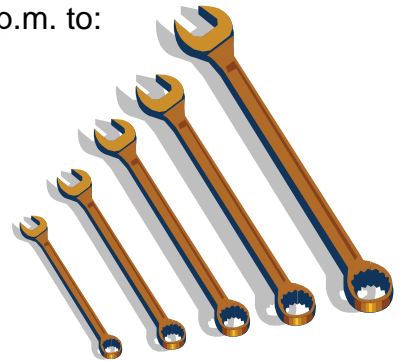

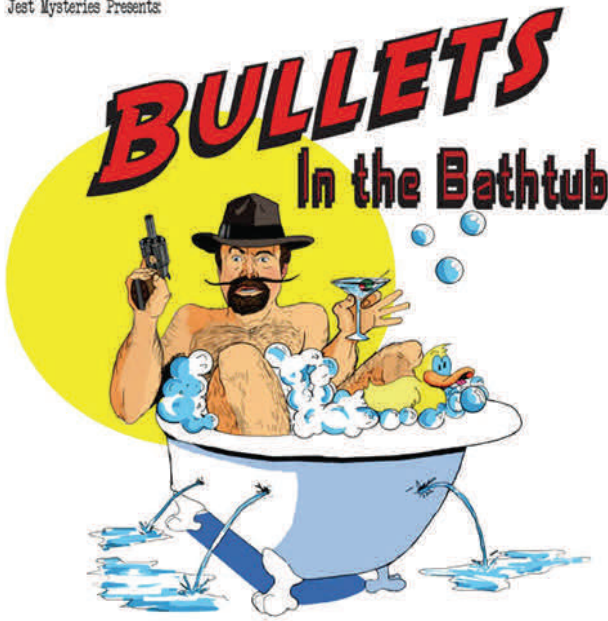

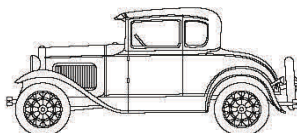

Since we had only two people step forward for the board we will not have an election in January at our custard social, just some great custard and toppings from Leons, thanks to the Schneider's.

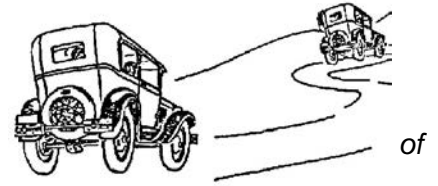

The Wisconsin Chapter has rented out a barn just outside of Sussex. Vehicles will be stored in the upper level of the barn. It has a 2" thick floor supported by a joist structure on 10" centers. The exterior is steel with no windows in the upper level and a keyed electric door. Rent is \$30/month for cars, \$15 for motorcycles, with a six month minimum.

The ladies pages, by Burdella Miller, included recipes for 'Steak and Mushroom Kabobs', 'Strawberry Meringue Tort', and 'Grilled Parmesan Toast'. The 'red dot' marks the lightest side of the tire and when placed adjacent to the valve, the weight of the valve stem is equalized and the wheel is balanced, reducing vibration and wobble. The 'red line' around the tire shows when the bead of the tire is seated evenly all the way around the rim.

