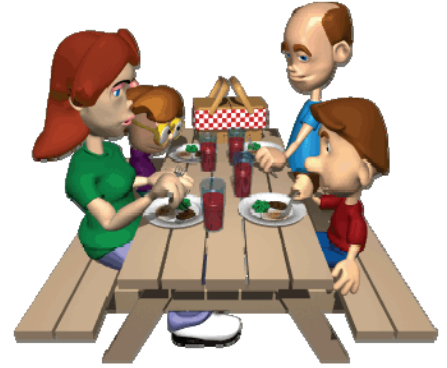

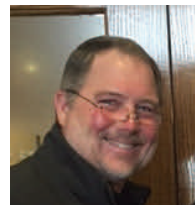

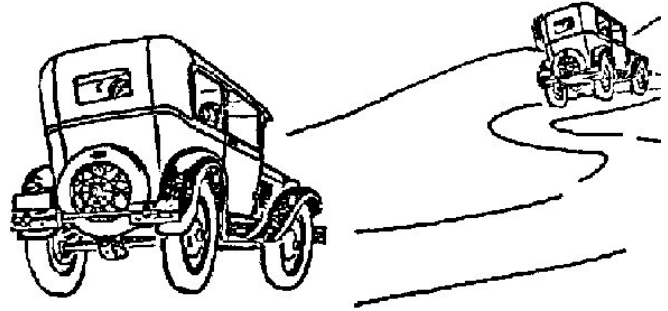

CLOGGED MUFFLERS.....

The purpose of the muffler is to reduce the pressure of the gases by expansion to the point where they will emerge into the atmosphere without noise. This is generally done by providing a number of concentric chambers, each larger than the other. The exhaust gases, in passing through, expand from one to the other until, at the end of the outlet they pass practically noiselessly into the atmosphere.

The muffler, after long service, becomes choked with carbon deposits and considerable back pressure is created. This back pressure is the cause of loss of speed and power in the engine and subsequent overheating. When an engine mysteriously loses power, it is well to look at the muffler. By tapping lightly all over the muffler with a mallet on a piece of wood, the carbon deposits will be loosened and blown out the exhaust.

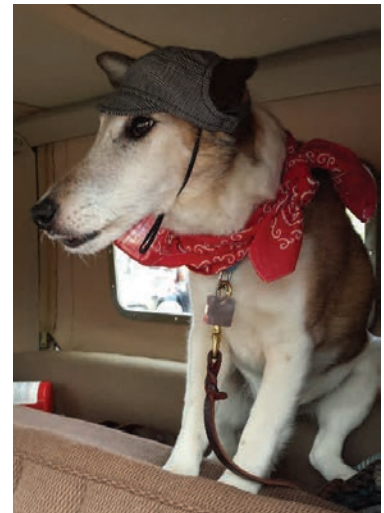
CARS NEEDED
