# Memorial 2017 weekend route and Agenda

#### Milwaukee area Model Aer's:

Dave and Carol Rozman will be hosting a group of any Model A'ers who wish to travel together from the Milwaukee area to Eagle WI where we will rendezvous with the Model A group from the North.

- We will meet at McDonalds located at the corner of HWY 164 and National Avenue, Big Bend, WI
- Departure from McDonalds will be at 8:45 AM (come a bit early if you wish to have a coffee or some breakfast before we depart)
- If you need to contact Dave Rozman for any reason, call his cell phone at (414) 333-9705.

The northern Model Aer's will meet Milwaukee As at St. Theresa Catholic Church, 136 W. Waukesha Rd/WI 59W, Eagle, WI around 9:30 AM. There is a tavern/restaurant and gas station right there, and it's not on the intersection with plenty of parking. We will then take WI-59W towards Janesville. (Approx. 44 miles) following 59 -w thru Whitewater. At the a 4-way stop, make sure to turn left onto WI-59W to eliminate going thru the business district of Whitewater. Follow 59-W until the stop sign and the HWY 12/59 intersection. Turn right. Then turn right onto HWY-59-W once again. Continue to follow 59-W approx. 24 miles towards Milton. Go thru about 4 round-a-bouts. Last one before the Milton welcome sign, take ramp for 26-S towards Janesville. Follow 26-S thru Janesville where 26 will turn into 51-S. Follow 51-S until stop light. Then turn right onto 11-W to Monroe. Approx. 1 hour 35 minutes from Eagle to Monroe. We should arrive in

Monroe about Noon. Stopping at the World Famous Baumgartner's Tavern for Lunch (1 hour). Then if anyone wants to spend an hour in Monroe, go to the Brewery or take a mini trip to the Cheese factory we can do that. # 55th Annual Model A Reunion July 28th-29th-30th, 2017 YOU AND YOUR FAMILY ARE INVITED...



This Model "A" Reunion is the greatest gathering of old Fords and old Ford enthusiasts in Wisconsin. The Reunion, originated in 1962, is sponsored by 4 clubs: Central Wisconsin Chapter MAFCA, Wisconsin Region MARC, Nickle A Region MARC, and the Wisconsin Chapter MAFCA.

The meet consists of a weekend of enjoying Model "A's" and Model "A" fellowship, and includes Tours, People's Choice, Kids' Games, Hubley Derby, Car Games, Chapter Team Events, Women's Rolling Pin Toss, a Dance, Fund-Raising Auctions, Shoe Box Swap Meet, as well as lots of surprises and fun.

The Reunion is held the last full weekend in July, unless it conflicts with a National MARC or MAFCA meet. The Central Wisconsin Chapter MAFCA hosts the reunion on their privately held 10-acre site, which includes a club house, wooded campsites, and is close to many nice motels and restaurants. These ground were developed and maintained for Model "A" activities.

Location: The club grounds are located 4 miles east of Wisconsin Rapids, or 11 miles west of Plover, just south of state Highway 54. Turn south on 72nd Street (a dead end road). Watch for signs.

#### **Weekend Activities**

Refreshments are available throughout the weekend for registered participants.

Good Food: A potluck lunch is planned for Saturday and Sunday. Guests and members are asked to bring 2 dishes to pass (one for each day). Friday and Saturday evening, you may want to roast hotdogs at your campsite or go out for a relaxed dinner at one of the nearby restaurants with a group of your new friends.

**Friday** afternoon the registration table opens. An Auction will be held in the evening of Model A related items, as well as other donations for kids, ladies, and men.

**Outdoor** – Bob – All the outdoor events have hosts. All the sixtieth anniversary window clings have been dispersed.


**Indoor** – Karry – A host is needed for the indoor meeting March 2018.

Music by the Polka Chips Orchestra with liquid refreshments on tap all evening and a lavish lunch will be set up. This affair will be open to the public, so bring your friends. There will be a \$2 charge at the door to any human being able to walk. Harold Spoonholtz and Joe Komar are the chairmen for this event. We expect to have truly GOOD TIME.

Coming event – Sunday, June 14<sup>th</sup> we will caravan to Fond du lac. This will be a well publicized tour. We will caravan with the ORSON CAMERA CENTER'S scenic tour bus. Publicity will be handled by Mr. Orson. At Fond du lac we will be part of the Horseless Carriage Club's car exhibit at the fairgrounds.
