

Did you know – Henry Ford called the new Model A Ford transmission a "crunch box". After all, who ever stripped gears in a Model T?

Many cars have tigers in their tanks, but there are even more that have monkeys behind the steering wheel!

Some of the events for Jan - Apr 1967:

The annual winter banquet was held at the Black Steer, with a total of 77 in attendance. Charlie House was our guest speaker for the evening and gave an amusing account of his lone canoe trip up the St. Lawrence Seaway from Quebec to Green Bay.

Feb – About 60 members attended the indoor meet at Cassidy's Hall. We had a 16mm sound and color movie of three races. Free refreshments were served after the business meeting.

March – our annual dance at Kuglitches Hall. Tickets were \$2.00 per person. Everyone was invited. There was free beer, music by the "Harmony Lads" and many door prizes. We realized a profit of \$162, our largest ever! We had 145 people attend, but sold a total of 173 tickets. The polkas were fast and the beer was good and the luck of the Irish rubbed off on the door prize winners. Jim and Jean McCue won two hams and Don Ackermann won the prize for selling the most tickets (16). A good time was had by all.

On Sunday, March 11, 1956 an article appeared in the Milwaukee Journal titled, "The Model A Rises Again". This was the beginning of our chapter as we know it today. Previous to this time a small group of men got together to discuss their "pride and joys", but no record was kept of those meets. Unofficial head-quarters of the not yet formed chapter was in a backyard on 91<sup>st</sup> street. Instead of joining the Restorer's Club, we formed our own Model A Ford Club. The first bulletin was printed in November 1956. New members included Don Ackermann, Wally Klager, Demo Staver and Bill Gunderson. Bill had taken his freshly restored stock sport coupe and entered it in a drag race (4 cylinder division). Bill received a trophy for winning first place! In 1957 our Model A Ford Club had members from all over the nation, plus Canada and Puerto Rico.

We have made plans to go to Chicago to see the WGN radio Barn Dance show. Tickets are free but limited, so it will be on a "first come first serve" basis. They are on 720 AM Saturday nights from 8:00 to 9:00 pm.

#### Highlights from the Planning Meeting for the clubs to share with membership

- This year's Reunion dates are July 27th 29th.
- Registration cost has increased this year by \$5, first increase since 2006. Even with an increase, this is still an affordable event. Money raised from the auction, raffle, and basket raffle offsets the Reunion's costs.
- The fund-raising auction this year made \$854. Please help out this year by bringing good usable items to this event. Doesn't need to be Model A stuff, but that is always appreciated..
- Each club needs to donate an item for <u>each</u> of the raffle categories: \$50 for the Men's, \$50 for the Women's, and \$25 for the Kid's. These need to be single items for one drawing from each category, not several little ones to make up several drawings. Individuals may also donate. The 2017 Raffle brought \$760.
- Each club needs to donate a \$25 value basket for the Basket Raffle. The 2017 total on this was \$680. Clubs may donate more than one basket, and individuals may donate also. Baskets do not need to be elaborate. Look on Pinterest for some good ideas.
- Please pre-register, and save \$5. A pre-registration form is in this mailing and is on the web site at clubs.hemming.com/wirapidsmodela.
- You do not need to be a Model A Club member to participate in the Reunion. A Model A is optional also.
- Rooms in the Rapids area go fast, be sure to reserve yours today.
- We ask that all participants wear their club's name tags, so that names can be learned. Name tags may be borrowed from Registration, please return afterward.
- Please list the first and last names of all the participants that you are registering on the registration form. This is to help with the issuing of awards.
- All participants, 16 years and older, need to sign up for a job duty, to help out over the weekend. If people don't start signing up, we will have to look into other ways of getting volunteers.
- Car trailers will be allowed to park on the north-east corner of the lot, on the race track curve, and on the south end of the lot, as long as it is not interfering with camping.
- This Lady Drives a Model A will be held again this year. This class is designed to show participants how to drive a Model A from someone other than a relative by birth or marriage. Schedule a time to do this.
- The corn roast will only be on Friday this year, between 5 and 7, or until the supply runs out. \$1 an ear.

- The Ski Race will be held on Saturday at 10. This
  will be open to the "older children" of the Reunion.
  Definition of "older" and "children" to be determined
  by self. Form a team, sign up at the club house.
- Saturday morning will be the Shoe Box Swap Meet.
   Bring what fits in a shoe box, and swap/sell your items with other participants. Trying to limit this to Model A era related items only parts, tools, fashions, etc. Be sure that you have your own change, as there will not be a banker on hand. All money raised is your own.
- Please remember to bring an item each day to the Pot Luck line in a disposable container to make clean up easier, or put your name on dish if you want it back.
   All items brought to Pot Luck must be ready to serve, this includes slicing of any fruits and vegetables. The serving staff does not have the space or time to finish your dish.
- Kitchen duties have been assigned by club, and are listed elsewhere in these notes. Please be sure to help your club out on their day.
- Events Chaired by Clubs have also been assigned, and are also listed elsewhere.
- With the exception of the Slow Drive and Chapter Team Events, each licensed/temps registered participant can go through the car games once. If the participant does not have a Model A, one may be borrowed. A car and participant may go through the Slow Drive only once.
- The Slow Drive has been moved to Saturday, after the short tour, to get more participants.
- Because of moving the Slow Drive, there will not be a Long Tour this year.
- Car games this year will be Bull's Eye, Center Bumper, and Grenade Launch.
- Chapter Team Events will be May Pole, Bean Bag, and Teeter Totter. There will be no practice round for the Chapter Team event, only a demo. Start practicing. Decide who will be doing these events for your club, so we do not need to be on the PA looking for them.
- Ice will no longer be available for sale to the participants, they will need to go get their own in town.
- The areas under any structure used by the Reunion, whether it a building or a tent, are now Smoke/Vaping Free. This includes the clubhouse, overhang, basket raffle and food line tents.



# 56th Annual Model A Reunion July 27th-28th-29th, 2018 YOU AND YOUR FAMILY ARE INVITED...



This Model "A" Reunion is the greatest gathering of old Fords and old Ford enthusiasts in Wisconsin. This Reunion started in 1962, and is sponsored by four clubs: Central Wisconsin Chapter MARC/MAFCA, Nickle A Region MARC, Wisconsin Chapter MAFCA, and the Wisconsin Region MARC.

The meet consists of a weekend of enjoying Model A's and Model A fellowship, and includes a Tour around the Rapids area, People's Choice Awards, Car Games, Kids' Games, a Hubley Derby, Chapter Team Events, Rolling Pin Toss, a Dance, Fund-Raising Auctions, Shoe Box Swap Meet, as well as lots of surprises and fun.

The Reunion is held the last full weekend in July, unless it conflicts with a National MARC or MAFCA meet. The Central Wisconsin Chapter MARC/MAFCA hosts the reunion on their private 10-acre site, which includes a clubhouse, wooded campsites, and is close to many nice motels and restaurants.
