ford steadily boosted production, peaking at around 9,200 cars per day by June of 1930.

Between October 1992 to December 1994, Hector Quevedo, along with his son Hugo, drove a 1928 Model A 22,000 mi (35,406 km) from his home in Punta Arenas, Chile to Ford headquarters in Dearborn, Michigan. The car required minimal service, including a flat tire and transmission work in Nicaragua, and is now housed in the Henry Ford Museum.

In addition to the United States, Ford made the Model A in plants in Argentina, Canada, Denmark, France, Germany, Japan and the United Kingdom.

Jim's Tech Tip



A film builds up on glass with time as you drive, especially on the windshield. About once a year it helps if you give the glass a very thorough cleaning. I use a paper towel with a LITTLE lacquer thinner on it to remove the film. You will see the black slime on the paper towel as you go. (Obviously, don't get the thinner on your paint.) Then follow up with a good glass cleaner. My favorite cleaner is called "Sprayway Streakless Glass Cleaner"; it has no ammonia. I know WalMart stocks it, other stores probably do, too. It really gets the glass clean and shiny.
