Club Mission Statement



The meeting was called to order at 1:38 P.M.



This month we feature 'Cranberry Dessert' (Betty Campbell, from WI Chapter, "A" Road to Good Cooking)

2 c. whole cranberries 1 c. sugar ½ c. sugar 1 c. flour

½ c. chopped nuts2 eggs, beaten well1 tsp. baking powder½ c. melted butter

Mix the cranberries, $\frac{1}{2}$ cup sugar and chopped nuts. Put the cranberry mixture in the bottom of a greased and floured 9 x 11 inch pan.

Make batter: Add 1 cup sugar to the beaten eggs. Gradually add flour and baking powder mixture. Add melted butter. Beat well. Pour over cranberries. Bake at 325 degrees for 45 minutes, until golden brown. Serve with whipped cream, Dream Whip or ice cream.


We learned about filling stations from the beginning and how they transformed over the years including the transformation from simply selling gas to full service stations and now our modern convenience stores.


Thank you all for attending and next time you're filling up your vehicle remember how much engineering went into the canopy above you to keep it standing in all kinds of weather conditions.
