





Dave Boucher called the meeting to order at 1:30 p.m. with pledge of allegiance.

President – Dave B. – Dave thanked everyone for coming and asked if there were any new members. We received newsletters from the reciprocating Model A clubs. .

Vice President/New Membership/National Correspondent and Sunshine – Steve L. – We received two new membership applications: Les Martin and Keith & Helen Lantz. Paul and Pat Piotrowski have a new grandson. Karen Sukkert's cancer has returned and she will begin treatment later this month.

Secretary – Dave H. – There are no corrections or changes to the minutes from the February 10, 2013 general meeting. 
New Business – MAFCA sent us a 55 year membership recognition certificate.

Era Fashions by Diane Smith



Nicole Groult's two piece sports dress at the extreme left shows a blouse in three tones of the same color, with a collar appliqued and scalloped, worn over a skirt with a wide box pleat giving fullness in the center front. A colored belt in grosgrain silk lends chic to the ensemble.

The costume to the right of it comes from the Maison Paul Poiret and combines a dress with an absurdly smart little bolero jacket. The fitted hip band, with its pointed upward line in front, accents the chic of the dress. The skirt is circular, the blouse plain and fastened at the neck opening with one button. The bolero is longer in back than in the front and has a standing scalloped collar.

Lenief's striking model, centered on the page, features the unusual wrist-to-elbow cuff effect which was noticeable at so many spring openings.

Also from Lenief is the gown shown second from the right. The blouse of the two-piece model is appliqued with two bands in contrasting color, and the band of the same contrasting colors inset at the right of the all-around pleated skirt extends the effect of the diagonally banded blouse.

Another Lenief two-piece design is shown at the extreme right. The bands of applied contrasting color, which are arranged in an unusual sunburst effect on the back, show only a few inches on the simple, slightly bloused front of the frock. An appealing little Peter Pan collar draws attention to the simple neck line, the severity of which is accentuated by three prim buttons. Set-in sleeves, long and tight, wrinkled purposely below the elbow, repeat the striking trimming of the frock and add a decorative note to the whole. In Paris these street gowns are often made in heavy crepe de chine.

February technical meet – How to install king-pin bearings and thrust washers

Front-end shimmy is not uncommon among our Model A's. Depending on the nature of the shimmy, it can occur at slow speeds, at high speeds, or be triggered by changes in the surface of the road, such as a railroad-track crossing.

Causes can include worn king pins, loose wheel bearings, loose tie-rod ends, a loose steering box, excess play in the Pittman arm connection, or a radius-rod ball that causes suspension geometry to deviate from Model A standards.

Club member Bob Schaefer lead February's Technical Meet in which he replaced worn king pin bearings on his Model A. King pins hold the front-wheel spindles to the ends of the axle and allow the spindles to turn left and right as you steer your car.

Bob discovered that one of his front wheels had excess upand-down movement. While his car was up on a jack, by grabbing the front wheel with both hands he could wiggle the top and bottom of the wheel inward toward the engine or outward toward the lip of the fender. Bob determined that a king pin or its bushings were worn and needed to be replaced. A third part of the king-pin assembly – thrust bearings – when worn or incorrectly assembled can cause hard steering.

Bob removed his wheel spindle brought it to the February Technical Meet on Feb. 21 to explain to more than 25 club members how to replace two bushings on the spindle, how to ream them, and how to properly install the king pin and the thrust washers.

Bob used one end of a reaming tool to remove the old bushings. The tool itself, as shown in the photo, looks similar to a large drill bit. The end of the reaming tool is designed to fit into the lip of a bushing. Using the tool the old bushings can be hammered out.

New bushings are pressed into place, not hammered. A bench vise can be used. Bob then used the reaming tool to perfectly align the inside of the two bushings to accept the shaft of the king pin. Reaming the bushings takes some muscle, as shown in the photos. By twisting the reamer as

it passes through both bushings from top to bottom, tiny slivers of the bushings are carved away until the openings in both bushings are in perfect alignment. Bob ran the reamer through the bushings about four complete times until the king pin fit properly.

After the king pin was slipped into the new bushings, Bob, along with club member Roger Olson, explained how thrust bearings are used in the spindle-and-king-pin assembly to put the weight of the front of the car onto the surface of the bushings, where it belongs. If the thrust washers are not shimmed properly, the weight is misplaced and can cause hard steering and improper frontend wear.

The shim process is trial and error, and after two or three tries the correct number of shims were found.

King-pin rebuilding kits are available from parts suppliers and components like the bearings and thrust-washer shims can be purchased separately. The Model A Ford Mechanics Handbook, Vol. 1, by Les Andrews give a good explanation about replacing king pins and the book includes several diagrams.

The final technical meet of the season was March 21 at Mail Truck Model A Parts on Howell Avenue in Oak Creek. Thanks once again to Tony Baudo for allowing club members to meet in his store. The next indoor technical meet will be in October. All ideas for future seminars are welcome! – *Neil Besougloff, technical meet chairman*

Looking in the Rearview Mirror

Dog Agility

On March 10, 2013, at our indoor general meeting Patti Muraczewski from *For Pet's Sake* dog training in Mukwonago gave a presentation on dog agility and scenting. Linda Huenink introduced their two dogs Morgan the Wonder Dog a smooth fox terrier and Teddy a soft coated wheaten terrier and talked briefly about both breeds.

Dog agility is a dog sport in which a handler directs a dog through an obstacle course for both time and accuracy. Dogs run off-leash with no food or toys as incentives and the handler can not touch the dog nor obstacles. The handlers controls are limited to voice, movement and various body signals requiring exception training of the animal and coordination of the handler.

An agility course consists of a set of standard obstacles laid out by a judge. The surface of the course may be grass, dirt, rubber or special matting. Courses are complicated enough that a dog could not complete the course correctly without human direction.

A simple agility course was set up at the meeting and Morgan the wonder dog was on site to show his skills as he demonstrated with Dave Huenink how he runs a course. Linda Huenink showed how their other dog Teddy runs a course. Patti's dog Kirby gave a performance too. Then each handler and dog competed to see who would complete the course the fastest. Dave and Linda with their two dogs compete on a regular basis and have almost completed their title or "catch". They must complete 5 levels of difficulty and there are 6 different strategy courses in each level.

Patti also explained about dog scenting. Dogs have an amazing sense of smell and a natural desire to hunt. New enthusiasts are participating in this sport where a dog must find a certain scent in a specified period of time. There are different titles given in this sport. Several types of scents (birch, anise and clove) are used. A scent was placed twice in the room and Kirby found it both times.
