



55th Annual Model A Reunion July 28th-29th-30th, 2017 YOU AND YOUR FAMILY ARE INVITED...



This Model "A" Reunion is the greatest gathering of old Fords and old Ford enthusiasts in Wisconsin. The Reunion, originated in 1962, is sponsored by 4 clubs: Central Wisconsin Chapter MAFCA, Wisconsin Region MARC, Nickle A Region MARC, and the Wisconsin Chapter MAFCA.

The meet consists of a weekend of enjoying Model "A's" and Model "A" fellowship, and includes Tours, People's Choice, Kids' Games, Hubley Derby, Car Games, Chapter Team Events, Women's Rolling Pin Toss, a Dance, Fund-Raising Auctions, Shoe Box Swap Meet, as well as lots of surprises and fun.

The Reunion is held the last full weekend in July, unless it conflicts with a National MARC or MAFCA meet. The Central Wisconsin Chapter MAFCA hosts the reunion on their privately held 10-acre site, which includes a club house, wooded campsites, and is close to many nice motels and restaurants. These ground were developed and maintained for Model "A" activities.

Location: The club grounds are located 4 miles east of Wisconsin Rapids, or 11 miles west of Plover, just south of state Highway 54. Turn south on 72nd Street (a dead end road). Watch for signs.

Weekend Activities

Refreshments are available throughout the weekend for registered participants.

Good Food: A potluck lunch is planned for Saturday and Sunday. Guests and members are asked to bring 2 dishes to pass (one for each day). Friday and Saturday evening, you may want to roast hotdogs at your campsite or go out for a relaxed dinner at one of the nearby restaurants with a group of your new friends.

Friday afternoon the registration table opens. An Auction will be held in the evening of Model A related items, as well as other donations for kids, ladies, and men.

Saturday morning starts with a Shoe Box Swap Meet, Technical Seminar, then a noon potluck, followed by a driving tour. A Silent Auction will be held througout the day. There will also be a Hubley Derby and kid's games. A dance will be held at the club house for the evening's entertainment.

Sunday is a day of car games, potluck lunch, Chapter team events, and a ladies rolling pin toss, followed by the awards presentation.

Primitive campsites are available on the grounds. Camping is open the Wednesday before the meet through the Monday after the meet. The fee per campsite is \$15 for the entire weekend. 

If your 'A' headlights do not supply as bright a beam as you would like, get a pair of G.E. No. 1188 32-50 cp bulbs. The lights will be as bright as a sealed beam.

When filling the oil pan of a rebuilt engine for the first time, pour the oil through the distributor shaft opening. By doing this, the main bearings all receive oil at once.



LOOKING BACK IN THE REARVIEW MIRROR...



Jim's technical tip for May by Jim Cannon, MAFCA Technical Director

"Most carburetor problems are electrical." In other words, when your Model A starts running poorly and you think you have a carburetor problem, first look at the ignition system. How old is your condenser, how good are your points, is the point gap correct? Are all of the connections between the coil, ignition switch and distributor clean and tight? If you have a wire inside your distributor between the lower plate and the upper plate, what condition is it in? Is the ignition switch making a good connection inside? These things are as common as carburetor problems, if not more so, to cause your engine to run poorly.
