Stay to meet the players and pet the horses if you wish.





Davisson, Marlene Stegner, and Carl Doro.



A. Pocket watches and wrist watches similar to these shown were sold all four years of our Era. Styles seemed to stay the same. The right pocket watch shown had a white-gold or green-rolled gold- plated case. It was an extra thin model and was attached to a Waldemar chain. This style often had a very fancy monogrammed case.

Also shown is a plain-cased watch of quindecagon shape, attached by a leather braided strap to a silver penknife. Sometimes a flat leather strap was used. Fobs were often attached to the chain or strap commemorating an event. Sometimes charms were put on the chains. Sears, F&W, 1930, pp. 420, 421.

Wrist watches and bands were shown in many styles. A variety is shown here. They were made of nickel, yellow gold or white gold. There were many styles of bands. One was a flat metal band that expanded at the fastening. Some had luminous dials. A Sears catalog of 1931 shows a calendar watch on which the date changed automatically. These examples are from Sears, F&W, 1930-1931, p. 419, with the exception of the one with the large link wristband. This was from Marshall Field, 1930-1931, p. 58.
