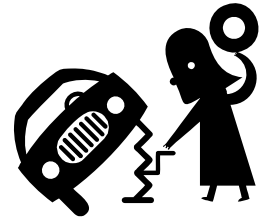

## 2013 Model A Reunion Planning Meeting

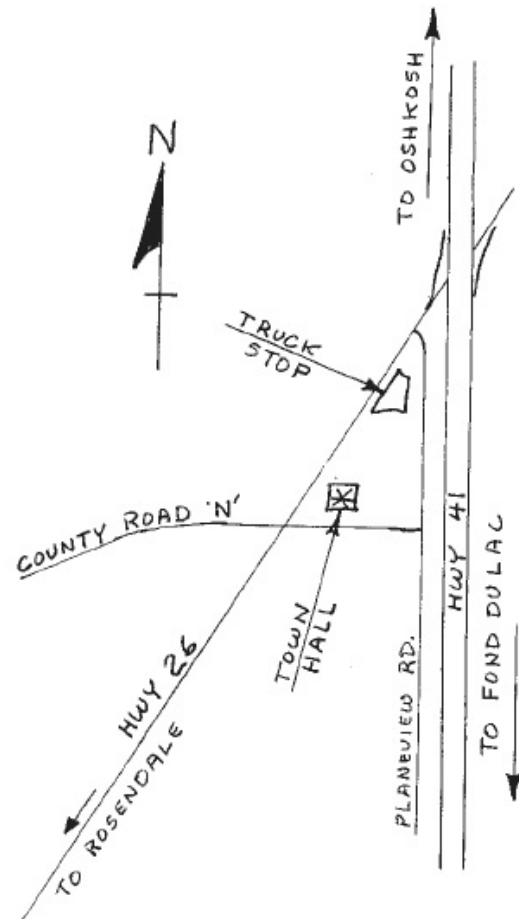

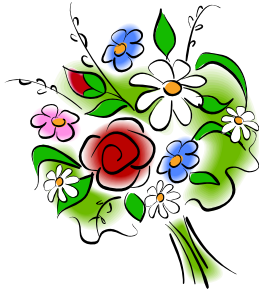

# Era Fashions by Diane Smith

**Galyak: a flat glossy fur made from the pelt of a stillborn lamb or kid.**

# Watch for gas-line cracks

In 2004, I installed a new gas line from the tank to the carburetor on my 1931 Victoria.

All was fine with the gas line until August, when gasoline began dripping alarmingly from the bottom of the carburetor while in a parking lot a mile from home.

Unlike most Model A's, my car is a late 1931 with an "indent" in the firewall. The car's gas line and shut-off valve are completely on the engine side of the firewall, and the indent in the firewall is simply a fist-sized recess for the shut-off valve. There is no shut-off valve under the dash on the passenger side of these late 1931 cars.

The first step when discovering a leak is to shut off the gas valve. Follow that up with an inspection of the area, and try the easiest repairs first.

Several years ago my carburetor float had stuck, causing gas to seep from the carburetor. A few light taps on the bowl of the carburetor with the end of a wrench can loosen a stuck float. It worked then, but tapping didn't help this time.

From observation, the gas seemed to be coming from the connection between the carburetor and the steel gas line. Using a ½-inch open-end wrench from my tool bag, I took a second step to repair my car and tightened the nut. But when I re-opened the shut-off valve, gasoline still leaked. I tighten the nut a bit more, but the leak continued.

Once I got home I took a third step and removed the gas line. In my effort to tighten the line to stop the leak, I had damaged the compression fitting between the gas line and the carburetor.

The fitting is a common ¼-inch piece available in the plumbing aisle at most hardware stores.

I reassembled the gas line with a new compression fitting in place. However, gasoline still leaked.

By now it was getting dark and I was getting frustrated, so with the valve turned off I called it a night.

In the morning, after exhausting the easy repair steps, I took a fourth step and removed the carburetor to examine the float and look for anything unusual inside the carburetor. All looked good, so I reassembled the carburetor, replacing gaskets as needed.

Then, I took a fifth step and re-examined the gas line, with the intent of replacing the line. Thinking logically, if the problem wasn't with the carburetor, it had to be with the gas line where it connected to the carburetor. Taking the line outside in sunlight, I looked at it closely, and realized what had looked like a mark made by the compression nut was actually a hairline crack.

Problem solved!

Vibration over time probably caused the crack. I had saved my old gas line, so with two new compression fittings I made a new connection. No more leaking.

When you are inspecting your car for a trip, add an examination of your gas line and fittings to the list, and always make sure your shut-off valve fully works, just in case. – Neil Besouloff, technical meet chairman
