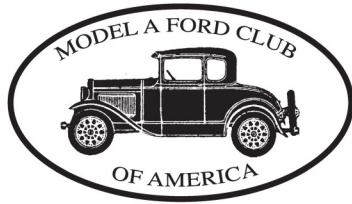

This Model "A" Reunion is the greatest gathering of old Fords and old Ford enthusiasts in Wisconsin. This Reunion started in 1962, and is sponsored by four clubs: Central Wisconsin Chapter MARC/MAFCA, Nickle A Region MARC, Wisconsin Chapter MAFCA, and the Wisconsin Region MARC.

The meet consists of a weekend of enjoying Model A's and Model A fellowship, and includes a Tour around the Rapids area, People's Choice Awards, Car Games, Kids' Games, Adult Games, a Hubley Derby, Chapter Team Events, Rolling Pin Toss, a Dance, Fund-Raising Auctions, Shoe Box Swap Meet, as well as lots of surprises and fun.

The Reunion is held the last full weekend in July, unless it conflicts with a National MARC or MAFCA meet. The Central Wisconsin Chapter MARC/MAFCA hosts the reunion on their private 10-acre site, which includes a clubhouse, wooded campsites, and is close to many nice motels and restaurants.

Location: The clubgrounds are located 4 miles east of Wisconsin Rapids, or 11 miles west of Plover, just south of state Highway 54. Turn south on 72nd Street North (a dead end road). Watch for signs.

Weekend Activities

Refreshments are available throughout the weekend for registered participants.

Good Food: A potluck lunch will be held on Saturday and Sunday. Participants are asked to bring 2 dishes to pass (one for each day). Friday and Saturday evening, you may want to roast hot dogs at your campsite or go out for a relaxed dinner at one of the nearby restaurants with a group of your new friends.

Friday afternoon the registration table opens. An Auction will be held in the evening of Model A related items, as well as other donated items for the kids, ladies, and men. There will also be a corn and pizza roast. Registration does not cover cost of Pizza or Corn.

Saturday morning starts with a Shoe Box Swap Meet, Technical Seminar. This will be followed by a Ski Race then a noon potluck, and then a driving tour around the Greater Rapids area. There will also be a Slow Drive competition for the Model A's, a Hubley Derby Kids' Games and Adult Games. A dance will be held at the clubhouse for the evening's entertainment. At the dance, the winners of the Basket Raffle will be announced. Tickets for the Basket Raffle will be on sale Saturday after lunch.

Sunday is a day of Car Games, Potluck Lunch, Chapter Team Events, and a Ladies Rolling Pin Toss, followed by the awards presentation and Raffle Drawings.

We look forward to seeing everyone at the club's picnic to celebrate the Model A Ford Club of America – Wisconsin Chapters 65th anniversary.




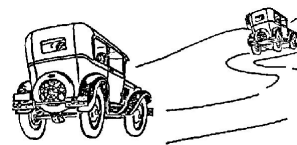
New Business – The next Board meeting is tentatively set to be held at Mark Ackermann's home.

Quick Mexican Dish (*Tony Sillman, from Wi Chapter, "A" Road to Good Cooking*)

1 can cream of cheese soup
8 oz. pkg grated cheddar cheese 1 can cream of onion soup
11 oz. pkg Doritos, crushed
16 oz. can tomatoes, chopped and drained
1 chopped onion
16 oz. corn, drained
1 lb. ground beef
1 can green chilies, chopped
1 pkg. taco seasoning



Brown meat and onion, drain. Add seasonings and corn, add any additional spices (oregano, sweet basil, salsa, hot red peppers, etc.). Add soups and tomatoes.

Grease an oblong baking dish. Fill bottom with crushed Doritos, spreading evenly. Add meat mixture, top with cheese. Bake at 350 degrees for 25 minutes (check temperature in middle of pan for warmth, usually takes around 45 minutes). *Okay Tony, which is it 25 or 45 minutes??* Add sour cream on top of baked casserole and sliced ripe olives. Serves 6 – 8.

Sharpening Your Accessory Knowledge

On your travels in your Model A, stopping at antique shops can be a treasure hunt looking for those accessories for your era fashion ensembles. You may be surprised how easy it is to add smaller fashion accessories to your Model A back seat or package deck. A few of the productive manufacturers during 1928-1931 were: US Wallkill River Works, Walden New York The New York Knife Company, Colonial Providence RI, and Shapleigh Hardware Company/Diamond Edge Company, Boker Knife Company, Solingen Germany and the United States of America, Hammer Brand Knives, and the Camillus Knife Company.

Look for the name of the knife and/or manufacturer on one of the blades near the hub of the knife. This is referred to as the **tang stamp**. The knife could have any number of blades located at one hub, at opposite ends of the knife, or a combination.



The knives varied in length from two- and- one half inches up to seven- and- three fourth inches. Various materials were used for the handles; wood, ivory, polished steel, pearl, brass, celluloid, silver, bone known as stag handles.

Men and women in era could carry a pocket knife for various ensembles and occupations. A well-dressed man could wear a pocket knife in a vest pocket with a chain similar to a watch fob. A golfer might have used a pocket knife to clean the dirt from the cleats of his shoes. A woman could have a small knife in her purse for personal protection or to make adjustments of the points on her Model A. Larger knives with a blunt blade would have been used as an utility knife.



Era pocket knives can add interesting information to the written description of your fashion ensembles, valuable points toward the final score, and a bit of spark to

the entrant's overall appearance.
