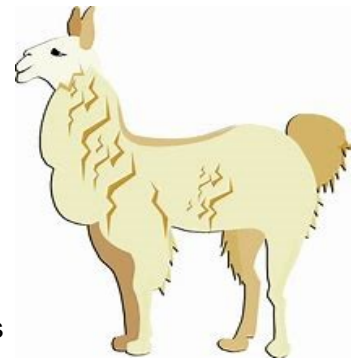

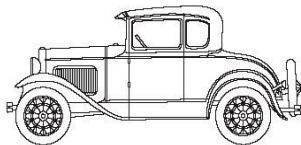

Leave the Milwaukee area for the drive. The route would be planned to enjoy safe and scenic roads. That would result in traveling on highway 45 to highway 8 at Monico and then a short drive of about 25 miles to Rhinelander and the museum. From the museum, it is 18 miles to Eagle River.

There are numerous hotel choices in Eagle River. One would be selected for the group. They include: The Eagle River Inn, Days Inn, Super 8 and Best Western.

A classic Wisconsin fish-fry would be set, with reservations due to busy locations, at a nearby restaurant.

Depart hotel - 9:00 - to Three Lakes (10 mile drive) for car show. Enjoy car show, purchase lunch on show grounds, tour Petroleum Museum, owners judge cars, trophies and awards at 2:00

Depart Three Lakes - 2:30pm for Little Bohemia Restaurant - 56 mile drive.

Arrive 4:15pm - enjoy historic restaurant, Dillinger exhibit, count the bullet holes! Return to hotel

Sunday, August 2

Option 1: 9:30am - brunch at Eagle Waters Resort. The complex includes a 1930's dining room. Depart for Milwaukee -10:30am

Option 2:

Breakfast cruise on pirate ship - 9:00am - private cruise for 1.5 hours (or 1 hour, if desired) on 4 to 7 lakes on the 28 lake Eagle River Chain of Lakes. continental or even catered breakfast. The ship holds 35 guests.

Adult fee: \$20 (coffee with the captain) plus tbd breakfast: box continental or more extensive as selected

Depart for Milwaukee - 10:00am or 10:30am

Option 3:

Breakfast on own.

Depart for Milwaukee - determined by car drivers.

Charlene and I will coordinate all of the driving routes from Rhinelander, Eagle River, Three Lakes, Manitowish Waters and any other routes in the area. I attempted to be over generous with driving times; 7 hrs. from Milwaukee and on up-north routes.

I believe the Sunday pirate ship would be the most unique and most fun for everyone, including children. We can secure the ship, for our private use, if we have 30 or more participants. If participants would like an earlier cruise, it could set to allow an earlier departure on Sunday. We can select from a variety of breakfast options from a "box lunch" type option to a more extensive catered option. Again, that will be determined as the club wishes. All we will need is enough notice to make all preparations.

With daylight driving, the only "dusk" driving may happen on the way back from Little Bohemia Restaurant to Eagle River as sunset is at 7:35 p.m. Twilight ends an hour later. We will not experience any nighttime driving.

GET THE WORD OUT

Every two years since 1994, the Model A Youth Restoration Awards (MAYRA) program gives financial assistance to youth who are restoring a Model A. They must be between ages 12 and less than 22 when the awards are announced. Every applicant who meets the award requirements will receive the same amount. In 2018, nine youth each received \$2,200 in financial support. If you know of a youth who is working on a Model A, please tell him or her about the program. All the details are on the website – www.modelarestorationaward.org. The deadline for filing for a 2020 award is May 31, 2020.

MAYRA's guiding philosophy is that the future of the hobby rests with instilling an interest and love for the Model A in youth. Once that interest takes hold, the youth is more likely to stick with the hobby or rekindle the interest in the hobby at a later point in life. And being successful in the restoration often depends on finances and that is MAYRA helps.

The program requires just two things, youth and donations:

Youth – If you know of someone, please tell them.

Donations – The program is funded with donations from Model A clubs, the national organizations of the MAFCA and the MARC, Model A parts and services vendors, individuals and memorials. We are a 501 (c) 3 educational organization.

A motion was made by Kate and seconded by Jeana to adjourn the meeting at 9:15 p.m. The motion was put to a vote and it carried.

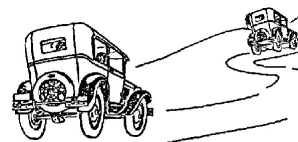

Those were busy times back in October of 1975. On October 4th we attended the Milwaukee County Spartan football game. The Spartans were a member of the Central States Football League and Jerry Manning managed to get us free tickets for those members who participated in the half-time show by bringing their cars out onto the field. The game was held at Nathan Hale High School and the Milwaukee Spartans beat the Sheboygan Redwings in a close game, winning 19-13. The league disbanded in 1975.

Our October board meeting was held at Spellman's and on the 12th we had our Fall Foliage tour. Jerry Tulogieski hosted the event. We met at the Brookfield Square parking lot and 52 model 'A's as well as 16 modern cars had a beautiful country road drive thru Waukesha County and the Kettle Moraine areas. We ended up at the Lakeside Country Club on Pewaukee Lake with beer and soda provided by the club and a grill available for cooking. A few minor car problems were encountered but were quickly remedied through the spirit of co-operation and helpfulness that is the essence of our chapter. Also noted - - - a woman driving a Model A for the whole tour!! Hurray for Marilyn Brojanac!

Excerpts from "Marilyn's rambling" as she wrote in the November 1975 newsletter about her experience driving the 'A' for the tour:

Sunday, 11:45 a.m. (I allowed myself 45 minutes to travel 6 miles). Now let's see, First turn on the gas---check! --- Turn key to on position --- check! --- Shift to neutral – check! --- Step on starter --- check! --- Now the car should start --- Wrong! --- Car doesn't start! --- Now don't panic, think what would Mike do? I know!! Pull that funny little knob on the passenger side of the car! --- Car doesn't start! --- NOW IS THE TIME TO PANIC!!!

Well, I'll try one more thing. I'll step on the starter with all of my might while pulling on the steering wheel until the battery goes dead. If she doesn't start then, we'll take the modern car. That thought must have crossed the "A's" mind too, because she started.

After reaching our destination I let her rest. That's where Mike met up with us. With tears in his eyes, he walked over to us and with outstretched arms he reached for the car! Without even asking me how things went, he grabbed her headlights saying he hopes she didn't suffer too much and he'll make it up to her when she gets back home. However, I had news for him, I was driving home. Smiling through his teeth, he told the "A" he would be behind her all the way home. And believe me, he was!

October 17-19 saw our participation in the Southgate Mall Show, hosted by Carl Wussow. 15 cars had volunteered to participate and the call went out for more volunteers, with an eventual total of 20 cars.

On October 19th we appeared in the Mitchell Center Parade. The call went out for 30 cars as some were needed for various dignitaries and 40 cars showed up! This parade was to mark the end of Phase 1 construction on Mitchell Street.

If that was not enough, October 23rd our men's seminar was hosted at Brojanac's Avenue Brake Shop. Carburetors was the subject and Paul Moller, author of the book "The Model A Carburetor", was there with all of the information. He had a large display of all of the Model 'A' carbs plus many slides and provided the answers to many of our questions.

Our October 1975 Sunshine Report had some good news – Dave and Judy Kusnier reported the birth of Katie Alice on September 25th.

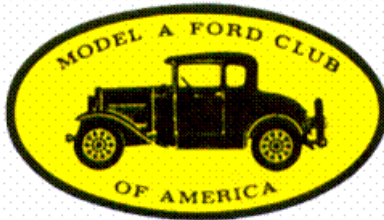
