Hello A gang!

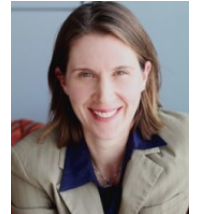
Greetings from my makeshift stay at home basement office! The wobbly table I'm working on is older than my A and my rural satellite internet is sure to win "the slow race!"

The Milwaukee Memorial Day parade has been **CANCELLED** by the Milwaukee Veterans parade committee due to the coronavirus pandemic.

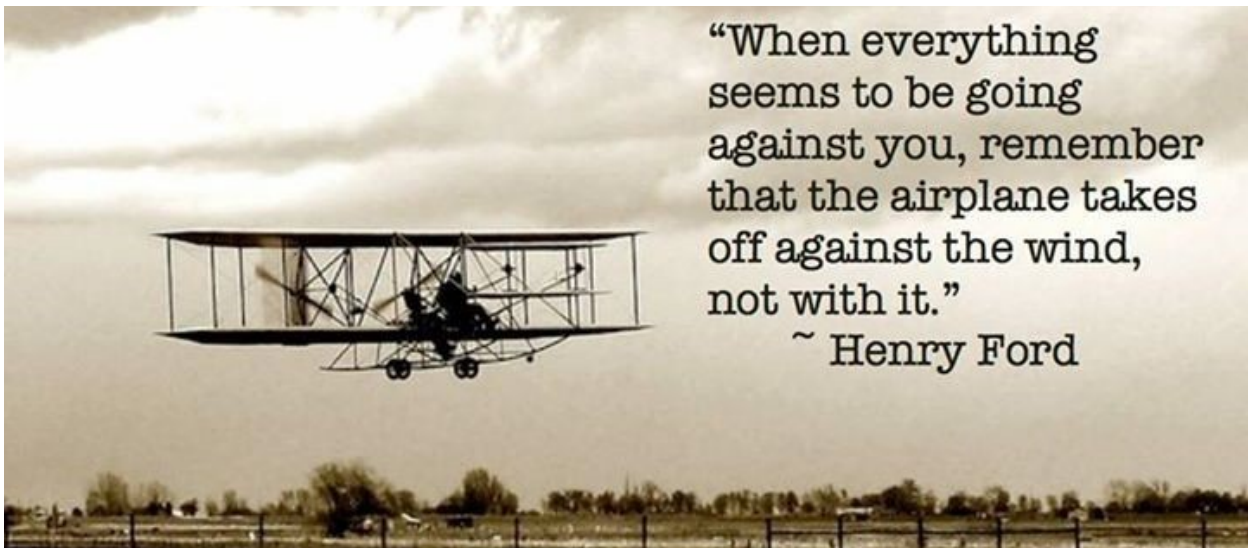
## SUNSHINE REPORT:

# Eagle River Weekend Get-A-Way

New Updated Info-Can't miss event!!

Thursday, July 30 - Monday, August 3, 2020

Tour Hosts in Eagle River are Carl and Charlene Wussow

This is truly a "can't miss" event. The ride will be long but so worth it. We are leaving on Thursday and heading back Monday to avoid the heavier weekend traffic and to allow a more leisurely route.

We have 15 confirmed rooms held at the **Eagle River Inn**, Eagle River, Wisconsin. It is a beautiful setting on Watersmeet Lake where the Eagle River and the Wisconsin River join on their journey to the Mississippi River. The complex is located on Hwy.70 West, just about a mile from the City of Eagle River. The parking lot is secure and away from other locations that would have had lots of traffic. Breakfast is included. Some items include: hot waffles, breakfast sandwiches, hard boiled eggs, oatmeal, Danish, cereal, coffee and other items.

Room Rates on the parking lot side, 2 queen beds, fridge and micro is on special for us at \$107.10 and a lakeside room, with patio doors opening directly to the water complex are \$125.10. None of the other hotels have settings like this one and others are in more crowded areas with much more vehicle and pedestrian traffic.

Hotel registration can be made by each family by calling the **Eagle River Inn: 715-479-2000**. They will need to identify themselves as part of the group from the Wisconsin Chapter, Model A Ford Club to get those special rates. I suggest that you make initial contact with the Eagle River Inn not much later than January as summer reservations will be increasing after that time. Early is always better than late!

Details are still being finalized for the weekend, but so far we will plan a Friday late-morning Pirates Hideaway cruise (Pirate attire is encouraged) and a Fish fry at Chef Rene's award winning restaurant at the Eagle River Inn (all you can eat for \$14) and they have a bar lounge adjacent to the restaurant.

Saturday is our weekend headliner event - Three Lakes Petroleum Museum Car Show: Arrive by 9:00 a.m. or before. The show is from 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. with awards following. The museum is free and open all day. Food is available on the grounds and each car registered early will receive a coupon for 1 sandwich (hamburger, cheeseburger, bratwurst or hotdog, chips, soda and popcorn. Over 250 vehicles will be on display.

The Three Lakes Winery is only 2 miles away from the car show and the wine selection is outstanding along with a related "wine related" gift shop.

Saturday night event will be movie and pizza night. We will be showing Public Enemies. It was filmed at Little Bohemia just a few years ago and starred Johnny Depp. It is accurate, exciting and will be an opportunity to prime us for our dinner at Little Bohemia the following night.

