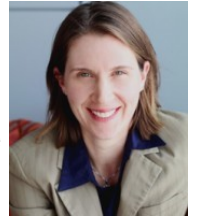

Do any of you just drive your A around for routine things? It's a lot of fun if you haven't!

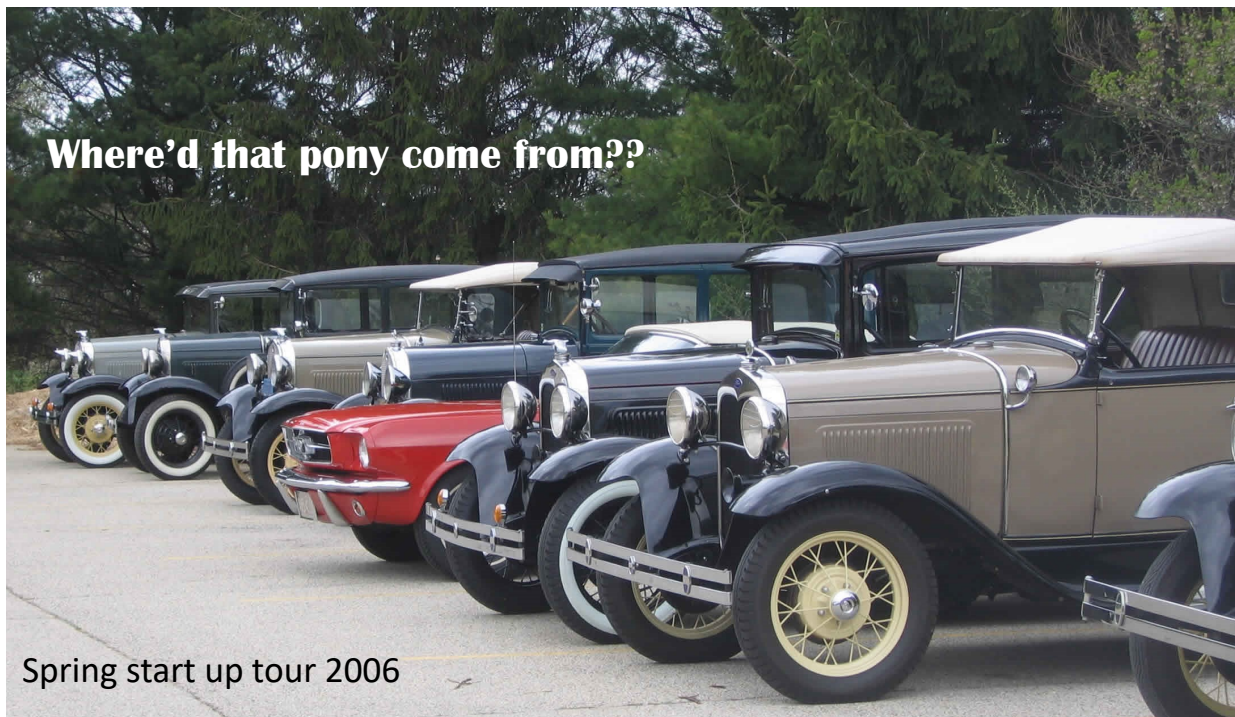
Going into our fall driving season I hope everyone is gearing up for some cooler weather fun! I'm looking forward to the Theresee, my favorite fall tour!

Fermentation Tour

October 11, 2020

We will meet at McDonalds, S71 W23466 National Ave, Big Bend, Wisconsin on **Sunday, October 11, 2020 at 10:00 a.m.** for some breakfast (which will be on your own). We will depart at 10:30 ish and tour the country side as we head to **Brightonwoods Orchard** in Burlington Wisconsin. The orchard was established in 1950 and they have over 4000 dwarf and semi-dwarf fruit trees. They grow many different types of produce such as apples, grapes, quince and pears. Items that can be **fermented** in to alcohol. At the peak of the season they have 40 varieties of apples available. Brightonwoods Orchard has over 200 heirloom apple varieties and the apple selection change's weekly, depending on the ripening and picking schedule. Brightonwoods' emphasis is on preserving existing heirloom varieties and growing standard and newer commercial varieties. Apple cider is also made on site and is available. We'll be able to walk around the orchard, visit the apple barn, and stroll through the wooded trails. They are especially beautiful when the leaves are changing color


A collaborative venture with **AeppelTreow Winery** began in 2001 and they are also on site. We'll be able to stop there also. AeppelTreow Winery & Distillery is a producer of small batch cider, perry and spirits. The winery specializes in apple and pear fruit wines, hard ciders and dessert wines. An on-site distillery allows the winery to also produce special brandies and sorghum whiskey. We will be able to sample up to five samples for free. For instance, something in each style, limit one distilled item. per person, but couples may share if they choose. If you have any questions please contact Dave or Linda Huenink at 262-719-1056.

