

Our group will meet at McDonalds, S71 W23460 National Avenue, Big Bend, at 10:00 a.m. Between 10:15 and 10:30, we will head to the Highland Farm Creamery in Walworth. Be sure to gas up at the Kwik Trip across the street (Corner of National Ave and Hwy 164) prior to leaving for the tour.

Terry Woods, the owner of Highland Farms has done it all. He's taught scuba diving, worked with computers and learned to fly airplanes and helicopters. In 2015, he became a licensed cheesemaker in Wisconsin. Terry and his wife of 43 years, Denise, lived on an old dairy farm for decades but had never milked a cow. So, he decided to buy one and started milking by hand. That was the start of Highfield Farm Creamery, where the couple now runs the state's smallest milking parlor and sells handcrafted curds and cave-aged cheeses. (And yes, they now own more than one cow). They will provide us a private tour of the milking parlor and a view of the cheese making room. The cheese shop will also be open for us to purchase some of their wares, so bring along a cooler with ice in.



From there, we will head to East Troy for some food and delicious custard at Gus's Drive Inn. (Good stuff). For those of you who aren't familiar with Gus's, they have a great car show on Saturday nights. If you have any questions, please feel free to call us at 262-719-1056.

2022 Model A Reunion Planning Meeting

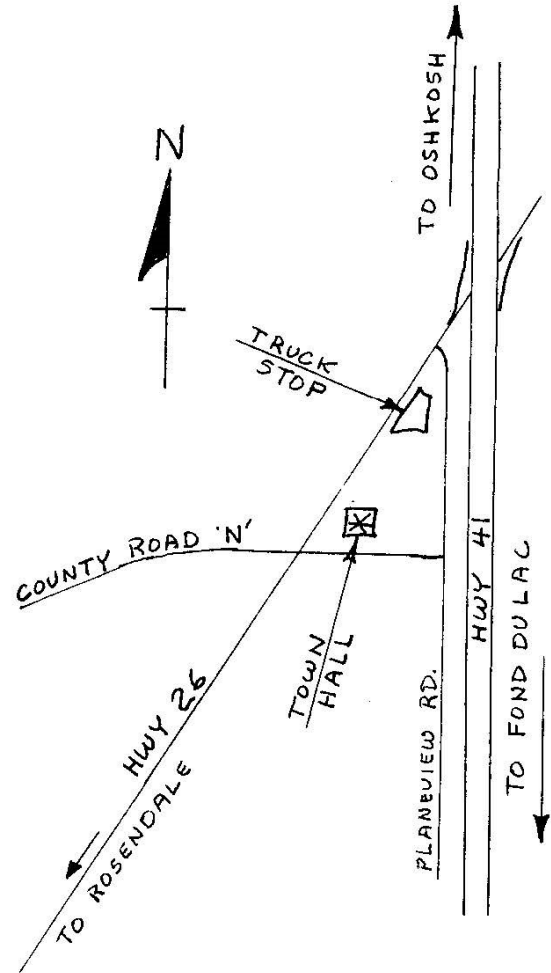

Dip or spoon mixture onto tortilla chips or pita bread and top with sour cream.

A July Tour And A Photo Op Saturday, July 17, 2021

At High Noon on A perfect Saturday in July, eight Model A's and A modern vehicle started on our tour to Kuhtz's General Store.

Due to inadequate parking spaces available at Paradise Springs, we all waved at the Paradise Springs parking lot as we drove by on our way to our first stop at the Octagon House in Watertown. It was A delightful pleasure to drive down smooth open blacktopped country roads without an orange barrel in sight.

The Octagon House is a five-story solid brick construction completed in 1854. The house was designed and built by John Richards and was in the Richards family until 1937. It was sold to the Watertown Historical Society for the sum of \$1.00, with the condition that it would always be used as a public museum. The Octagon House has been open to the public since 1938 with many of its original furnishings still on display in the house.



In 1856 Watertown was known for having the first Kindergarten in the United States. In 1956 the original building was moved from downtown Watertown to the Watertown Historical site.

Winding down country roads unobstructed by orange barrels, we arrived the quaint town of Stone Bank. We pulled in front of Kuhtz's General Store as they did almost a 100 years ago to recreate an original photo reproduced on t-shirts for sale at the store.

We then stepped into the 1926, 4th generation general store for refreshments and pizza to end our day.
