





Reminiscing with the Historian

FIFTY YEARS AGO, 1960 - No information available

FORTY-FIVE YEARS AGO, 1965 - A car rally was organized that started at Brookfield Mall and ended at Stanton's Hall. Eleven Model A's, one Model B, and three modern cars participated. The winner was Marv Powell, who was presented with a silver cup.

FORTY YEARS AGO, 1970 - We were invited to Carthage College in Kenosha to display our cars for the students and their families. An economy run was planned for the first outdoor meet. It started at 60th and National and ended in Mukwonago. Fifteen cars participated and the winner was Art Peterson, who got 26.6 mpg!

THIRTY-FIVE YEARS AGO, 1975 - Plans were being made for our 10th annual swap meet at a new location: MacArthur Square. Movies were shown of past events at the indoor meet.

THIRTY YEARS AGO, 1980 - The first outdoor meet of the season began at Brookfield Square and ended at the Jolly Fisherman on Pewaukee Lake.

TWENTY-FIVE YEARS AGO, 1985 - Dash plaques were given to all who participated in the first outdoor meet that went from Southridge Shopping Center to the Knights of Columbus Hall on Oklahoma Ave. A technical seminar was held at Avenue Brake Shop. The topic was car judging.

TWENTY YEARS AGO, 1990 - Dennis and Margaret Haag hosted our first outdoor tour. They took us through the countryside in Ozaukee County, along the lake and then to Belgium, Wisconsin.

FIFTEEN YEARS AGO, 1995 - Carl & Bobbie Weckwerth and Wally & Sally Kaufman hosted our spring tour to Elkhorn, where we toured Watson's Wild West Museum.

TEN YEARS AGO, 2000 - The spring tour started at 76th and Rawson, taking us into Illinois and to the Old Volo Country Village. We toured the 100,000 sq. ft. facility that housed antiques and cars.

FIVE YEARS AGO, 2005 - The spring tour took us to the Matt Kenseth NASCAR showroom and on to Cambridge. The tour was hosted by Stan and Pat Larson.


Learning to Use Our Lathe

We started out using our lathe by learning how to turn down an oil pump shaft from 1/2" to 3/8" to increase oil flow. The Model B pump was of this type to supply oil pressure to the cam and main bearings due to the fact the B engine has pressurized main bearings. This will help those who would like to have more flow for their oil filters.

We also learned how to fix a steering shaft. Jeff showed us how to drill out and re-thread for the new fitting available at Mail Truck. We learned how to repair the shaft in a short time for about \$23.00 instead of purchasing a new one for more than \$90.00.

History of the Lathe:

The lathe is an ancient tool, dating at least to the Egyptians and known and used in Assyria, Greece, the Roman and Byzantine Empires.

The origin of turning dates to around 1300 BC when the Egyptians first developed a two-person lathe. One person would turn the wood work piece with a rope while the other used a sharp tool to cut shapes in the wood. The Romans improved the Egyptian design with the addition of a turning bow. Early bow lathes were also developed and used in Germany, France and Britain. In the middle ages a pedal replaced hand-operated turning, freeing both the craftsman's hands to hold the woodturning tools. The pedal was usually connected to a pole, often a straight-grained sapling. The system today is called the "spring pole" lathe. Spring pole lathes were in common use into the early 20th century. A twoperson lathe, called a "great lathe", allowed a piece to turn continuously (like today's power lathes). A master would cut the wood while an apprentice turned the crank.

During the industrial revolution, mechanized power generated by water wheels or steam engines was transmitted to the lathe via line shafting, allowing faster and easier work. The design of lathes diverged between woodworking and metalworking to a greater extent than in previous centuries. Metalworking lathes evolved into heavier machines with thicker, more rigid parts. The application of lead screws slide rests, and gearing produced commercially practical screw cutting lathes. Between the late 19th and mid-20th centuries, individual electric motors at each lathe replaced line shafting as the power source. Beginning in the 1950s, servomechanisms were applied to the control of lathes and other machine tools via numerical control (NC), which often was coupled with computers to yield computerized numerical control (CNC).