*There are several **great reasons** why you should attend this indoor meet:*

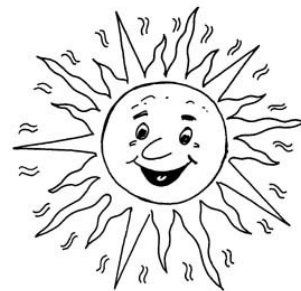

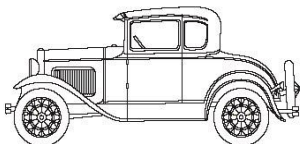

2021 Model A Reunion Planning Meeting

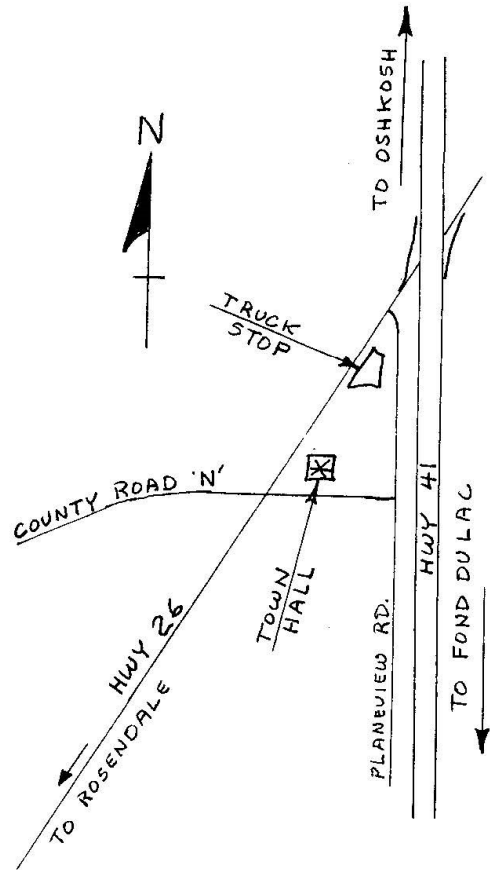

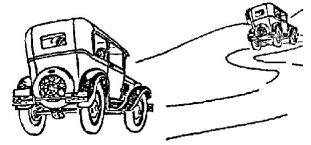

'A' Trip Back to September 2010

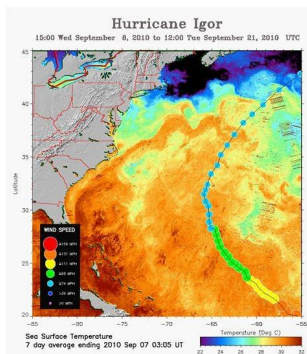


I was hard pressed to find any newsworthy fun-facts for September 2010 to share with you. It seems it was a worldwide slow-news month. That is, unless you can count that Imelda Marcos was ordered by the Philippines court to repay the government \$280,000 for funds taken from the National Food Authority by husband Ferdinand. Or that Lady Gaga and Eminem won the MTV Video Music Awards. Or that *The King's Speech* debuted and won Best Picture.

What seemed to dominate the news in the month of September 2010 was the weather. On September 4th a 7.1 magnitude earthquake struck the south island of New Zealand at 4:35AM causing widespread damage and power outages.

Hurricane Hermine developed on September 5th in the Gulf of Mexico and became a tropical storm in just 21 hours dropping over 7 inches of rain near Austin, and killing eight people as it spawned tornadoes and moved over Texas toward Oklahoma. In Mexico 200,000 residents fled their homes where 500,000 acres of cropland was submerged and destroyed.

Igor developed September 6th off the coast of Africa. By September 12th, wind speeds increased to 150 mph. It then weakened, brushed Bermuda causing structural damage, then moved northward making landfall in Newfoundland, Canada, dumping 8 inches of rain with wind gusts up to 90 mph. Then there was Storm Julia and Karl. Karl made landfall over the Yucatan Peninsula. Karl brought heavy rains to both Mexico and Texas. Fifteen people were killed in Mexico as oil rigs were evacuated and the country's nuclear power facility was shut down.



Several waves of thunderstorms from remnants of Hurricane Georgette and Hurricane Karl produced unusually heavy rainfall in Minnesota and Wisconsin. Record flood stages were recorded in seven Minnesota rivers as well as the Yellow, Black, Trempealeau, and Wisconsin Rivers in Wisconsin. Evacuations resulted in Arcadia and Black River Falls in Wisconsin. As floodwaters moved downstream, high water levels on the Wisconsin River closed major roads in and around Stevens Point.

So while Igor was tormenting the east coast, and Karl was battering Mexico, our Model A club had a hurricane of events. The club toured Miller Park on the 11th with hosts Bob and Kitty Schaefer. The 75 minute tour ended with a tailgate style lunch. Dave and Linda Huenink, along with wonder dog Morgan, toured the AepffelTreow Winery in Burlington on September 19th. Sampling of hard cider, wine, champagne was in order. That tour also ended with a bite to eat. We do like to eat, don't we!


On the 26th, Dave and Donna Boucher hosted a tour of the Midway Village Museum in Rockford, Illinois to see a WWII re-enactment. Over 800 people were involved in the re-enactment that included era military vehicles.

The Thresheree in Richfield was hosted by Art and Sue Blazek on the 18th. This annual event included special guests, Abe and Mary Todd Lincoln as well as a grist mill tour and food and music.

Another storm of events was planned for October with a WE Energies Blue Sky Wind Farm tour, a Halloween party, a Zenith carburetor rebuild during the technical seminar, and our president, Mike Quam, opening nominations for the board of directors.
