PREZ NOTES FOR AUGUST 2008

In late June I flew down to Dallas, Texas, to hook up with some Model A friends from Missouri for the 3rd MARC/MAFCA World Model A Meet. What an experience!

With more than 800 registrants, perhaps 500 or so Model A's, and a total somewhere near 1,200 people (counting spouses and family members), this type of meet was something all of us should experience.

It was back in the 1980s when the Wisconsin Chapter hosted a World Meet at Lake Geneva. Many new members have joined our club in the two decades since, and I know there are many members today who have never attended a national event.

The week of activities in Dallas, hosted by the Dallas Model A Club, included an outdoor and indoor swap meet, clinics and seminars, a welcoming party, a banquet, a daily hospitality room, car judging, and, of course, the opportunity to look over hundreds of Model A's from California to New England and all points in between.

Many of the cars were driven to Texas, and others were trailered (some of the rigs were more impressive than the A's!)

Among the interesting A's we encountered was a blue roadster that had been recently driven by a couple from Indiana all the way to Alaska via the Al-Can Highway (the story was chronicled in one of the national Model A magazines); a beautiful 1931 A-400 convertible coupe with a 1932 grill and shell, mid-1930s steel wheels, air conditioning, and under its hood a modern 2.3 liter 4-cylinder Ford engine; and a number of commercial trucks including one pickup painted for a Dr. Pepper bottler.

I also saw two fire trucks (a pumper and a ladder truck), the Huff and Puff yellow Model A school bus (the varnished interior looked like a Woody on steroids), a homemade four-door crew cab pickup, and numerous speedsters, some with wild-looking racing heads and other modified accessories.

I was surprised to see how many Model A's had air conditioning, but given that the meet was in Texas in June (it reached 99 degrees one day) and the fact that many of the cars were from the Lone Star State, I shouldn't have been too surprised.

Besides the cars, activities, and of course food (we had Texas BBQ our final night in town), there were bus tours including a trip to the Texas Book Depository museum in downtown Dallas, where Lee Harvey Oswald assassinated President Kennedy. While we all know the story, looking out the museum's sixth floor windows down onto the pavement next to the grassy knoll, the same view Oswald had, was sobering.

The highlight of the meet was a tour to Texas Motor Speedway, a NASCAR circuit track. All Model A's were entitled to three laps around the 1.5-mile track in heats of about 25 cars each. With so many A's in attendance, the event took seemingly half a day to complete.

Since my own Model A was back in Wisconsin, I rode in the rumble seat of my friend's coupe. He was in the passenger seat and his son was driving. Needless to say, it was a thrill to be in the rumble seat as we rounded the four banked turns (yes, we were up on the 24-degree banking) at 50-plus mph

behind the track's pace car.

While the Dallas meet has now come and gone, there will be other national meets each summer. All of our club members should consider attending a national meet. It's a great opportunity to travel (perhaps with your Model A), meet new people, learn new things, see new places, and eyeball Model A's from all over the country. – Neil Besougloff

Reminiscing With the Historian

FIFTY YEARS AGO, 1958 - The Model A Ford Club assembled at the Howard Johnson Southgate parking lot to start the tour to the 1958 National Meet in Dearborn, Michigan. There were tours of the Ford Rouge plant and the Ford Museum. The club went on a sightseeing tour of Detroit and crossed the bridge into Windsor, Canada. The tour coordinator was Wally Klager.

FORTY-FIVE YEARS AGO, 1963 - New members were Alfred Ziegler and sons Daniel and James. Harold Sponholz rejoined the club after dropping out for a time.

FORTY YEARS AGO, 1968 - There was no newsletter for August, just a flyer for the 7th annual Momence Gladiolus Festival at Momence Island Park in Illinois.

THIRTY-FIVE YEARS AGO, 1973 - August was busy with a rap session/seminar at The Avenue Brake Shop, the annual picnic at Muskego Park in Waukesha County hosted by Mike Brojanac, the Concord regional meet and the Brookfield Square Show.

THIRTY YEARS AGO, 1978 - The picnic was held at Raebel's Friess Lake Inn in Washington County, so swimming could be included in the activities. There was a tug-of-war with the 1928-29 team versus 1930-31. The Hard Luck award was given to Gene Lowerr, as his truck was boiling over as he entered the parking lot. "Family of the Month" was the Dennis Pierce family.

TWENTY-FIVE YEARS AGO, 1983 - Over 70 families turned out at the El Dorado retreat picnic grounds on Bass's Bay in Muskego. 600 hot dogs were grilled and 40 dozen corn roasted. Mike and Carol Mazurkiewicz dished out the ice cream and the Sukkerts planned the games for young and old.

TWENTY YEARS AGO, 1988 - This year's picnic was held at Harnischfeger's 150 acre park. The summer was very dry and hard on the corn crops so watermelon replaced corn on the menu. Hosts were the Schultzes, Kanes, and Gillens.

FIFTEEN YEARS AGO, 1993 - The 35th annual Threshing Bee and Engine Show was attended by many of our club members. The annual picnic was held August 1st and there was a Manitowoc overnighter.

TEN YEARS AGO, 1998 - The Board meeting hosts were Dave and Dawn Dohmeyer. Club members displayed cars at the Oak Hill Village Show. Jim Kummer and Dave Boucher hosted the picnic.

FIVE YEARS AGO, 2003 - Ferch's Malt Shoppe held a 50's-60's music Cruise Night. The eighth annual Racine Zoo Classic Car Show was hosted by Bob Heinrich, and the picnic was hosted by George and Carolyn Wartner and Rich and Liz Miller.
