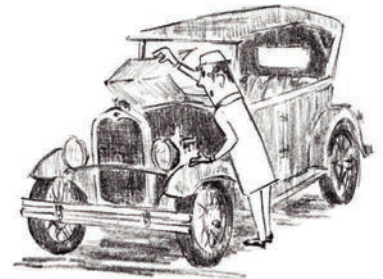

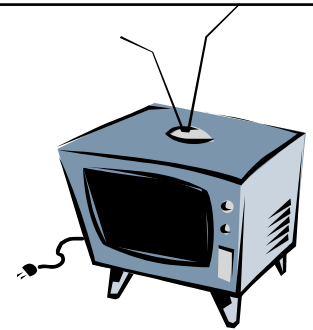

Things you auto know....

1. Waukesha Preservation Alliance will be having their annual event which focuses on Waukesha's colorful past. They are looking for period cars from 1900 to early 1950s which will help participants understand the role the automobile played in our past. The gathering will be held May 17th, close to the famous five points in downtown Waukesha. Meeting at 9:00 a.m. and the event continues until 3:00 p.m. As usual there will be donuts and orange juice to start the day and snacks throughout the afternoon. If you can attend you will not be expected to stay the entire day. There will be several tours and other events.
2. The Harry Miller Club will be holding the Vintage Indy Car event on July 11-12 at the famed Milwaukee Mile racetrack. The Miller event is one of the most impressive U.S. gatherings of Pre-W.W. II and Post- W.W. II Indy cars, Indy roadsters and laydowns. Gates open at 8:00 a.m. on Friday and Saturday with cars running the oval track from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. each day.
3. The full WI assembly passed SEMA-supported legislation to allow minor modifications to collector vehicles, exempt former military vehicles, historic military vehicles and collector vehicles from importer certification label requirements and expanded rights from historic military vehicle owners. Having already been approved by the senate, the bill will now be sent to Gov. Walker for his signature and enactment into law. The measure would allow modifications to vehicles registered as collector vehicles as long as the bodies of these vehicles are not modified. Currently upgrades such as safety glass, radial tires, a radio or hubcaps are reasons to deny registration.
4. Vernon Presbyterian Church at S71 W23280 National Ave., Big Bend has extended an invite to their FREE Country Gospel/Bluegrass concert on Sunday March 30th from 3:30 to 5:30 p.m. Wildwood Society performs a mixture of old time Gospel, Mountain and Appalachian music.

Mike Quam called the meeting to order at 1:32 p.m.

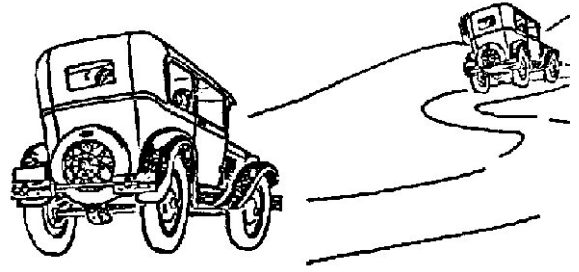

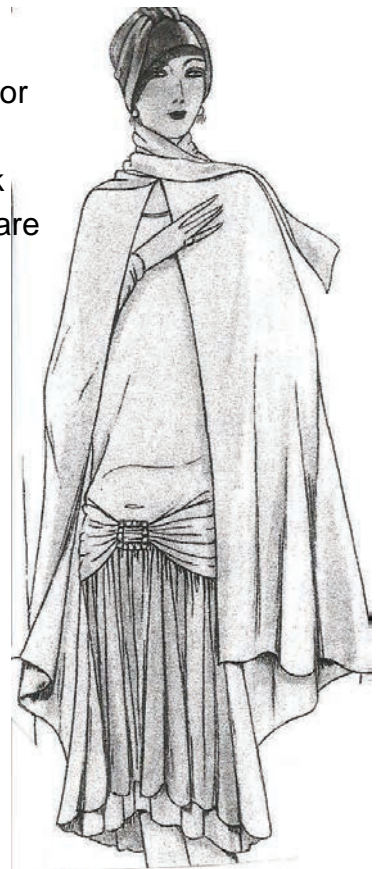

Worn-Out Auto Tires

REBUILT BY NEW PROCESS

NEW tires for old are offered today's motorist. Instead of discarding a casing worn out by twenty thousand miles or so of service, he may have it "rebuilt" by modern scientific methods. He gets back a tire that looks and wears like a new one, according to specialists in the work, but costs only half as much.

Photographs on this page, made especially for POPULAR SCIENCE MONTHLY, show how the process is carried out in a typical shop. It consists of removing all traces of rubber adhering to the body of the tire and forming a brand-new tread upon it, much as a shoe is resoled. Since the body alone represents sixty percent of the cost of a new tire, an appreciable saving results.

Recent developments in motor-ing have helped spread the new fashion of rebuilding tires, and multiplied the number of shops specializing in it. The body of a modern tire, expert rebuilders point out, is far stronger and more resilient than that of former types. Concrete roads spare it the bruising blows of rocks, ruts, and road bumps. Hence, it may still be good for long service when the rubber tread, worn down by the powerful braking and quick starts of present-day cars, is almost gone. A careful examination is always given to make sure the body is intact, for rebuilding is feasible only when it is free from breaks and signs of weakness.



1 OLD RUBBER COMES OFF
The first step in rebuilding a worn-out tire. With a long, sharp knife made of file steel, a workman pares off the old rubber in strips, going as close to the cord as he can with safety.



2 Rubber is buffed off the shoulders with a tach-studded band, and the cushion under the tread is ground off with a steel brush. The photo at right shows the band and brush.



3 NEW TREAD STOCK APPLIED TO CORD
The body of the tire is given two coats of rubber cement, as shown in the small picture. Then new tread stock like that used in new tires is applied to cover the top and sides.



4 NEW RUBBER BONDED ON BY VULCANIZING
As the final process, the new tread is vulcanized to the body in a steam-jacketed curing mold. The new rubber fills the spaces between the cords and forms a perfect bond. The tire is now ready for use.
