

#### MEMORIAL DAY WEEKEND, 2008 Saturday May 24<sup>th</sup>, Sunday May 25th, Monday May 26<sup>th</sup>

All I can say is..."WOW"! Your tour committee made a road trip to lay out our route for the Cherry Tour getaway, and it's going to be fantastic! Although final details need to tweaked, we will rendezvous at Zimmer's Westview Funeral & Cremation Care Center parking lot (Sheboygan's north side) on **Saturday** at about 9:00 a.m., after complimentary coffee, doughnuts, rest stops, gas and a peek at some cool cars, we will head off. Past the world famous Whistling Straights Golf Course, along beautiful back roads next to Lake Michigan.

First stop will be in Manitowoc at the Maritime Museum. There you can take a leisurely stroll along the boardwalk of a 19<sup>th</sup> century maritime community. Also there is a nice display of vintage boats, models and watercraft. See an authentic 1911 triple expansion marine steam engine, and tour the U.S.S. Cobia, a Gato-class WWII sub, moored at the museum and built right in Manitowoc.

#### Cost is \$10/per person and will take about 2 hrs.

From there, we will travel north with gorgeous views of the lake, and beautiful countryside, next stop, Kewaunee, where we will enjoy a lakefront lunch and take some "browsing time at a fantastic Antique Mall. We should arrive at the Best Western in Sturgeon bay around 4 p.m., with hospitality in the poolside area (yes there is a hot tub!). Dinner is on your own, and there are some great restaurants within walking distance of the Motel.

**Sunday** morning we will depart around 8:45 a.m. and tour the east side of the peninsula, including a drive through Whitefish Dunes State Park. The Egg Harbor Lions Club will host a picnic lunch for us at a park, after which you can choose to go to Simon Creek Winery for a tour and tasting, or a large dairy farm for a tour and dairy treats. In the afternoon, we will go over to the west side of the peninsula, and take a leisurely tour to Peninsula State Park, finishing the day with some shopping time in Egg Harbor. The Saturday evening banquet will be held at "The Reef" located a few blocks from our motel. Cost is \$ 15.00/person.

## 46th Annual Model A Reunion July 25th-26th-27th, 2008



This Model "A" Reunion is the greatest gathering of old Fords and old Ford enthusiasts in Wisconsin. The Reunion, originated in 1962, is sponsored by 4 clubs: Central Wisconsin Chapter MAFCA, Wisconsin Region MARC, Nickle A Region MARC/MAFCA, and the Wisconsin Chapter MAFCA.

The meet consists of a weekend of enjoying Model "A's" and Model "A" fellowship, and includes a tour, people's choice, era fashion judging, kids' games, Hubley Derby, car games, chapter team events, women's rolling pin toss, a dance, fund-raising auction, as well as lots of surprises and fun.

The reunion is held the last full weekend in July, unless it conflicts with a National MARC or MAFCA meet. The Central Wisconsin Chapter MAFCA hosts the reunion on their privately held 10-acre site, which includes a club house, plenty of wooded campsites, and is close to many nice motels and restaurants. These ground were developed and maintained for Model "A" activities.

**Location:** The club grounds are located 4 miles east of Wisconsin Rapids, just south of state Highway 54 (or approximately 11 miles west of Plover. Turn south on 72nd Street (a gravel dead end road).

#### Weekend Activities

Refreshments are available throughout the weekend for registered participants.

Good Food: A potluck lunch is planned for Saturday and Sunday. Guests and members are asked to bring 2 dishes to pass (one for each day). Friday and Saturday evening, you may want to roast hotdogs at your campsite or go out for a relaxed dinner at one of the nearby restaurants with a group of your new friends.

**Friday** afternoon the registration table opens. An Auction will be held in the evening of Model A related items, as well as other donations for kids, ladies, and men.

Saturday morning starts with an era fashion show, then a noon potluck, followed by a driving tour. After that is the Hubley Derby and kid's games. A dance will be held at the club house for the evening's entertainment.

**Sunday** is a day of car games, potluck lunch, Chapter team events, and a ladies rolling pin toss, followed by the awards presentation.

#### April 2008 Notes from the Prez......

It's been a busy few weeks for our Wisconsin Chapter despite all the late-season snow. The winter weather let up long enough for our club to stage a successful swap meet February 24 at the Washington County Fairgrounds. Kudos to Roger and Jan Olsen and more than 40 volunteers from our club for all of their hard work and efforts. This is how things get done the right way!

While the final bills are still being processed, it looks like the income from the swap meet will certainly meet our club's financial needs throughout 2008.

Also in late February the audit committee met to review the club's finances from the past year. Bob and Barb Sonnen, Paul and Pat Piotrowski, the Olsens, and I were on this year's committee. We compared checkbook ledgers, bank statements, deposit slips, and receipts for numerous months in 2007, and all checked out perfectly. Paul, as club treasurer, continues to serve us in an outstanding manner. Thanks, Paul!

On the downside, the winter weather put the kibosh on our participation in the annual Milwaukee St. Patrick's Day parade, which fell on March 8 this year, a bit earlier than normal. Lake-effect snow fell in Milwaukee that morning, and given the salty roads from previous storms, the conditions were simply too much for our Model A's.

For those club members who have considered offering their cars for use in the Universal Studios movie "Public Enemies," which tells the






