


Shoebox Swap Meet

Eagle River Weekend Get-A-Way

New Updated Info-Can't miss event!!

Thursday, July 30 - Monday, August 3, 2020

Tour Group from Milwaukee area will be led by Dennis and Anne Wacker
Tour Hosts in Eagle River are Carl and Charlene Wussow

This is truly a "can't miss" event. The ride will be long but so worth it. We are leaving on Thursday and heading back Monday to avoid the heavier weekend traffic and to allow a more leisurely route.

We have 15 confirmed rooms held at the **Eagle River Inn**, Eagle River, Wisconsin. It is a beautiful setting on Watersmeet Lake where the Eagle River and the Wisconsin River join on their journey to the Mississippi River. The complex is located on Hwy.70 West, just about a mile from the City of Eagle River. The parking lot is secure and away from other locations that would have had lots of traffic. Breakfast is included. Some items include: hot waffles, breakfast sandwiches, hard boiled eggs, oatmeal, Danish, cereal, coffee and other items.

Room Rates on the parking lot side, 2 queen beds, fridge and micro is on special for us at \$107.10 and a lakeside room, with patio doors opening directly to the water complex are \$125.10. None of the other hotels have settings like this one and others are in more crowded areas with much more vehicle and pedestrian traffic.

Hotel registration can be made by each family by calling the **Eagle River Inn: 715-479-2000**. They will need to identify themselves as part of the group from the Wisconsin Chapter, Model A Ford Club to get those special rates. I suggest that you make initial contact with the Eagle River Inn not much later than January as summer reservations will be increasing after that time. Early is always better than late!

Details are still being finalized for the weekend, but so far we will plan a Friday late-morning Pirates Hideaway cruise (Pirate attire is encouraged) and a Fish fry at Chef Rene's award winning restaurant at the Eagle River Inn (all you can eat for \$14) and they have a bar lounge adjacent to the restaurant.

Saturday is our weekend headliner event - Three Lakes Petroleum Museum Car Show: Arrive by 9:00 a.m. or before. The show is from 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. with awards following. The museum is free and open all day. Food is available on the grounds and each car registered early will receive a coupon for 1 sandwich (hamburger, cheeseburger, bratwurst or hotdog, chips, soda and popcorn. Over 250 vehicles will be on display.

The Three Lakes Winery is only 2 miles away from the car show and the wine selection is outstanding along with a related "wine related" gift shop.

Saturday night event will be movie and pizza night. We will be showing Public Enemies. It was filmed at Little Bohemia just a few years ago and starred Johnny Depp. It is accurate, exciting and will be an opportunity to prime us for our dinner at Little Bohemia the following night.

Sunday the group will depart the hotel at 1:30 for a drive through the beautiful forests in the area. We will stop at the Dillinger Museum for a tour and then enjoy dinner at Little Bohemia at 5:00 p.m. Since it has never been restored after the FBI and Dillinger gun battle, our cars will be a highlight for photographs in front of the main building. We will return the hotel before dark.

STAINLESS CAP DENT REMOVAL

A few months ago, Ed Case gave me some old original Model A gas and radiator caps full of dents and said “hey... see what you can do with these”. They all had inner shells, which made it impossible to remove the dents from the outer shell surface. The word impossible really bugs me as I feel nothing is impossible so I reviewed one of my favorite quotes “Improvise sensibly as the situation demands” (which probably came from my brother Jim who has a gift for neat quotes and story telling). I tried soaking the cap liners with Kroil penetrate for a few weeks followed by big-brute vise grips on the inner center combined with my 3 foot pipe wrench. The result was not very pretty.

OK, on to plan C (plan B was more coffee and a head call).

Dremels are neat little tools, and I had one loaded with a small cut off wheel so why not cut the inner liner at a 45° angle (without cutting the stainless too badly on the inside), take small vise grips and bend the cut part in enough to use the vise grip and a small screwdriver to work the inner liner up and out. IT WORKED! This was done on a Eaton Cap.



Then, I sand blasted the removed inner shell and inner portion of the outer shell. Where do I smack the outer shell to work the dents out?

I took a magnet retrieval tool and placed it on the outside dent, dropped a ball bearing into the cap which migrated to the center of the magnet, drew a circle around the ball bearing with a felt tip pen and this gave me a good "smack it here" area. Hey... that worked too.



On a roll now, I was able to push up all the dents, file the cap to reveal other low spots, sand with 320, 400 and 600 wet-or-dry paper and polish. I painted the inner cap with anti-rust silver and pressed it back into the outer using some Loctite blue medium strength.


Karen Schmeichen talked about the events at today's meeting.

'A' Trip Back to January 2005



Hard to believe that I am writing an article for the year 2020 and looking at 2005 as history!!

Our newly elected board at our January meeting consisted of Roger Olsen as president, Kitty Schaefer as vice president, recording the minutes was Bob Sonnen, and keeping track of our funds was Paul Piotrowski. The election of officers took place at our January meeting and included an ice cream social. Co-hosts Jackie and Katie Mazos put together sundaes and banana splits with custard from Leon's Famous Custard. The cost was 50 cents per item.

The out-going president, Dennis Wacker, summarized the 2004 year as follows: We've had five indoor meetings which included ice cream, trivia, puzzles, antique evaluation, and more. Five technical meetings were held at Hanna's and involved programs on painting, stainless steel, rear axles and starters. Additionally our club had two overnight tours and participated in five parades with basically two other activities a month. They included daily tours, car shows, a picnic, banquet, swap meet, and the Model 'A' Reunion.

Our annual banquet was held on January 22, 2005 at the Manchester East Hotel on Port Washington Road. The menu choices included steak and chicken, stuffed pork chop with sage dressing, or eggplant parmesan. For those who wished to stay the night, rooms were available for \$79 and included your choice of egg breakfast made to order with sausage or bacon, pancake breakfast with bacon or French toast breakfast with bacon. Our banquet committee consisted of Diane Smith and Anne Wacker with Karlene Sillman as Mistress of Ceremonies.

January 20th saw our first technical meet of the new year held at Bill Storey's heated garage. The topic for the evening was a demonstration by Erwin Haban on the use of a "brake shoe-arcing machine". This is where the radius of the brake shoe is correctly matched to the diameter of the brake drum. This procedure enhances brake performance.

A bus trip to get a first hand look at how a Model 'A' engine is built was scheduled for February 19th. Cost was \$10 and included the bus, with restroom and refreshments. The coordinator for this event was Rich Miller.

One new member joined the club in January – John Beckner who was looking to purchase a Model 'A' Ford.




