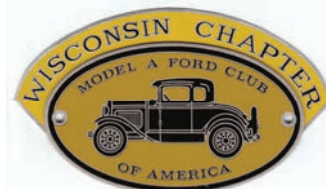
**New Business** – The club is looking for a web master and someone to run the technical seminars. A further discussion was held how the club could get more board members.

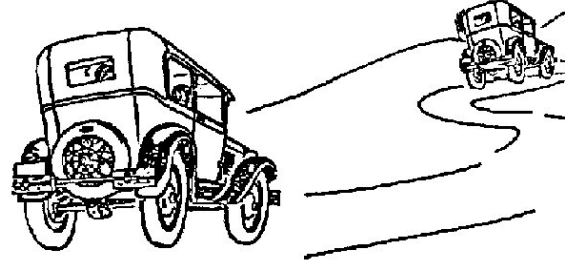

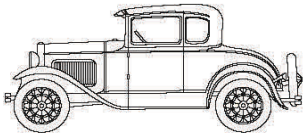
