
Thank you to everybody that has signed up for the upcoming season. We only have a few events left that need a host, so if you are interested contact Gene Taurman.

## Reminiscing with the Historian

From April 1956

CONSTITUTION OF MODEL "A" FORD CLUB

Article 1 NAME, PURPOSE AND EMBLEM

The name of this club shall be MODEL "A" FORD CLUB. The emblem and official seal shall be a facsimile of a 1931 Model "A" DeLuxe Sport Roadster superimposed within the outline of a 1931 "A" instrument panel.

The purpose of this club shall be to promote interest in the preservation of the Model "A" Ford in its original state; and all material pertaining to its history; to provide a source of and exchange of information and related material to same; to provide and regulate events, tours and exhibitions of same, and to own real and personal property incident to such purpose.

Article II MEMBERSHIP AND DUES

All paid members are active members. 1

- Membership shall be open to all persons of good character who 2 display an interest in the purpose of the club. The Board of Directors shall have the right to bestow "Honorary
- 3
- Membership" at their discretion. 4 Dues are paid annually, January 1. Active membership is \$3.00 per year. Members who fail to remit dues before March 1 shall be considered delinquent.

Article III EXPULSION

The Board of Directors shall have summary power by vote of a majority of its members to suspend or expell and terminate the membership of any member for conduct which in its opinion disturbs the order, dignity, business or harmony, or impairs the good name or popularity of the club; or for non-payment of dues, or for any conduct in viola-tion of this Constitution and regulation which may be made from time to time. All Regions shall have the power to expell a member of their own Region by the Regional Officers. The Board of Directors shall also have the power to expell any member, nationally or locally. Any member shall have 60 days in which to present his defense before any action is taken against him. A member can be reinstated only by approval of a majority of the Board of Directors.

Article IV MEETINGS

Meetings of the Board of Directors shall be called by the President or by any three Directors.

Regional meetings shall be determined by the officers of each Region. The Board of Directors shall call any special meetings.

Article V : OFFICERS

The Board of Directors shall consist of nine members as follows:

Article VI DUTIES OF OFFICERS

(Applicable to National and Regional offices where noted.)

BOARD OF DIRECTORS: To govern this organization as provided for in the Constitution.

PRESIDENT: Shall preside at all meetings. He shall appoint all committees; have the power to decide all questions of equal division

and have all the powers and duties usually invested in the President and not covered by the Board of Directors.

VICE-PRESIDENT: Shall serve in the absence of the President.

SECRETARY: Shall record the minutes of all meetings and shall perform all duties normally alloted to an organizational secretary. Regional Secretaries shall report Regional activities monthly to the National Secretary.

MEMBERSHIP SECRETARY: Shall receive and record all applications for membership and turn over all dues received, to the Treasurer. He shall also maintain a complete up-to-date roster of the membership.

TREASURER: Shall collect and disburse all club funds. He shall render a financial report at all National and Regional meetings, or at the request of the Board of Directors. He shall give bond at the expense of the club bf required to do so by the Board of Directors.

MEET COORDINATOR: National, shall determine the place and date of National and special meetings in cooperation with the Board of Directors. Regional, shall determine the place and date of Regional meetings in cooperation with his Regional officers.

ASSISTANT MEET COORDINATOR: Shall assist the Meet Coordinator.

TRAFFIC CONTROL OFFICER: Shall make arrangements for the flow of traffic, routs, parades, convoys, parking facilities, etc., for all meets.

Article VII ELECTIONS AND VOTING

The elections of the following National Officers shall be on an annual basis: President, Vice-President, Secretary, Membership Secretary, Treasurer, Traffic Control Officer, Meet and Ass't Meet Coordinator. The officers shall of necessity, come from the Headquarters region. They shall be nominated by a nominating committee appointed by the Board of Directors in advance of the annual National meeting. They shall be elected by ballot by all members at the annual National meeting. In the event of no annual National meeting, the balloting shall be done by mail. Officers shall take office on Jan 1 of each year and elections shall be completed by that time.

Regional offices shall have a minimum of four officers: President, Vice-President, Secretary and Treasurer and any additional officers deemed necessary. The election of these Officers shall be determined by each individual Region.

Ammendments to this constitution may be made as follows:

- 1 Any Region may propose an amendment by submitting a signed petition, signed by 2/3 of its membership, stating the proposed change or additions, and submitting it to National Headquarters.
- 2 National Headquarters shall publish the proposed changes and/or additions and present them to the membership for approval. Accept ance shall be determined by a two-thirds vote of the membership.

Article VIII MISCELLANEOUS

There shall be no alcholic beverages at any meet.

ALL members shall be insured I'dividually.

The club will not assume any liability for the acts or misdemeanors of any of its members.

All members shall be expected to observe the common courtesies of the road and obey all traffic laws.

All matters not provided for in this constitution shall be decided by the Board of Directors. The Roberts "Rules of Order" shall prevail in all questions of business procedure not provided for in this constitution.

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Board of Directors Position Description

#### **OUTDOOR MEET COORDINATOR**

In this position you are directly responsible for the publicity, planning, coordination, completion and reporting of all outdoor activities of the Wisconsin Chapter. It would help to read the reports from the past meet committees contained in the chapter files, particularly concerning inter-regional meets.

Be sure to start all planning early enough to allow for the successful arrangements of a Meet or parade - at least 10 weeks. Include a copy of the meet expense guidelines for accurate, efficient use of club funds in planning a meet. You should avoid any possible conflict of dates and be aware of events in other areas that our chapter is invited to attend, especially National Meets. You should get as much input from the membership as possible.

Obtain volunteers to run and help with all meets, parades, shows, etc. or appoint members to do many of the jobs in the event. Be sure they are informed of their responsibilities, are following expense guidelines and check occasionally to see that they are proceeding. If a larger than expected expense appears to be in store, approval by the board must be given. In some cases, a committee should be formed to handle all details of a large event, such as the Swap Meet, Picnic and Car Shows.

Contact photographer to be sure all events are covered. If the photographer is unavailable, notify the event chairperson so that they take photos using disposable cameras if they desire.

Remind the event chairperson to submit a follow-up article to the editor before the next deadline.

You are the link between the various meet chairmen and the Board of Directors. Therefore, if the chairman is not on the board, you must inform the board about the meets' progress and be sure the board approves any money or policy involved in the meet.

The meet chairman should handle publicity prior to the meet and a post-meet write-up or you must be sure that the editor has information about the meet. Check with the chairman or committee so they and you are aware of all possible contingencies and possible alternate plans. Be sure the members holding chapter property are informed if an item such as public address system, parade flags, printing, etc. will be needed.

Be sure a map and address (including city and state) of starting location as well as ending location of all tours, etc. is provided to the editor of the Wheeling the "A" along with tour promotion material.

Promotions must be published in at least two newsletter issues prior to the meet.

Wheeling the "A" deadline for articles is the 15th of each month.