Sunday the group will depart the hotel at 1:30 for a drive through the beautiful forests in the area. We will stop at the Dillinger Museum for a tour and then enjoy dinner at Little Bohemia at 5:00 p.m. Since it has never been restored after the FBI and Dillinger gun battle, our cars will be a highlight for photographs in front of the main building. We will return the hotel before dark.

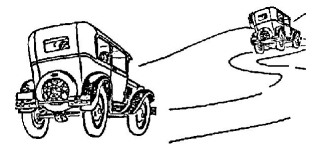
## Antique Motorcycle Club of America National Road Run Thursday, August 13, 2020 at 4:00 PM to 9:00 PM

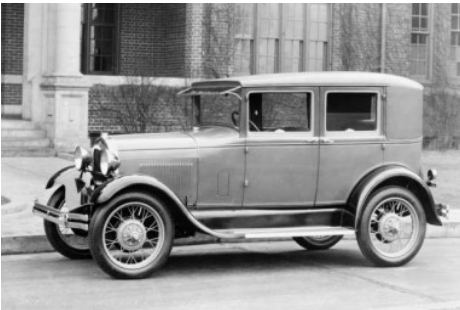

## 'A' Little History for May 2020



Not this Model A, this one actually predated the Model T and was the first product of Henry Ford's third and final attempt to create a car company. It went on sale in 1903 and, typically for those early days, did not last long, though it was a financial success.



The next Model A was so named because it represented a new start for a company which had relied on the Model T for nearly 20 years. The upheaval involved in bringing it to market was so enormous that Ford actually stopped building cars entirely for several months in 1927, all but killing its income at a time of great expenditure.

After a long period of anticipation (during which it is said that other manufacturers' sales suffered because customers were waiting to see what the new Ford would be like), the Model A was finally revealed on December 2, 1927. Estimates of the number of Americans who went to their Ford dealers that day run well into the millions, often exceeding the number of people who actually bought one. In fact, it is thought that as much as a quarter of the US population viewed it in the week of its launch.

The Model AF was a British version of the Model A which looked identical to the standard model but had a smaller, 2038cc version of the same engine. Maximum power was around 28 hp, and the highest speed it could reach was 54mph, but crucially the AF was much cheaper to tax, and achieved better sales in the UK as a result. That said, British Model As and AFs were at best moderately popular. Only 14,516 were built, a tiny proportion of a global production run exceeding four million.





The Model A was offered with many body styles including sedan, coupe, convertible and pickup. Another derivative was a truck called the Model AA, which was based on the car but had a much stronger chassis and a four-speed gearbox. Twin rear wheels were available as an option to limit (or, in Ford's words, "reduce very considerably") the chances of a Model AA coming to grief on soft, rough, wet or frosty ground.

Having replaced a car which had been on the market for nearly two decades, the Model A itself survived for only four years and four months. It was replaced by both the Model B and the Ford V8, which were essentially the same car with different engines. Some things remained the same. The four-cylinder engines were retained, though with more power, while the truck derivative was called the BB, echoing the naming convention used for the AA.



It took Ford only 14 months to produce one million Model As. Another milestone was reached in April 1931, when a slant-windscreen Town Sedan 160B became the 20 millionth car ever built by the Ford Motor Company. Presumed lost, the car was rediscovered in Michigan in 2000. Ford paid for a full restoration in return for being able to use the car in displays and exhibitions for 10 years.

# Preventing Moth Damage to Upholstery and Era Fashions

There are two kinds of moths that eat wool: Webbing Clothes Moths and Casemaking Clothes Moths. Most of the interior upholstery used on our closed cars is made of wool, as is a lot of vintage clothing. If they take up residency in your car or closet, moths can quickly eat large holes in the material before you know what happened.



You can be alerted to their presence before you see the damage. When your car is parked in the garage, hang a "clothes moth trap" on a small piece of coat hanger wire inside the car, or hang one in your closet near your vintage clothes. Check the trap regularly (at least monthly). There is a sticky strip inside the trap that is treated with moth-specific pheromones. If there is a male Webbing Clothes Moth (but not Casemaking Clothes Moths) in the area, they will go to the trap. (Do not use the traps sold for grain moths or pantry moths -- wrong pheromone.)

If you can, park the car outside in direct sun all day with the windows rolled up, to get the interior temperature above 120 °F for 4 hours or more. Put cloths in the car. You can't rely on these traps to catch all of the moths, though, to eliminate the problem. You must do something to kill the moths in the car or on the clothes to stop the damage. First vacuum everything well to get rid of anything you can. I don't like to use insecticides, but you might find one that you like that will work.

If you can, park the car outside in direct sun in a black plastic trash bag, sealed. (I do it all day for several days -- it can't hurt.) This will kill the larvae and adults, but may not kill all of the eggs, so you may need to treat again.

If hot weather is not available, you can also smother the moths by closing all of the windows and putting several pounds of dry ice in the car. The CO<sub>2</sub> from the dry ice will fill the car and smother the moths -- eggs, larvae and adults. Or put the dry ice in a sealed container or bag with era fashion cloths (don't let them touch the dry ice.). It takes about a week to kill everything, so leave it all closed up, then air it out well before you drive.

Mark how many moths are stuck in the trap after you treat the car or clothes and then continue to monitor for any new little critters. If you see them again, you need to treat again.

I hope this little tip helps you prevent damage to your car's upholstery and era fashions. Have a Model A Day! Jim
