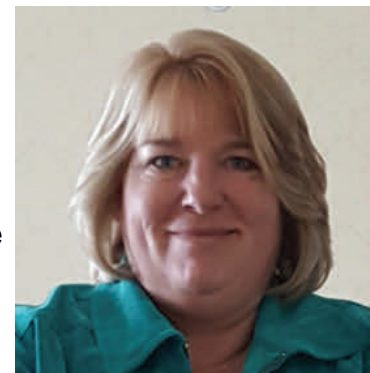

New Berlin Historical Tour

October 15, 2017

Join Linda and Dave Huenink on a tour of the historical buildings at the New Berlin Historical Park at 197th and National Avenue (Hwy ES). This area is known as Prospect Hill. There will be a guided tour and you will have a terrific panoramic view of the surrounding area. There is also a lookout tower which will give us even a better look of the area. The view is truly breath taking. You will also be able to walk across the street to the oldest active orchard in Waukesha County and possibly one of the oldest orchards in the State of Wisconsin – Weston’s Antique Apple Orchard. It was established in 1935 with some of the apple trees dating back to the 19th century. There are several species of apple unique to this orchard which covers 16 acres and has over 700 trees.

From the orchard, we will head west for a tour of the county side, around Vernon Marsh and end up at Pieper’s Porch Winery for a taste of some vino. We will also have a terrific view of the Vernon Marsh. Vernon Wildlife Area consists of 4,655 acres of wetlands, flowages grass land and woodlands. It is the home for migrating and nesting waterfowl, pheasant, small game, turkey and deer.

We will meet at **McDonalds at Moorland and National at 10:30 a.m. and depart at 11:00 a.m.** **Please RSVP to Dave and Linda Huenink as both places need a count.** We will also be bringing some fall food goodies along so we want to make sure we have enough for everyone. 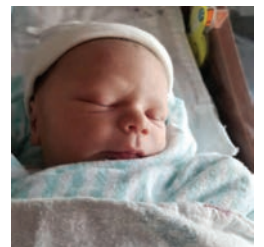


Sunshine Report for August...

2018 Model A Reunion Planning Meeting

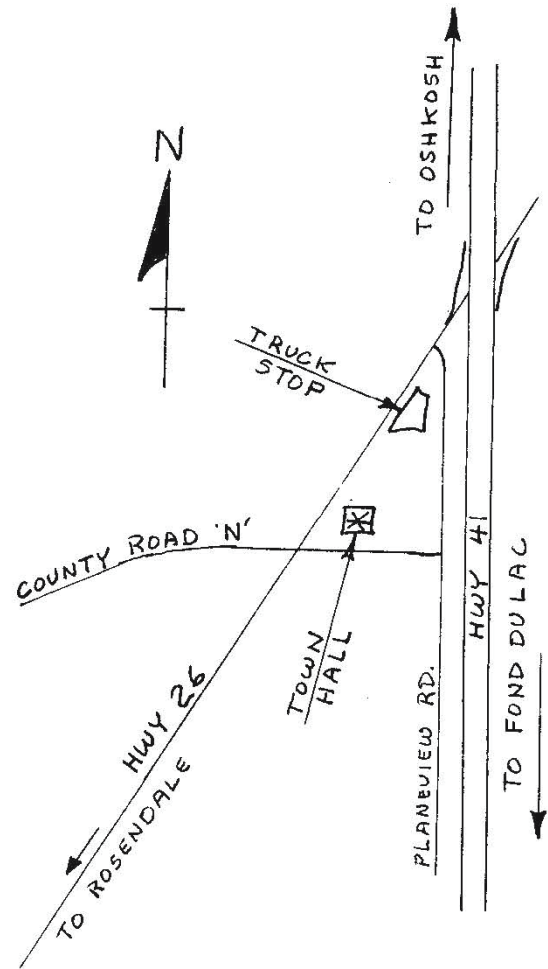

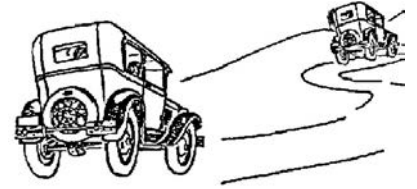

Feb 10 – A show of movies and slides that members have taken of the Lake Geneva 4 Star Meet as well as other various meets and tours resulted in a near record turnout of 50 people. Everyone enjoyed the films as well as refreshments served.

Apr 27 – The spring dance was chaired by Wally Klager and held at the Machinest Memorial Hall. Music by the Dick Parks Trio started at 8:30. A disappointing club turnout of only 14 members out of a membership of 50.

May 19 – Tour of the Holy Hill area followed by a picnic. The route was very scenic and would have been exceptional if this had been a fall tour. We ended at Ron Hegy's house where he had beer and soda on ice. With a fire going in the grill and an ample supply of hotdogs and picnic items that other's had brought, no one went home hungry.

July 14 – Annual club picnic was held at Kettle Moraine Lake. Anita Drake did a super job of running games for thirty children – everyone got a prize. We enjoyed a feast of grilled steak, brats, and hot dogs as well as other picnic goodies. The kids swam and played games while the adults mostly talked. 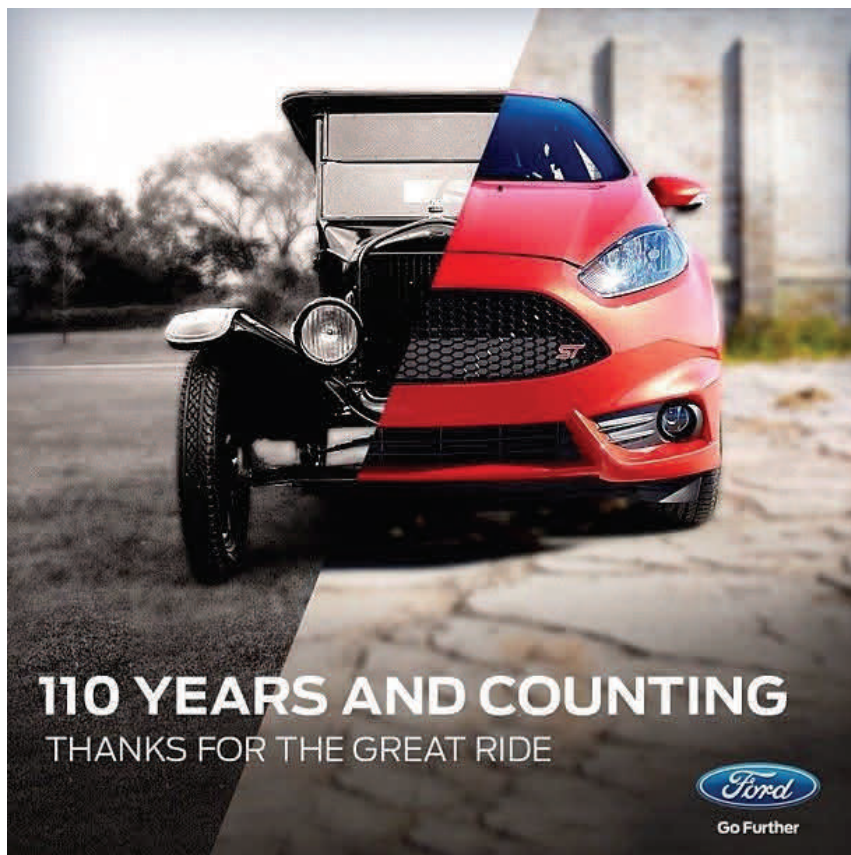