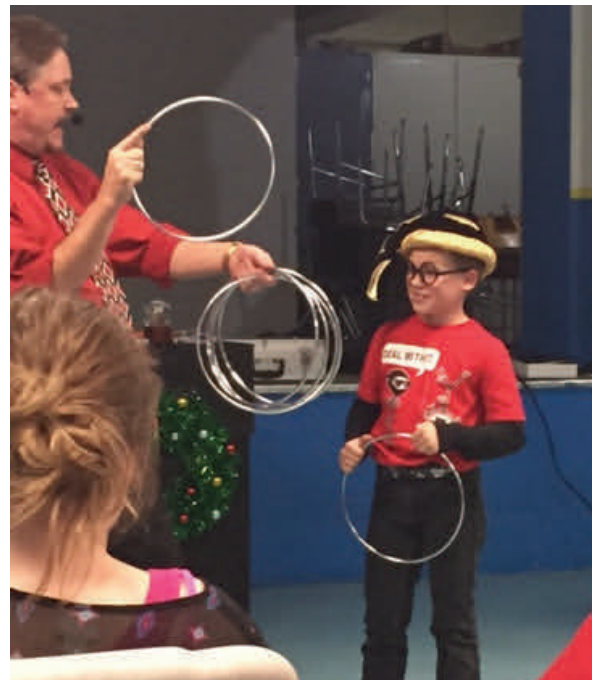

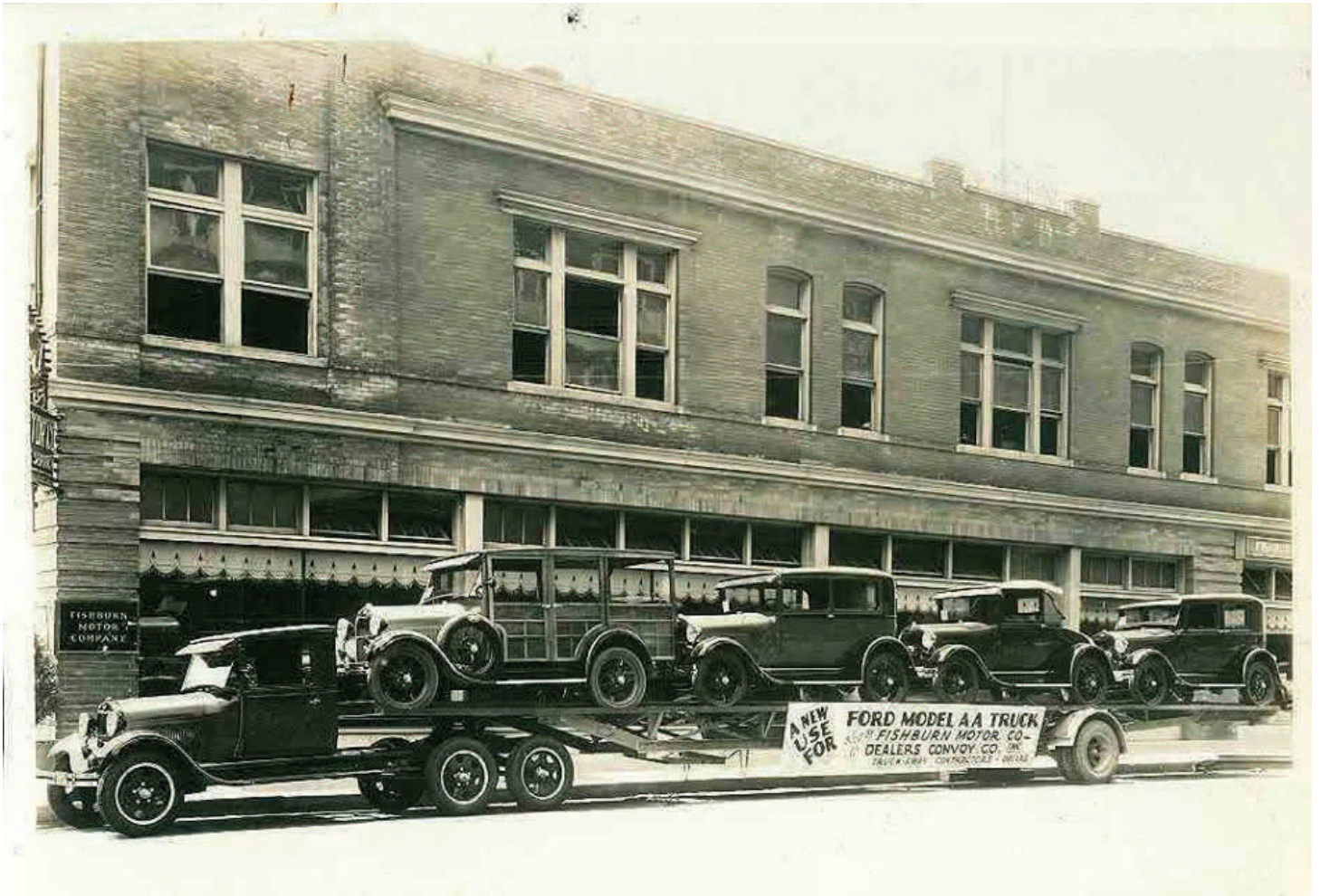

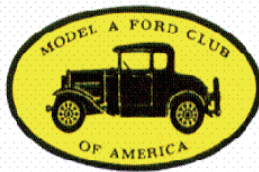
