For years we have visited every Podunk museum within 200 mile of Milwaukee. It is hard to find a town with an old house, barn or former city hall we have not seen. This year this tour will be in our own back yard. Two new classy museums in Milwaukee.

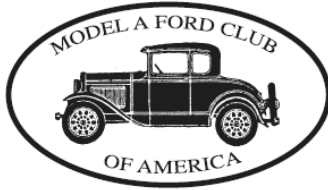

This Model "A" Reunion is the greatest gathering of old Fords and old Ford enthusiasts in Wisconsin. This Reunion started in 1962, and is sponsored by four clubs: Central Wisconsin Chapter MARC/MAFCA, Nickle A Region MARC, Wisconsin Chapter MAFCA, and the Wisconsin Region MARC.

The meet consists of a weekend of enjoying Model A's and Model A fellowship, and includes a Tour around the Rapids area, People's Choice Awards, Car Games, Kids' Games, a Hubley Derby, Chapter Team Events, Rolling Pin Toss, a Dance, Fund-Raising Auctions, Shoe Box Swap Meet, as well as lots of surprises and fun.

The Reunion is held the last full weekend in July, unless it conflicts with a National MARC or MAFCA meet. The Central Wisconsin Chapter MARC/MAFCA hosts the reunion on their private 10-acre site, which includes a clubhouse, wooded campsites, and is close to many nice motels and restaurants.

Location: The clubgrounds are located 4 miles east of Wisconsin Rapids, or 11 miles west of Plover, just south of state Highway 54. Turn south on 72nd Street North (a dead end road). Watch for signs.

Weekend Activities

Refreshments are available throughout the weekend for registered participants.

Good Food: A potluck lunch will be held on Saturday and Sunday. Participants are asked to bring 2 dishes to pass (one for each day). Friday and Saturday evening, you may want to roast hot dogs at your campsite or go out for a relaxed dinner at one of the nearby restaurants with a group of your new friends.

Friday afternoon the registration table opens. An Auction will be held in the evening of Model A related items, as well as other donated items for the kids, ladies, and men. There will also be a corn roast.

Saturday morning starts with a Shoe Box Swap Meet, Technical Seminar. This will be followed by a Ski Race then a noon potluck, and then a driving tour. A Basket Raffle will be held throughout the day, with the drawing that night. There will also be a Slow Drive competition for the Model A's, a Hubley Derby and Kids' Games. A dance will be held at the clubhouse for the evening's entertainment.

Sunday is a day of Car Games, Potluck Lunch, Chapter Team Events, and a Ladies Rolling Pin Toss, followed by the awards presentation and Raffle Drawings.

Primitive campsites are available on the grounds. Camping is open the Wednesday before the meet through the Monday after the meet. The fee per campsite is \$15 for the entire weekend. 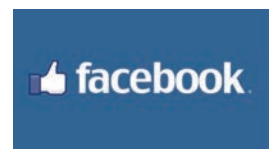

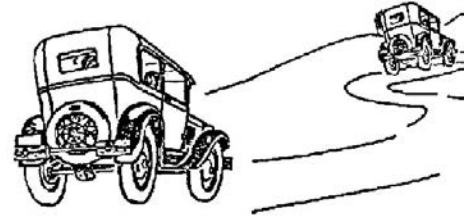
New Business – none

'A' TRIP BACK TO MARCH 1978



So every month without question or waver, Bob writes the historian's article and graciously signs it from the both of us even though I have had nothing to do with it. (What a Guy!) So this month, I thought I should live up to the authorship and contribute a historical article myself.

Our memory trip this month goes back 40 years to March 1978. So to jog your memory of that time, you might recall some insignificant events like a Lunar Eclipse that was only visible in Asia or Australia, or that Charlie Chaplin's coffin and remains were stolen from a Swiss cemetery, or that Hello Dolly! opened at the Lunt-Fontanne Theater in New York for 152 performances. More significantly though, some top records singles of the day included How Deep is Your Love by the Bee Gees, Blue Bayou by Linda Ronstadt, You Light up my Life by Debby Boone, We are the Champions/We will Rock You by Queen, and Don't it Make My Brown Eyes Blue by Crystal Gayle. Remember the Incredible Hulk starring Bill Bixby? It premiered March 10, 1978.

Of course, the Olympics were underway in Ottawa. Ice Skating Pairs was won by the Soviet Union, Ladies Figure Skating Championship was won by East Germany, and the Men's Figure Skating Championship was won by the USA. I'm sure *that* jogged your memory.

The Avenue Brake Shop on 55th and Lisbon was the location of the Technical Seminar. Jim Hannon from MATC came to show the tricks of painting.

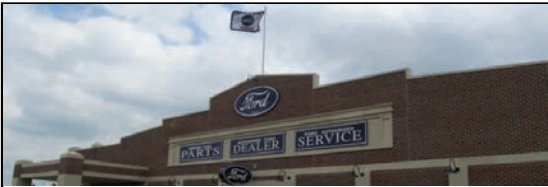

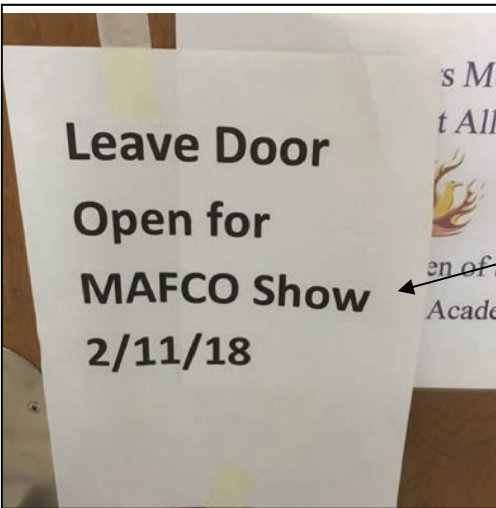
MAFFI MINUTE

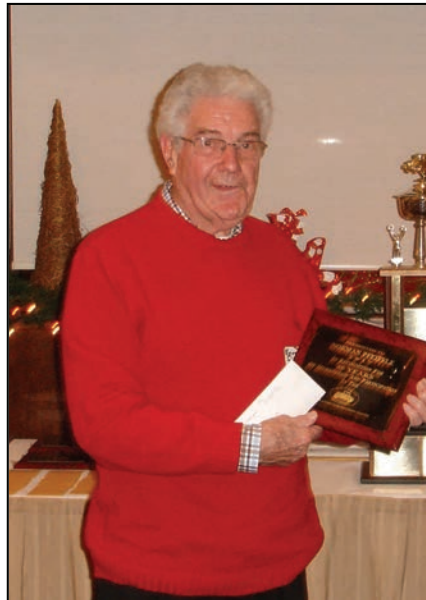

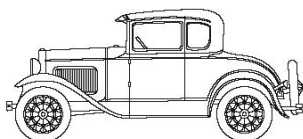
