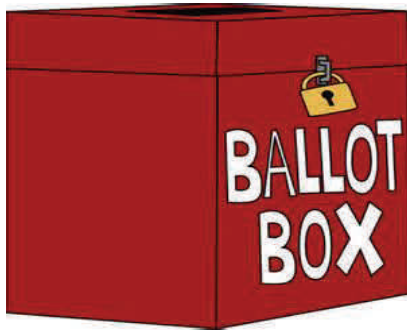




WHEREAS, the state of Wisconsin is proud that many of these A's were assembled, sold and driven in Wisconsin; and



Board Members Present: Dave Boucher, Mike Clinin, Dave Huenink, Paul Piotrowski, Steve Lewis, Mike Yokofich, Neil Besougloff

Dave Boucher called the meeting to order at 1:30 p.m. with pledge of allegiance.

President – Dave B. – Dave thanked everyone for coming and asked if there were any new members. Dave also talked about the history behind the Pledge of Allegiance and then read Red Skelton's 1969 presentation of the Pledge of Allegiance. His presentation explained the meaning of the words or phrases. Stan Larson talked about the Stars and Stripes Honor Flight he recently went on. It was a very emotional presentation. MAFFI sent us an offer to have three people sign up for a membership and then offer, through a drawing, one of the three a free brick at the Gilmore Museum. This will be run through our club. Also, our club is no longer involved in accessories and our remaining inventory will be sold at a reduced cost at today's indoor meeting. Going forward club members will order accessories through Times Printing.

Vice President/New Membership/National Correspondent and Sunshine – Steve L – There are no new members this month nor any Sunshine to report. The new printing company who is printing "Wheeling the A" is doing a better job at the same cost as the previous printer.

Secretary – Dave H. – There are no corrections or changes to the minutes from the March 10, 2013 general meeting. A motion was made by Mike Yokofich and seconded by Pete Stauber to accept the minutes as written. Twenty members have renewed their membership as of this meeting. We have two 266 members in the club. The renewal notice in "Wheeling the A" was discussed, members have until the end of January to renew their membership.

Treasurer – Paul – A report of the revenue and expenses from last month were given. There we no bills or income turned in.

Outdoor – Mike C – The dates for the 2014 events have been determined and the sign-up sheet is available at today's meeting. Two events already have hosts. Dave B. also stressed the need for new board members for the upcoming elections otherwise several positions will be eliminated including the outdoor position. It will become a volunteer position outside of the board of directors. If no one steps up to volunteer then the outdoor position will be eliminated resulting in reduced or no outdoor events in 2014.

Indoor – Mike Y. – Today's pizza party is hosted by Pete Stauber. Mike Y. reviewed the upcoming indoor events through March. Dave H. talked about our annual banquet which is January 18th, 2014 at Meyer's restaurant. Four couples have signed up thus far.

Technical / Awards – Neil B. – Neil gave the dates and topic for the upcoming technical seminars at Model A Mail Truck. He encouraged members to attend.

Old Business - One hundred and forty five spots are sold for the swap meet. Swap meet fliers are available to the membership to pass out to drive up attendance. Also a sign-up sheet was passed around for the membership to sign up and work at the swap meet. The club that owns the WI Rapids reunion location had asked for a donation to assist them in the installation of some concrete. We sent them \$400. Karry and Mike Kultgen gave an update on the WI Rapids reunion and promoted the event. The suggestion was given to the membership to make your reservations early as the hotels get booked fast.

Winter tech meets start with a bare frame

Our technical meet season started on Oct. 17 from the beginning – a bare Model A frame.

Club member Roger Olsen is leading a team effort to build a running Model A chassis from the frame up. Starting with a cleaned up and freshly painted frame, the group used a steel rule and diagonal measurements to check that the frame rails were straight and the entire frame was square. Roger noted that the frame at this point would easily flex since it lacked axles, a brake cross shaft and other pieces, let alone a body.

First the group installed the brake cross shaft, including a set of brackets and bushings that needed to be “massaged” to fit the diameter of the shaft. It was also a bit of a struggle to install the pins that hold the shaft in place.

The group then took apart the assembled front and rear leaf springs to install anti-squeak liners between the leaves. The liner material, which comes in a roll, is made of a rubbery, vinyl-like material. Strips were cut to the length of each leaf and a hole was punched through the material for the center bolt before each strip was placed between the leaves. Then the leaves were reassembled into complete front and rear springs.

While the liner procedure isn't difficult, it takes time. Club members used large C-clamps to hold to the leaves together while re-installing the center bolts.

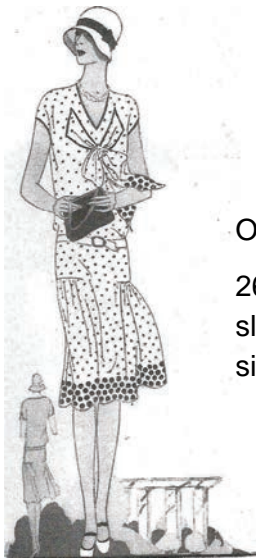

One Way to Use A Bordered Print

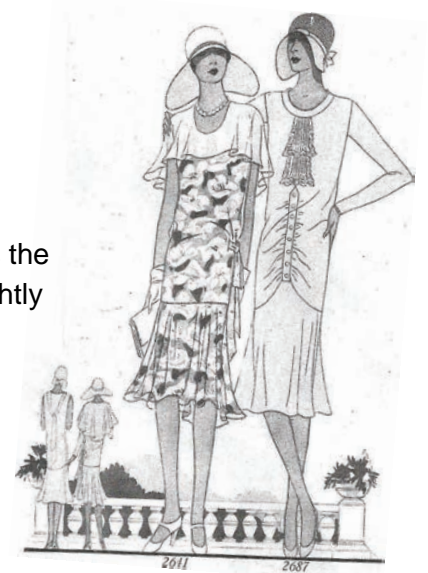

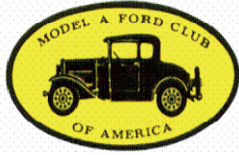
