


We will have our own private grass parking area with picnic tables, I have also invited the Chain-O-Lakes Model"A"Club so we can meet some of our Southern friends.

This Model "A" Reunion is the greatest gathering of old Fords and old Ford enthusiasts in Wisconsin. The Reunion, originated in 1962, is sponsored by 4 clubs: Central Wisconsin Chapter MAFCA, Wisconsin Region MARC, Nickle A Region MARC/MAFCA, and the Wisconsin Chapter MAFCA.

The meet consists of a weekend of enjoying Model "A's" and Model "A" fellowship, and includes a tour, people's choice, era fashion judging, kids' games, Hubley Derby, car games, chapter team events, women's rolling pin toss, a dance, fund-raising auction, as well as lots of surprises and fun.

The reunion is held the last full weekend in July, unless it conflicts with a National MARC or MAFCA meet. The Central Wisconsin Chapter MAFCA hosts the reunion on their privately held 10-acre site, which includes a club house, plenty of wooded campsites, and is close to many nice motels and restaurants. These ground were developed and maintained for Model "A" activities.

**Location:** The club grounds are located 4 miles east of Wisconsin Rapids, just south of state Highway 54 (or approximately 11 miles west of Plover. Turn south on 72nd Street (a gravel dead end road).

#### **Weekend Activities**

Refreshments are available throughout the weekend for registered participants.

**Good Food:** A potluck lunch is planned for Saturday and Sunday. Guests and members are asked to bring 2 dishes to pass (one for each day). After a cold January, a snowy February, and an up-and-down March, we're all looking forward to spring daffodils, warmer temperatures, and the start of Model A touring season.



FIFTY YEARS AGO, 1957 – Wisconsin Region members held a meeting to sign a petition directed to the State Motor Vehicle Department. The purpose of this petition was to allow antique or historical license plates.

FORTY-FIVE YEARS AGO, 1962 – There was a discussion at the April meeting on incorporation of the club. Those present were in favor, but the matter was laid over until more legal advice could be obtained.

FORTY YEARS AGO, 1967 - The Swap and Sell Meet was Sunday, April 30<sup>th</sup> at the Wisconsin State Fair grounds. Admission was 50c. Tables and booths were rented for \$2.00.

THIRTY-FIVE YEARS AGO, 1972 – 49 members and one guest attended the judging seminar at Rank & Sons Buick on April 13<sup>th</sup>.



After the presentation, Loren gave us a thorough tour of the plant and explained each of the machines used in the process. 
