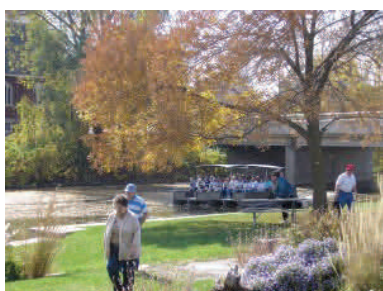
Fall Tour

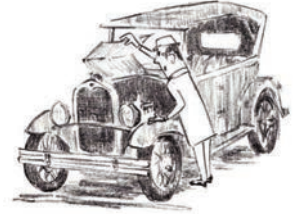

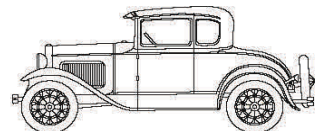

Our Greater Milwaukee Area Winter Swap Meet will be held **Sunday, February 22, 2015**, at Washington County Fair Grounds in West Bend, Wisconsin. We will use the West Pavilion and East Expo Center where each aisle vending space will be approximately 11' X 9' and is \$35. Wall spaces may vary in size depending on location in either building and are \$40.

We have space available for car clubs to help promote their special interest to the public. Clubs may use these spaces to sell their club merchandise and/or hand out club literature, spot not to be used for selling car parts. Those spaces are \$26 and are approximately 3' X 11" and include one free table (no credit given if table not used) and admittance for two people.

****Returning vendors will have the option to occupy the same space(s) they did in 2014, however your payment and completed application must be returned us by October 31, 2014 to insure your same space(s). After October 31, 2014 spaces will be sold on a first come first serve basis.**

We will honor your space requests as best as we can, however, we do reserve the right to assign vendor location. Maximum number of spaces for a vendor is limited to six, to help ensure a more diverse selection of swap merchandise. Each space rental includes 2 free admission wrist bands.

Vendors MUST vacate building by 4:00 p.m.

All other spaces will be available until we are sold out.

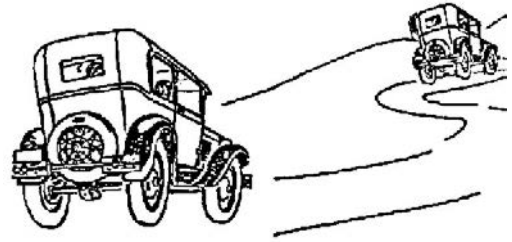

- 11th - The Polaroid Corporation files for federal bankruptcy protection.
- 23rd - Apple releases the iPod.
- 25th - Windows XP first became available.
- 26th - The United States passes the USA PATRIOT Act into law

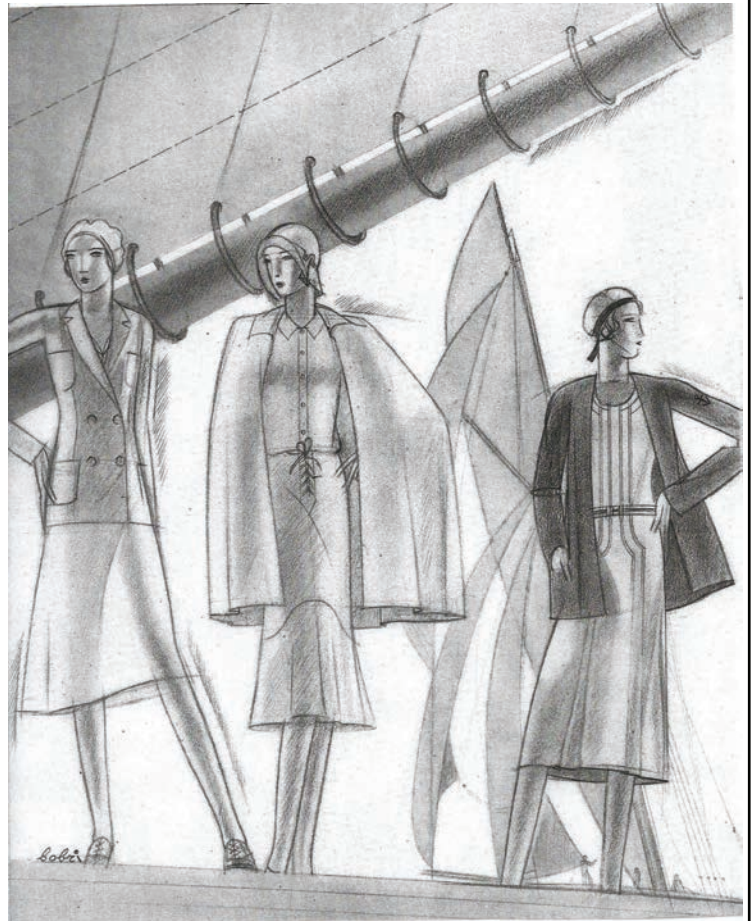
On the Bounding Main Harper's Bazaar, June 1930
