We will use the West Pavilion and East Expo Center where each aisle vending space will be approximately 11' X 9' and is \$40. Wall spaces may vary in size depending on location in either building and are \$45.

We have space available for car clubs to help promote their special interest to the public. Clubs may use these spaces to sell their club merchandise and/or hand out club literature, spot not to be used for selling car parts. Those spaces are \$30 and are approximately 3' X 11" and include one free table (no credit given if table not used) and admittance for two people.

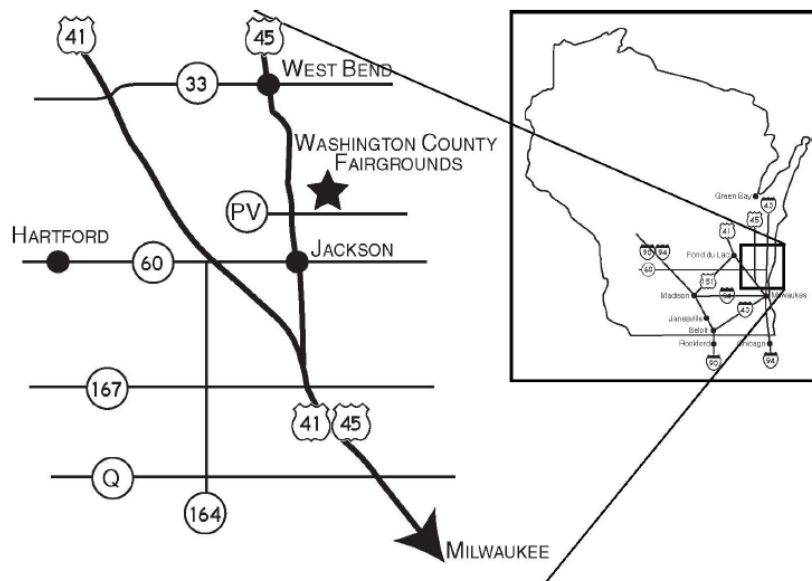
4.) **The event is advertised from 8:00 am till 2:00 pm. It is expected that all vendors will sell their wares until 2:00 pm.**

5.) Vendors **MUST** vacate building by 4:00 p.m.

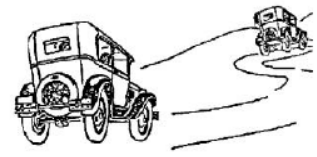
All other spaces will be available until we are sold out.

'A' Trip Back to December 1980



December 1980. What were you doing then? Difficult to remember 38 years ago, isn't it. Perhaps these events will jog your memory. The New Orleans Saints ended their 14 game losing streak, beating the NY Jets 21-20. Apple made its initial public offering on the US stock market. (28 years later it became the first US company valued at over \$1 trillion.) On December 8th, John Lennon was shot and killed. Magnum PI starring Tom Selleck premiered. And our President-Elect was Ronald Regan.

In December 1980, our Club was motoring along much as it is today. Volume XXVI#12, Circ 394, reported some fun times, a call to fill positions on the board, and plans for the upcoming awards banquet in January.

The "Wheelin' the A" reported on the October 25th Halloween Ghost Gallop. It was held on a Saturday night and started at Mayfair Shopping Center. Members dressed in costume and tour directions were handed out and cars went on their bewitching route. Questions were to be answered as they wound through the NW side of the city, including the Washington Highlands and a cemetery. This required members to leave their cars periodically to get answers to the questions. This is how the story was told.

"Anytime you are walking through a cemetery at night, in the dark, looking for someone who is dead, your nerves have got to be a little on edge. A little frightening experience that evening happened to the Rozmans. They were walking through that dark cemetery, with good friend Tim Janowski, looking for the name of one of its horizontal residents. It was VERY dark, quiet, cold, and since fall had arrived the ground was covered with a blanket of leaves. They were walking between gravestones when suddenly something or someone jumped out of one of the graves causing leaves to flutter into the air. Well, after jumping out of their skin and practically dying themselves, they finally realized what happened. Evidently Tim had stepped on the bend end of a large branch, which caused the other end to pop up, which caused leaves to fly which caused them to get the heck out of there -- FAST!" The evening ended at the Bluemound Bowl with food, drink, and prizes for costumes. Dave Rozman won second prize. Wonder what he was dressed as!



November 9th was their Ice Cream Social. Soda jerks and "sassy" waitresses decked out in red and white striped vests and straw hats served up banana splits. Entertainment included a Barber Shop Quartet and Brett Bartel on his banjo. The event was planned by the Wussows.

The mechanical tip was written by Paul Moller and he went into a 2-page article on rebuilding the ignition distributor. Guys (or gals), if you are interested, let me know and I'll see that you get the article. Carol Mazurkiewicz told the membership about a folk custom in England in the 1700's. Evidently on the Twelfth Day of Christmas (Epiphany) a Twelfth Night Cake was baked and served to gathered friends and relatives. It was baked with fruit and contained a bean and a pea hidden in its layers. Whoever got the bean in their slice was considered the king of the party and the person with the pea became the queen. (How did they know a guy would get the bean and a woman the pea? Or maybe that didn't matter!) The cake was served with lots of wassail to make the festivity even more festive!



The upcoming banquet was to be at Mannings Restaurant on 76th Street. There was a choice of Filet Mignon, Seafood combination, and Rock Cornish Hen. \$12 each.

