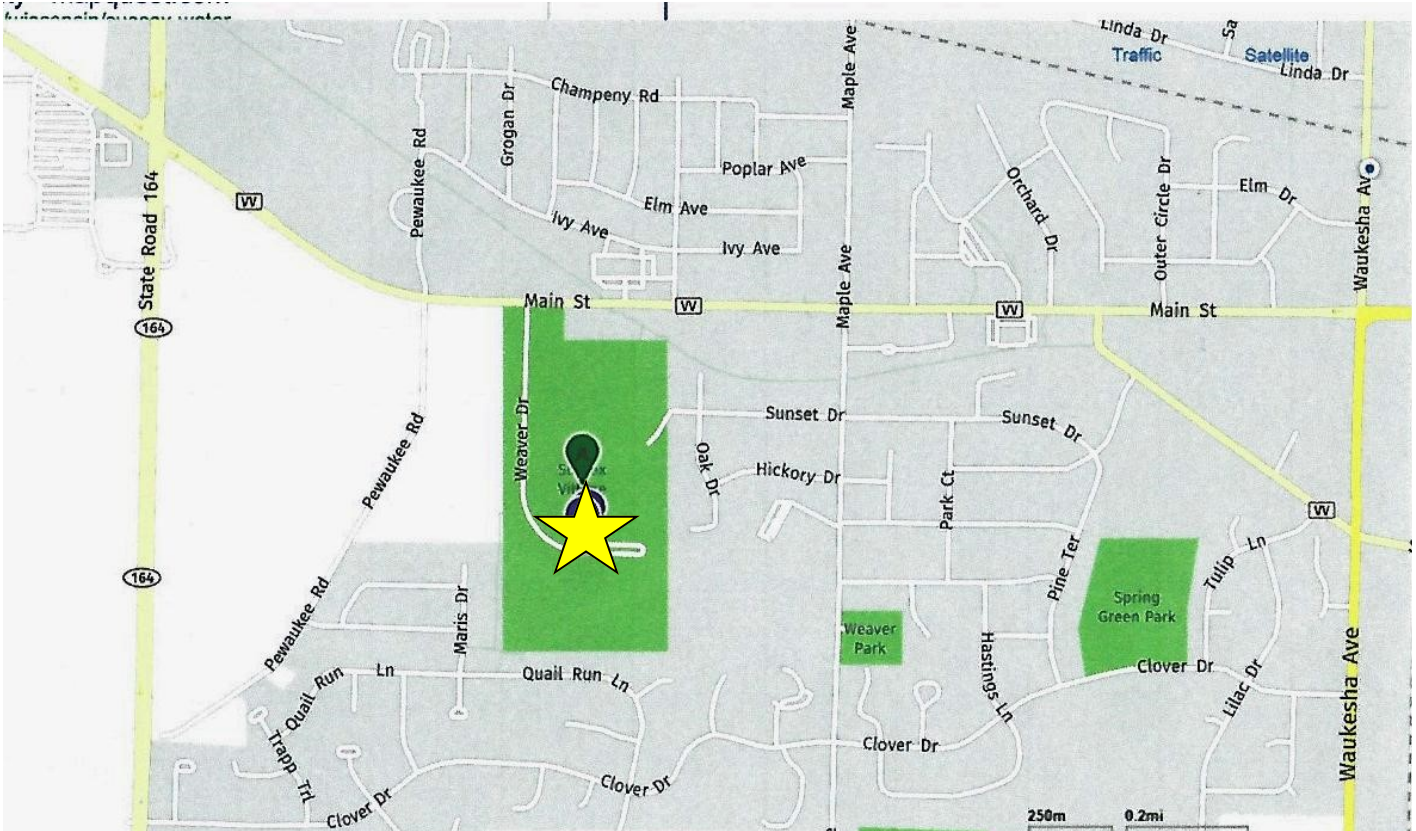

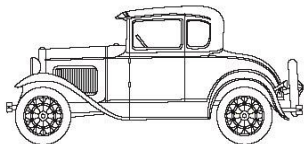

MAFCA Wisconsin Chapter General Meeting Minutes

May 11, 2019



Board Members Present: Deb Lewis, Steve Lewis, Dave Huenink, Vicki Cooper, Jeana Angelini
Absent: Kate Rozman

The meeting was called to order at 7:23 p.m.

President – Deb - The Board received the newsletters from the reciprocating clubs.

Vice President – Jeana – Scott Piper, Allen Herrem and Paul & Amy Schuster submitted their application for membership. Steve made a motion and Dave seconded the motion to accept them as new members. The motion was put to a vote and it carried.

Secretary – Dave - A motion was made by Jeana and seconded by Steve to accept the minutes from the April 6th, 2019 Board meeting as written. The club has one hundred and eighty-one members, including the ones voted in at this meeting.

Treasurer – Steve – Steve gave the treasurers report. A motion was made by Dave and seconded by Deb to accept the Treasurer's report. The motion was put to a vote and it carried. There were no bills or income this month. The club has less money on hand than last year. This is due to lower attendance at the swap meet because of the weather.

