Board positions available – **now** is the time to start considering where **you** can help on the board!

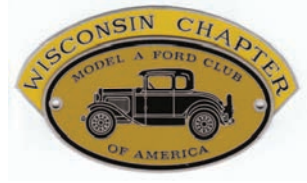

New Business – Jeff Bezotte will not be doing the technical meets at Model A Mail Truck due to his work schedule. The board will see if anyone is willing to replace him.

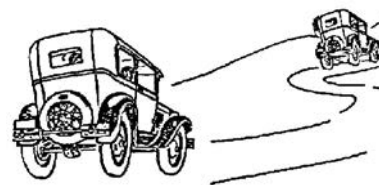
Neil made a motion to adjourn meeting and it was seconded by Randy. The motion was put to a vote and it carried. The meeting was adjourned at 8:05 p.m.

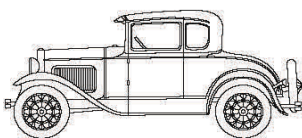

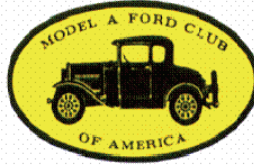
