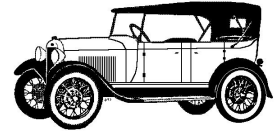

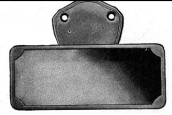

Model A Club Rolls into Town

Model A cars with gleaming chrome, mirror-finish paint jobs and proud owners lined River Park Drive in downtown Guttenberg Sunday morning, May 27, as the Wisconsin Chapter Model A Club stopped for brunch at the Café Mississippi.

The weekend jaunt for the 24 Model A's in the caravan began in the Milwaukee area, where most of the members reside. They spent Saturday evening in Platteville, and rose for an early start Sunday morning to take the Cassville ferry to Turkey River Landing near Millville. They then headed north on the short scenic drive to Guttenberg.

Peter Stauber of Glendale, Wis., and Mary Ciocarelli of West Bend, Wis., were among those enjoying the sunny Sunday on the banks of the Mississippi.

"These cars were made in 1928 to 1931," he said. "These are original cars — not hot rods." He was at the wheel of a spiffy maroon 1931 Model A.

The cost of gasoline has risen considerably since the days of the Model A when drivers could fill up for 20 cents a gallon. Stauber noted that his vehicle averages 15 mpg.

Club tours such as this Memorial Day drive have been a tradition for many years. "We've been at this for 25 years," he said. Some club members planned to begin the return journey home after eating in Guttenberg while others were going to take a longer tour.

BIG DAY IN SMALL TOWN USA.



Waubeka, in Ozaukee County is the Birth Place of FLAG DAY. The father of Flag Day, was Bernard Cigrand, a teacher at Stony Hill school that promoted a date of June 14th as a National Flag Day. In June of 1885 he held the first observance for Flag Day, and thirty one years later in 1916 President Woodrow Wilson issued a proclamation setting June 14 as Flag Day.

Waubeka, is a small community that may double or triple it's population of 2,200 as the FLAG DAY Parade and the Music starts.