Outdoor – Deb for Kate – The Memorial Day overnighter is being held in May – hosted by Jan Olsen and Ele Gapko. Another tour is also planned and will be hosted by Richard and Bonnie Moschell. The club will also be participating in the Milwaukee Memorial Day parade.

Indoor – Vicki – The Schmiechens and Kinds are hosting the club's annual Christmas party. A discussion was held regarding having entertainment. The Ice Cream Social needs hosts as does the March indoor event. The club has another season at St. Aloysius for our indoor meetings - through March of 2020. It is unclear as to whether the club will be able to hold the indoor meetings after that. A search is underway for a new location and two potential locations have been found. They do need to be looked at to ensure they meet the club's needs. Both are close to our present location. The Board of Directors is looking for suggestions from the membership for new places to hold our indoor meetings. The membership will be kept informed of any changes.

Sunshine – Dave for Linda – Nothing to report

Swap meet – The contract for the 2020 swap meet has been signed and a deposit has been sent in. The date is February 23rd, 2020. The price for the rental has stayed the same.

Old Business – A discussion was held regarding if dues should be collected annually, bi-annually or every three years. It was decided to continue collecting dues annually. The Board of Directors discussed how to include "non-married partners" in our membership. After some discussion, it was determined the topic will be brought up to the club's membership for ideas. Vicki talked with a screen printer in Oconomowoc. Costs were discussed as well what they can provide for the club. They would setup an on-line store for the membership to purchase items. Vicki is getting more information soon and it will be emailed to the Board of Directors for review. The technical seminar had approximately twenty-five in attendance. Deb and Vicki attended and mentioned there were a lot of new faces. Two attendees did join the club that night. The club's spring donation will go to Rides and Reins in Slinger Wisconsin. Rides and Reins is a Therapeutic Riding Center for children with disabilities (autism, brain injuries, Cerebral Palsy, Downs Syndrome, MS, MD, Spina Bifida, spinal cord injuries and more). They provided these handicap riders with physical, emotional and cognitive needs through the therapeutic effects of horseback riding.

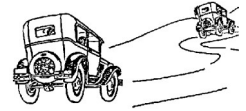
New Business – A motion was added to the club's critical motions book as of May 11th, 2019, that reads, "The Board of Directors has decided to give 10%, but not to exceed \$1000, of the swap meets net profits to charitable organizations of the Boards of Directors choice. A motion was made by Dave and seconded by Steve to adjourn the meeting. The motion was put to a vote and it carried. The meeting adjourned at 9:30 P.M.

'A' Trip Back to June 1984

Wheeling the "A"

In June 1984, the Wisconsin Chapter held their second Model A Olympics. The first one was run in 1980. Gary Koser and Jerry Manning co-chaired the event held at Immanuel Lutheran Church on 135th and Hampton. All cars entered in the Olympics had to pass a car safety check by Mike Grundmann. Without the safety check, participants couldn't receive an award for an event. Six games were played with the cars.

Golf: Driver and partner work together to move the ball through each hazard, over a ramp and into the hole. Fastest competing pair wins award. Winners: Ed Schultz, Joan Engel, Charlene Wussow

60 Meter Dash: A string is tied onto the "A" and to a center post with a weight on it. Award is given to the driver who goes completely around the post without pulling over the post or causing the weight to touch the ground in less time than anyone else. Winners: Steve Lewis, Dave Boucher, Ray Schleuter

The Marathon: The "A" is to proceed forward on a course marked, signed, and pre-timed. Driver must follow the signs and arrows in alphabetical order. That time is then compared to the pre-timed amount. The difference plus any penalty points is their score. Lowest score wins. Penalty points were assigned for hitting a traffic cone or pylon. Winners: Sally Kaufann, Carol Rozman, Dave Dohmeyer, Jerry Flynn, Larry Koser, Jerry Manning

Balance Beam: The driver has to proceed onto a beam and then move his "A" forward or backward as often as needed to achieve a balanced, stable position with both ends of the beam off the ground for two seconds. Person who achieves this in the least amount of time wins. Winners: Dave Dohmeyer, Dawn Dohmeyer, Larry Koser

Long Jump: The Model A lines up on a mark. Driver then has a towel put over his head and must blindly move his "A" (what he thinks) is exactly one car length so his back bumper is now on the line. The distance between bumper and line is recorded. Then the driver must back up (what he thinks) is exactly back to where he started. Distance is again measured and recorded. Driver with the least differential wins. Winners: Karl Buckenberger, Mike Brojanac, Ray Schleuter

After awards are announced the Medley Relay starts. Two cars to a team with passengers to help. The object is to have one A complete the course in one direction, pass the baton to their relay partner, and the partner to drive the course back to the starting line. The baton must be complete and held outside the "A" throughout this event. Winning teams: Dennis Wacker-Mike Brojanac, Myron Gouza-Brett Bartel, Carl Weckwerth-Wes Campbell

So next year is 2020. Seems that would be in the 4-year sequence and time for another Olympics! What fun that would be to include it in next year's summer picnic. Any volunteers?

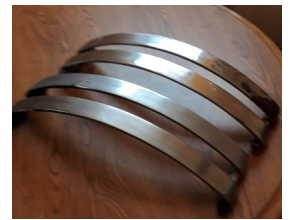
