- 5.) Vendors MUST vacate building by 4:00 p.m.


All other spaces will be available until we are sold out.

We especially admired the Cord cars and Hollywood Graham cars. Afterwards we headed down Port road to the Port Silver Diner for refreshments and conversation. It was at this event that a new member was signed up – John Secord.

New members in November of 1963 included John Secord, John Olson and George Limpert.