The Club Historian was Judy Kusnier who reported that in December 1965 there was no Christmas party, but Ron Ackerman provided a film. In 1970 the Christmas Party was held at Hubbard Lodge. And in 1975 the party was held at St. Aloysious Hall and Santa came.



A New Year's wish printed in the December 1980 newsletter: On New year's Eve place a loaf of bread, a silver dollar, and some salt on the table and you will have bread, money, and good luck throughout the coming year.

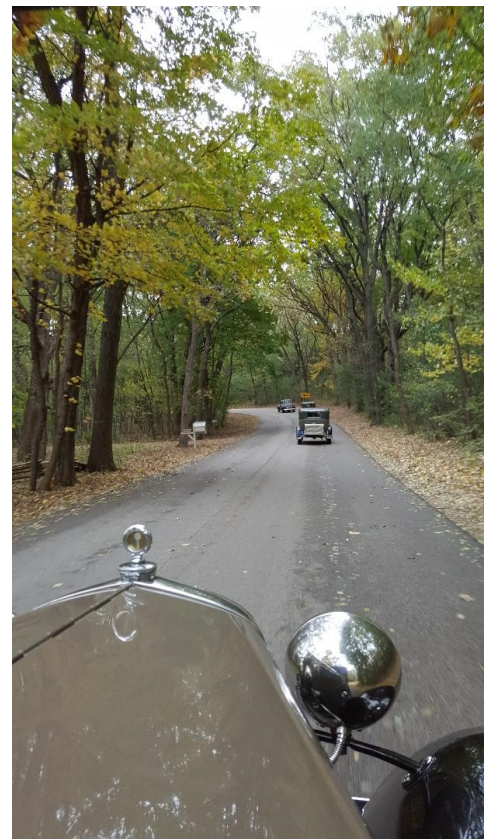

The luggage from the top of the stage coach was unloaded on to the second-floor balcony because the stage coach was the same height as the balcony which made it easy to unload. Also, some of the guests bartered for their room fees, making chairs and possibly other items in exchange of what they owed. The building was going to be destroyed in the 1960's but a group of volunteers saved it from destruction, moving the building to its present location and restored to its original state.

From there, we took a driving tour through St. Johns Military Academy and saw some of the very beautiful old buildings. Our last stop was Lapham Peak Park where we enjoyed apple cider and sugared, apple cider donuts. Although the temperature had dropped and the wind picked up prior to us arriving, some members did climb the observation tower and enjoyed the sights.



We want to thank everyone for coming and appreciated the great turn out and fellowship. We hope the directions were clear and had interesting landmarks pointed out and good tips. We hope everyone saw the big smile on the Eagle Water tower and smiled back. 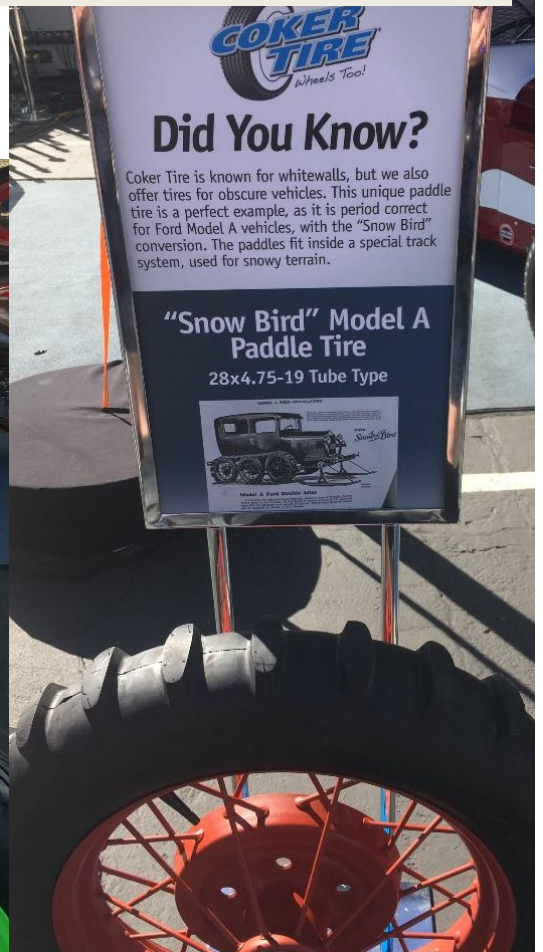

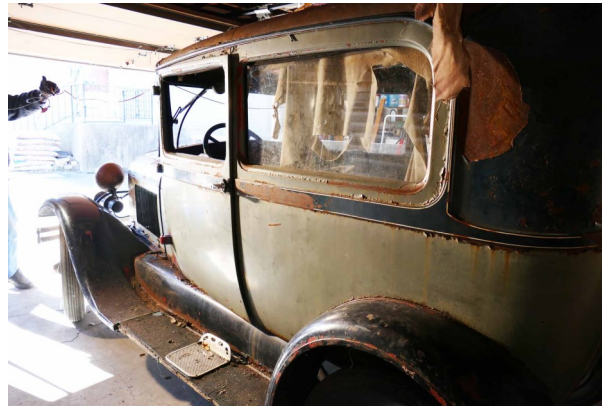

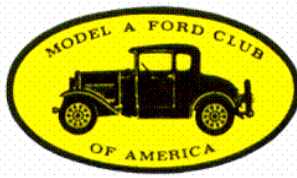
