TOUR MILLER PARK

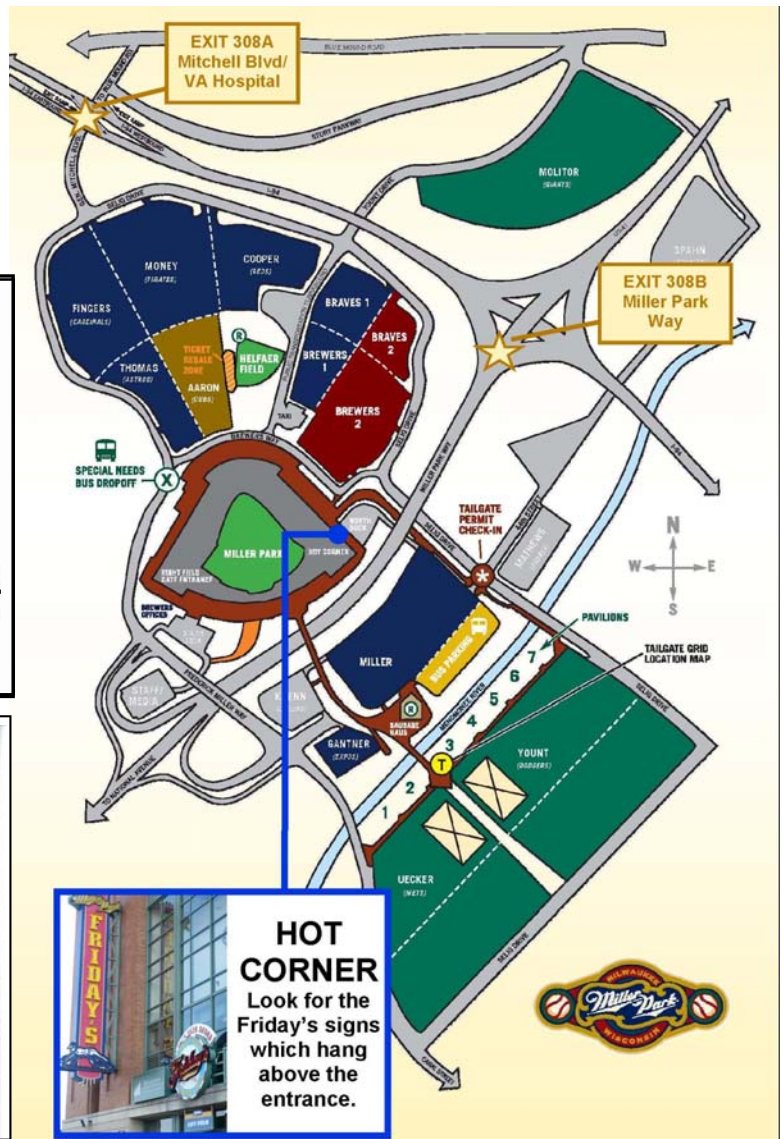

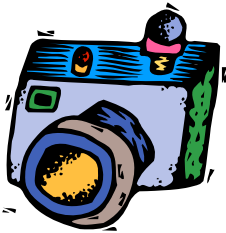
Million Mile Challenge

2011 Model A Reunion Planning Meeting

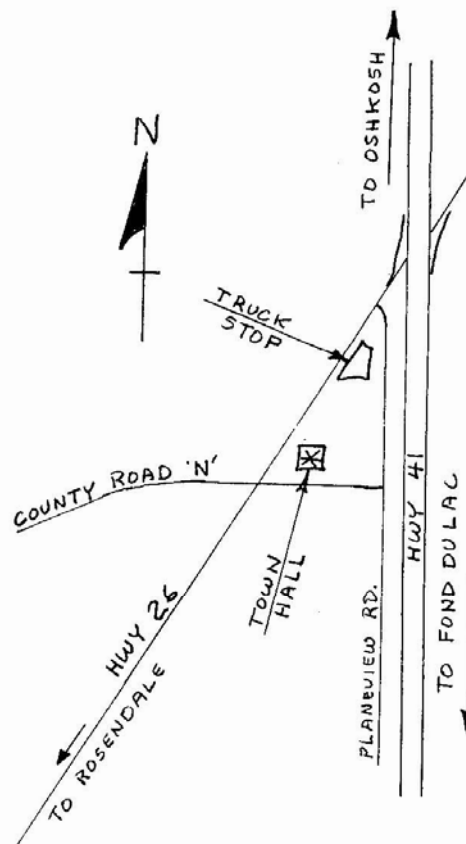

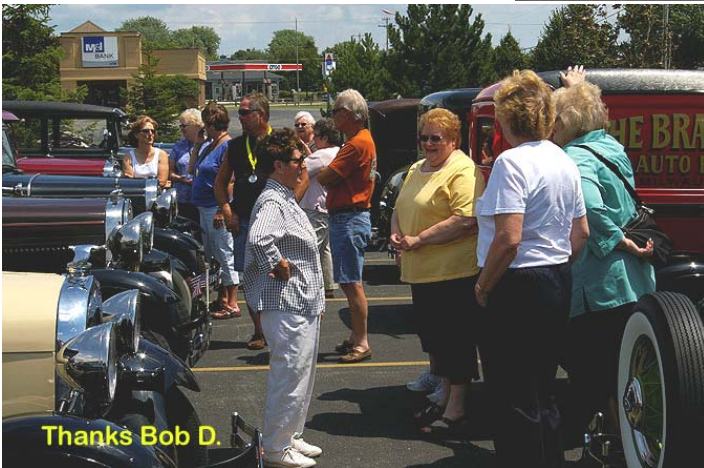
