





Duties include handling our paid ads in Wheeling the "A". The chair person will invoice advertisers and seek out a





#### Lubricate your suspension every 500 miles

Touring season is here and a smart thing to do as we dust winter off our cars is to give the suspension, steering, and other moving parts a complete lubrication. Simply changing motor oil is not enough.

In the book Model A Ford Mechanics Handbook, Vol. 1, written by noted technical expert Les Andrews, he suggests performing basic chassis lubrication every 500 miles, as recommended by Ford when our cars were new. For our club, less than half a season of tours and parades can easily add up to 500 miles.

To lubricate your Model A, you'll need an ordinary grease gun with a special Model A-style grease fitting adaptor, a squirt-tip oil can, and appropriate lubricants. The Model A-style adaptor for a grease gun can be obtained from local Model A parts outlets or through the mail from Model A parts stores.

It is helpful if your grease gun has a flexible hose, since some of the fittings on the suspension are not a direct reach when crawling under your car. Lubricating a chassis can be a messy job, but it needs to be done.

I've followed the suggestions on types of lubricants and frequency in Andrews' book and have had no problems for almost 10 years. *Continued on next page.* 

#### Continued from previous page

Several lubrication charts have been made over the decades, including the one shown with this story. Most have close-up drawings or photos showing the exact positions of the grease fittings and other lubrication points and are very easy to follow.

If you go to this web page:

http://www.fordgarage.com/pages/modelalubrication.htm you can find a lubrication chart. Click on it and

it will enlarge so that it is easily readable.

Andrews suggests greasing the upper and lower front spindle arms, the brake actuator arm, shock links, spring shackles (front and rear), tie-rod ends, drag-link ends, rear-axle bearings, rear-brake actuator arm, the U-joint, the brake and clutch pedal bushing, the emergency brake cross shaft, and the water pump (original style). Nearly all of these locations use grease fittings, and several locations have more than one fitting. Overall there are about 25 grease fittings that will need your attention, but it only takes a few seconds to fill each one.



The U-joint, while hard to reach because it is under the middle of your car, is especially important since it is frequently ignored. It is contained in a relatively large cavity, so you may be putting noticeably more grease in here than in other fittings.

All of this is detailed in Andrews' book.

For all but the water pump I have used ordinary black grease that comes in a cartridge purchased at an auto parts store. I've used "extreme-service" grease, which is sort of a milky color, for the water pump. Instead of using a grease gun for the water pump, I remove the two fittings with a wrench and put grease in the openings with my fingertips to assure that the critical water pump is lubed – not too much, not too little. Then I put the fittings back into place.

At the time of grease lubrication it is also recommended that you oil the accelerator control shaft and the distributor (there's a special opening to receive oil on the side of the distributor). Ordinary motor oil is fine for this. If you have a generator it also will need lubrication, but only every 1,000 miles.

Your horn may also need attention after inactivity all winter. You can use 3-in-1 Oil for this, since you are actually lubricating a fist-sized electric motor (similar to a window-fan motor).

By following a 500-mile lubrication schedule, in addition to regularly changing your motor oil, you will be properly maintaining the moving parts of your car. – *Neil Besougloff, technical meet chairman*






