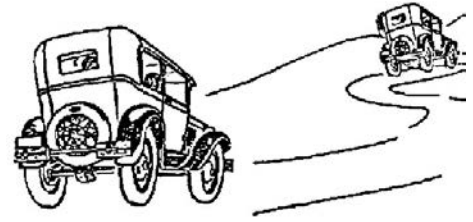
Old Business – A discussion was held regarding the technical seminars and who will be running them. Also, Paul asked if we will be having a swap / rummage table at the indoor meetings.

Looking Back in the Rearview Mirror.....

Fall Tour

What a difference a little sun makes!! The trees appeared to be glowing all along the tour route from Richfield to Horicon with the Horicon marsh as our destination. Approximately 23 cars and 47 attendees took part in the 35 mile tour.

At our destination, we watched a video about the rebirth of the whooping cranes. We then loaded the adjoined pontoon boats for a narrated tour on the Rock River through the southern part of the Horicon marsh. We learned a lot about the marsh from our tour host Mark. We learned about many of the birds that call Horicon home. The water levels are controlled by dams. Along with the whooping cranes, wood ducks nearly became extinct too, both are making their comeback. We were able to see close up a few blue herons and a bald eagle sitting high in a tree. 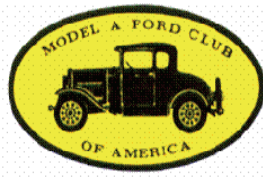
