

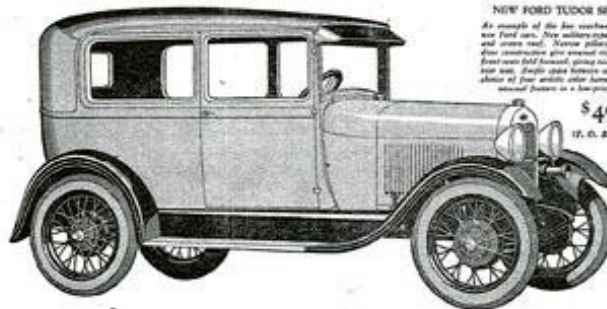

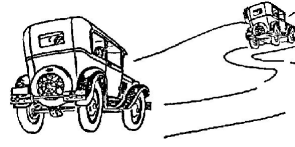

'A' Trip Back to May 2001

In 2001 our Memorial Day overnighiter (May 26-28) was a fun-filled weekend held in the Waupaca area. Darrell Cornell, Marlene Drillsam, along with Jack and Mae Staehle planned and hosted our trip. The excitement began with an 8:30 a.m. departure time after meeting at the McDonald's on Hwy Q in Germantown.

Our accommodations were at the Baymont Inn & Suites in Waupaca. The Baymont included a fitness center, large heated pool (which many made use of), whirlpool, sauna, game room and club room, where we enjoyed a complimentary drink (per day) while sitting by the cozy fireplace. A continental breakfast was included.

Events for the weekend included a paddle boat ride on the Waupaca Chain of Lakes, pool party and a trip to King, Wisconsin for some gift and antique shopping.

On Sunday we traveled to lola where we were given a private showing of Chet Krause's car collection. In 1972, in conjunction with a pig roast and auction fundraiser sponsored by the lola Lions Club, Chet invited two dozen area vintage car owners to display their vehicles at the cookout. That was the first lola Old Car Show, an annual event that now draws tens of thousands of spectators to the village. The event has raised millions of dollars with profits benefiting dozens of area civic organizations that provide volunteer staffing for the largest collector car show in the Midwest.

The car show is only the most visible of the philanthropic activities that Chet engaged in over the years. Both personally and through a family foundation that he endowed, millions of dollars were spent on such projects as the development of Lake lola, expansion of the local golf course, village park improvement, street renovation, removal of dilapidated buildings and the provision of assisted living housing for seniors.

Our Sunday banquet included choices of Roasted Pork Loin or Grilled Tenderloin with, of course, all the fixings and dessert.

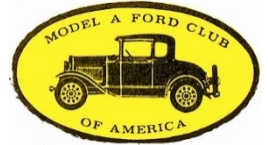
