Eagle River Weekend Get-A-Way

New Updated Info-Can't miss event!!

Thursday, July 30 - Monday, August 3, 2020

Tour Group from Milwaukee area will be led by Dennis and Anne Wacker Tour Hosts in Eagle River are Carl and Charlene Wussow

This is truly a "can't miss" event. The ride will be long but so worth it. We are leaving on Thursday and heading back Monday to avoid the heavier weekend traffic and to allow a more leisurely route.

We have 15 confirmed rooms held at the **Eagle River Inn**, Eagle River, Wisconsin. It is a beautiful setting on Watersmeet Lake where the Eagle River and the Wisconsin River join on their journey to the Mississippi River. The complex is located on Hwy.70 West, just about a mile from the City of Eagle River. The parking lot is secure and away from other locations that would have had lots of traffic. Breakfast is included. Some items include: hot waffles, breakfast sandwiches, hard boiled eggs, oatmeal, Danish, cereal, coffee and other items.

Room Rates on the parking lot side, 2 queen beds, fridge and micro is on special for us at \$107.10 and a lakeside room, with patio doors opening directly to the water complex are \$125.10. None of the other hotels have settings like this one and others are in more crowded areas with much more vehicle and pedestrian traffic.

Hotel registration can be made by each family by calling the **Eagle River Inn: 715-479-2000**. They will need to identify themselves as part of the group from the <u>Wisconsin Chapter</u>, <u>Model A Ford Club</u> to get those special rates. I suggest that you make initial contact with the Eagle River Inn not much later than January as summer reservations will be increasing after that time. Early is always better than late!

Details are still being finalized for the weekend, but so far we will plan a Friday late-morning Pirates Hideaway cruise (Pirate attire is encouraged) and a Fish fry at Chef Rene's_award winning restaurant at the Eagle River Inn (all you can eat for \$14) and they have a bar lounge adjacent to the restaurant.

Saturday is our weekend headliner event - <u>Three Lakes Petroleum Museum Car Show</u>: Arrive by 9:00 a.m. or before. The show is from 10:00 a.m. to 200 p.m. with awards following. The museum is free and open all day. Food is available on the grounds and each car registered early will receive a coupon for 1 sandwich (hamburger, cheeseburger, bratwurst or hotdog, chips, soda and popcorn. Over 250 vehicles will be on display.

The Three Lakes Winery is only 2 miles away from the car show and the wine selection is outstanding along with a related "wine related" gift shop.

Saturday night event will be movie and pizza night. We will be showing Public Enemies. It was filmed at Little Bohemia just a few years ago and starred Johnny Depp. It is accurate, exciting and will be an opportunity to prime us for our dinner at Little Bohemia the following night.

Sunday the group will depart the hotel at 1:30 for a drive through the beautiful forests in the area. We will stop at the Dillinger Museum for a tour and then enjoy dinner at Little Bohemia at 5:00 p.m. Since it has never been restored after the FBI and Dillinger gun battle, our cars will be a highlight for photographs in front of the main building. We will return the hotel before dark.

We will use the West Pavilion and East Expo Center where each aisle vending space will be approximately 11' X 9' and is \$40. Wall spaces may vary in size depending on location in either building and are \$45.

We have space available for car clubs to help promote their special interest to the public. Clubs may use these spaces to sell their club merchandise and/or hand out club literature, <u>spot not to be used for selling car parts</u>. Those spaces are \$30 and are approximately 3' X 11" and include one free table (no credit given if table not used) and admittance for two people.

1.) Returning vendors will have the option to occupy the same space(s) they did in 2019, however your payment and completed application **must be returned us by November 7, 2019** to insure your same space(s).

2.) After November 7, 2019 any available spaces will be sold on a first come first serve basis. We will honor your space requests as best as we can, however, <u>WE DO RESERVE THE RIGHT TO AS-SIGN VENDOR LOCATION. WE ALSO RESERVE THE RIGHT TO DECLINE TO SELL SPACES TO PAST "NO SHOW" VENDORS.</u>

3.) Maximum number of spaces for a vendor is limited to 6, to help ensure a more diverse selection of swap merchandise. Each space rental includes 2 free admission wrist bands.


4.) <u>The event is advertised from 8:00 am till 2:00 pm. It is expected that all vendors will sell their wares until 1:00 pm.</u>

- Report immediately any driving accidents to the Club President and the Outdoor Chairperson.

Indoor Events:

✓ Assist Indoor Chairperson with setup/cleanup of your event.

New members included: Lafe & Maureen Nelson, '28 Tudor; Mark & Barb Miller, '30 Town Sedan; Jim Theel, '30 Town Sedan.

Congratulations and best wishes were extended to Wallace and Jan Klager on achieving 50 years of marriage. They were married on November 26, 1949.




