



Fermentation Tour October 11, 2020

We will meet at McDonalds, S71 W23466 National Ave, Big Bend, Wisconsin on **Sunday, October 11, 2020 at 10:00 a.m.** for some breakfast (which will be on your own). We will depart at 10:30 ish and tour the country side as we head to **Brightonwoods Orchard** in Burlington Wisconsin. The orchard was established in 1950 and they have over 4000 dwarf and semi-dwarf fruit trees. They grow many different types of produce such as apples, grapes, quince and pears. Items that can be **fermented** in to alcohol. At the peak of the season they have 40 varieties of apples available. Brightonwoods Orchard has over 200 heirloom apple varieties and the apple selection change's weekly, depending on the ripening and picking schedule. Brightonwoods' emphasis is on preserving existing heirloom varieties and growing standard and newer commercial varieties. Apple cider is also made on site and is available. We'll be able to walk around the orchard, visit the apple barn, and stroll through the wooded trails. They are especially beautiful when the leaves are changing color

A collaborative venture with **AeppelTreow Winery** began in 2001 and they are also on site. We'll be able to stop there also. AeppelTreow Winery & Distillery is a producer of small batch cider, perry and spirits. The winery specializes in apple and pear fruit wines, hard ciders and dessert wines. An on-site distillery allows the winery to also produce special brandies and sorghum whiskey. We will be able to sample up to five samples for free. 

Club president back in 1974 was Carl Wussow, Lee Spellman served as vice president, our recording secretary was Bill Hermann, and Charles Hickling took care of the finances.

August 9-10: AACA President's Cup Meet was held at the Ramada Inn, Waukesha

August 17 was our Board meeting

August 18 Annual picnic, Muskego Park. Bring your own meal, drinks and ice cream provided. There were games for children as well as adults. Over 50 model 'A's and vintage cars made their appearance.

August 25-26 Concord Regional Meet – a beautiful wooded 200 acre site containing 2 lakes with swimming and fishing, camping areas, large banquet/dance hall, field for car games and enough room for everyone. The meet included countryside tours, car games, buffet dinner, dance, car and costume judging and awards.

September 7-8 Rank & Son Antique – Classic Car Show. Last year police estimated attendance at approx. 130,000 people. There was a sky diving exhibition, along with other entertainment and a huge display of army guns and equipment. Car owners received two tickets for beer and brats and breakfast was free coffee and sweet rolls.

1 Tbsp. butter





Installing Fuses On Your Model A

Just to prevent a small electrical problem from becoming an even bigger one, many of us like to install a fuse on our Model A. You've all seen them, the little fuse holder that mounts to the side of the starter switch, holds a little glass fuse, and connects to the solid yellow wire A great idea, but it has a few weaknesses.

First an open fuse holder like this will eventually corrode as it is exposed to the elements. It mist and road grime will collect it and give you a bad connection. Vibration from the engine will loosen up the little metal clips that the fuse snaps down into. With time, this little fuse holder becomes a trouble spot in your electrical system. I've seen it several times on tours.

It is possible to purchase a molded fuse holder with a waterproof cover that snaps securely over the fuse (see photo). It uses a flat, blade-type fuse that can be obtained in any amp rating you need. They work on 6 volt or 12 volt cars. You splice it into the wiring harness and solder the connections (not just crimp them on). Cover with woven loom to hide everything except the fuse itself and it disappears (mostly). Much better.

I'm often asked where to put the fuse. If you only put it on the solid yellow wire at the starter switch, if it ever blows while driving, your engine will die right there. This might be at a very bad time to have no power, when you really need your engine running. It could be dangerous.

Most shorts that would cause a fuse to blow are in the lights or the horn. I recommend putting fuses in the two solid yellow wires coming off of the generator (alternator) that go to the headlight switch and the horn. If one of these fuses blows, you won't have lights or a horn, but your engine will still run. Figure out how much current your lights draw and put a fuse about 25% bigger than that on that wire. The same with horn wire. If you accidentally use too small of a fuse, it will blow and you replace it with one of a slightly were amp rating.

three you have installed these first two fuses, then you add a third fuse to the yellow wire coming off of the starter switch. Use a fuse amperage here that is a bit bigger than the offes you used for lights and horn. This becomes your protection against a really big problem in all of the wires besides lights and horn (like ammeter and associated wires). In this fuse should not blow if you have a short in the lights or horn, so the engine will keep running and you can limp home (without horn or stop lights -- be careful). But if you have a major short, one capable of starting a fire, the 3rd fuse will blow and save your car.

This is one of my more complicated Tech Tips. I hope it helps your car stay safe and reliable. I'm always open to feedback. Have a Model A Day! Jim
