We will stop for lunch, then visit the White Limestone School that features the evolution of the iron industry in Mayville. Then tour the Wagon and Carriage Shop Museum that includes a carriage shop, a black smith shop, cigar factory and an old fire house. Mayville started as a manufacturing town and still has strong manufacturing base with companies like MEC and Mayville Engineering.

Lunch will be at one of Mayville's finer restaurants, NOLA. NOLA is located in an old ornate hotel which now operates as a B&B with 17 rooms. The hotel has been redecorated yet retains the 18th century charm. Lunch will be a taste of New Orleans including beef or chicken PoBoy, Gumbo, French salad plus a decadent bourbon bread pudding.

The Wagon and Carriage Shop Museum tour will cost \$10.00 per person.

There are also small shops on Main Street that may be of interest.

Our return will feature the Rock River with interesting scenic roads.

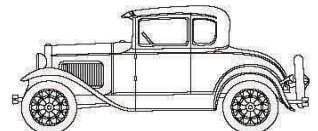

2016 Model A Reunion Planning Meeting

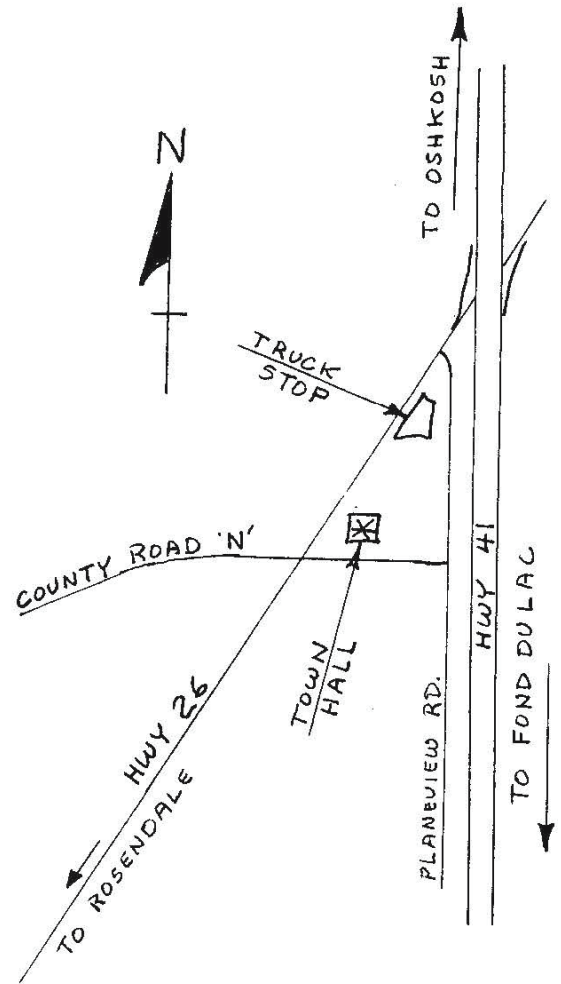

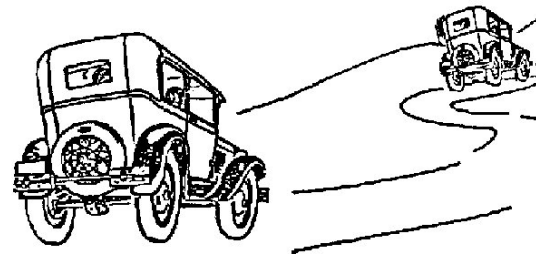
Dave made a motion to adjourn meeting and was seconded by Neil. The motion was put to a vote and it carried. The meeting was adjourned at 8.03 p.m.

Looking Back in the Rearview Mirror

September 13th, 29 people with 11 Model A's, a handful of modern cars and one Russian motorcycle made their way through the country side to Rushing Waters Fishery in Palmyra. The Fishery is located on the edge of the Kettle Moraine Forest so the drive there was spectacular. We arrived and were greeted by our tour host. He shared with us the trout raising process and how the ponds are maintained year round. During the tour we learned they have 50 ponds spread out on 80 acres and produce some 30,000 pounds of trout. The ponds are spring water fed and are a constant 49 degrees year round – even in the middle of winter. The trout start as eggs in the hatchery on site and are mature enough to go to market at 18 months when they reach one pound. All the trout are females and they do not breed these fish. We watched the fish being fed and it was like a feeding frenzy going after the food. The Rozman's took their children fishing and had trout for dinner. They did get them filleted on site. Before leaving Rushing Waters, everyone enjoyed a picnic lunch on the grounds in the beautiful weather.



From Rushing Waters, we headed to The Elegant Farmer in Mukwonago to check out the goodies they were selling. Most of us went home with some tasty items including their famous apple pie baked in a paper bag and several club members enjoyed the fresh caramel apples.



The weather (68 degrees and sunny) made for a great Model A touring day.
