





# Guidelines for Submitting Articles To Wheeling the "A"

Any member can submit articles for publication in the Wheeling the "A"

- 1. Articles must be automotive related or related to an event or person in the car hobby.
- 2. Articles should not exceed one page unless approved by the editor and/or Board of Directors.
- 3. In an attempt to include all classified ads received, ads should be limited to six lines and auto related unless space permits. They will be included on a first come first serve basis.
- 4. Letters to the editor will be used only if signed by the author. Their name can be withheld from the publication if requested.
- 5. Articles for upcoming events need to be submitted to the editor two months prior to the event.
- 6. Follow up articles for club events need to be submitted by the first 15<sup>th</sup> after the event.
- 7. Anyone submitting a drawing for the cover of Wheeling the "A" must notify the editor of your intent two months prior so the cover artist of that month can be notified. The drawing also needs the approval of the editor and/or Board of Directors.
- 8. Technical tip articles are greatly appreciated but should be automotive or Model "A" related.
- 9. General interest items will be used on an as needed and/or space permits basis.
- 10. The editor and/or the Board of Directors has the right to edit or refuse publications that they feel inappropriate.
- 11. Articles submitted for publication must be received by the deadline which is the 15<sup>th</sup> of the month unless otherwise approved by the <u>editor</u>.




# TOW-IN TOOL


Many excellent articles have been published in "How To" books regarding the subject of adjusting the toe-in on our Model "A"s, but when I first attempted to accomplish this task, I found it somewhat difficult to get an accurate measurement with just a tape measure and a chalk mark around the tread. So I set about making an inexpensive, simple tool to do the job. As shown in the accompanying pictures, it is made from a piece of 1" diameter PVC tubing approximately 49" long, a pair of caps for same, and a 1/4-28 bolt and jam nut.



Drill and tap one of the caps to accept the 1/4-28 bolt. Then use a #10 (3/16" dia.) bolt to establish the difference between the lengths of "A" and "B" when adjusting the tie rod.

# LOOKING BACK....IN THE REARVIEW MIRROR

## WISCONSIN CHAPTER, INC. MAFCA TECHNICAL SEMINAR WORKING WITH SHOCKS THURSDAY, JANUARY 15TH

The weather outside was hovering around zero but 23 Model A'ers bravely ventured over to Mail Truck Model A Parts to participate in our shock seminar.

Results from working on the shocks led us to some interesting conclusions as we completed the task. A simple take apart job will not work if you have really bad rusty shocks. Just putting in a new shock kit will not make your old shock work better.

We found lots of sludge that needed to be removed when we were taking apart the shocks. We were able to rebuild, clean and put new seals and packing in the shocks members provided for this seminar.





If you had your shocks on for a long time and they seem to leak a little, it might be good idea to take them apart and put in new seals and fluid. We also found you need to keep each set of shock parts together. The individual parts for some reason do not seem to be interchangeable.

Our Wisconsin Chapter Tool Keeper, Model A Willie, has all the tools you need. You will need a 1-9/16" and/or 41mm socket. We used both tools on the shocks we worked on.

"A Thanks" to all who came out in the bitter cold to learn about Model A shocks.
