

# Saturday, August 13

Pump up your tires and test out that Aooooga horn. Fill up the tank and mark it in pen on your calendar. We are headed to the Beckman Mill located at Beckman Mill County Park, six miles west of Beloit on Saturday, August 13.

We will be treated to a docent-led tour of the buildings and grounds. Approximately 1.5-2 hours in length. There is a gift shop as well a museum to carouse through.

On the grounds of the 50-acre county park you will see an authentically restored 1868 grist mill, a new dam, mill pond, fish ladder, foot bridge, saw mill display, 1840s cooperage, visitor center, gift shop, creamery, blacksmith shop, picnic shelter, vintage garden, nature trail and more.

The showpiece of the park is the Beckman Mill, the restoration of which was completed

in 1997 by the Friends of Beckman Mill's volunteer work crew. It is operational with power being supplied by its original 1860s water driven Leffel turbine. In the event alternate power is needed, the mill can be operated by its vintage two-cylinder gasoline engine. The mill was built shortly after the Civil War by millwright William Howe of Beaver Dam, Wisconsin. In 1882 it was acquired by August Beckmann who had previously operated mills in nearby Juda and Hanover. The mill was placed on the National Register of Historic Places in 1977.

# September Tour

Mark your calendars, on Sunday September 18th, 2022 for the fishiest tour ever. Dave and Linda Huenink will be hosting a tour to the **Rushing Waters Fishery** in Palmyra Wisconsin. 12,000 years ago,



a glacier came through and left behind a wonderfully wild area dotted with hills, valleys, lakes, and streams. The "kettles" are an amazing recreation area, and many outdoor enthusiasts choose to call it home. Here, Rushing Waters has been raising trout since the 1940s, when they sold and bartered trout at Navy Pier in Chicago during WWII.

In 1994, Wisconsin entrepreneur Bill Graham purchased Rushing Waters and later hired limnologist Peter Fritsch, and together they made a "Quality not Quantity" commitment. This commitment has become the guiding light for everything we do. Trout are raised in crisp, clear 50° outdoor natural spring water ponds, and are fed an all-natural, chemical-free, hormone-free diet. The fish are raised in an ecosystem that closely mimics a trout's native habitat, and are raised to the highest quality rainbow trout available on the market today. If you have not tried the trout from Rushing Waters, it is a must try item. The taste is second to none.

**Departure:** We will meet at the McDonald's on Highway 164 and National Ave. in Big Bend at around 9:00 a.m. for breakfast on your own. At 9:45 a.m. we will take a scenic tour of the country side and Kettle Moraine State Forest, as we head to our destination in Palmyra. At the Rushing Waters Fishery, we will have a guided tour, put together especially for us, of the 3 trout pond's, learn how the fish eggs are hatched through their various stages of life to when the fish are ready for harvest. We'll have a few minutes after the tour to visit the gift shop where you will be able to buy fresh or frozen fish as well as other food and gift items. (Bring a cooler and ice to keep your fish purchases in).

Then we will be off to our next destination through the country roads to – **The Apple Barn Orchard and Winery in Elkhorn.** You will have an opportunity to do some wine tasting, buy apples, enjoy cider donuts, listen to some live music and visit the inhouse bakery to purchase some sweet treats. There will also be a food truck available to purchase food. RSVPs are appreciated so we can give the fishery, as well as the orchard, a count of the number of club members attending. 
Lorraine Schultz had knee replacement surgery in June and is doing well.

# 'A' Trip Back to the CHALLENGE

For the 15th time in his career, Joey Chestnut has captured the Mustard Belt on the Fourth of July weekend. Chestnut won the 2022 Nathan's Hot Dog Eating Contest by eating 63 hot dogs and buns in ten minutes. On the women's side, Miki Sudo won with 40 hot dogs and buns. It marked Sudo's ninth consecutive Nathan's Hot Dog Eating Contest victory in contests in which she has competed.

But – that's not the challenge I was referring to. Back in 1985 the January/February issue of the Restorer Magazine ran an article about an activity put on by the Santa Clara Valley (California) Chapter of MAFCA where they had assembled 72 running Model 'A's all owned by club members, in one location for an outing. They challenged any club to "Match or beat our numbers – Bet You Can't".

In May of 1985, Jerry Manning (Loose Lug Nuts) posted an article in the Wheeling the "A", challenging fellow Wisconsin Chapter members to beat the Santa Clara Challenge with a goal of 100 model 'A's at the Greater Milwaukee Car Show. "Well, fellow Chapter members, are we going to take this challenge lying down? Are we going to let some group of California hotshots make the largest individual chapter in the national club look bad? Do we want to let the world find out that the hosts of the 1986 World Meet can't get 100 Model 'A's out for a car show? PROBABLY! That is unless you take up Loose Lug Nuts' challenge!". The event was chaired by Mike Brojanac and although the goal was 100 cars, on July 21, 1985, the Wisconsin Chapter of MAFCA beat the Santa Clara Challenge by fielding 76 cars. The challenge was issued again, this time by Wisconsin.

Unfortunately, just seven short weeks later the Fort Worth, Texas Chapter of MAFCA set the record by assembling 124 Model 'A' Fords. In order to meet the rules of the challenge, all cars must be owned by club members and driven to the parking place. The November/December 1985 issue of the Restorer used the Wisconsin Chapter story to lead into the Fort Worth's accomplishments.

This month we feature Refrigerator Sweet Sour Dills (Hazel Limpert, from Wi Chapter, "A" Road to Good Cooking)

1 jar prepared dil ½ cup vineagar 1 cinnamon stick ½ cup water

1 cup sugar



Slice dills in chunks. Pour boiling water over dills and let stand for ten minutes. Rinse in cold water and discard the water. Boil and pour over the pickles the remaining ingredients. Pack in sterilized jars. Pickles are ready to enjoy in a few days. Keep in refrigerator.

# Greendale 4th of July parade

The club participated in the Greendale, 4<sup>th</sup> of July parade and the weather was glorious. The streets were lined with many parade spectators, who enjoyed seeing our cars and hearing the ahooga horn. The Gillen family had the opportunity to have "Eleanor Roosevelt" in their rumble seat as they drove through the parade. Do you wonder how Eleanor Roosevelt is tied to Greendale? In 1936 the U.S. Department of Agriculture began construction on three new communities, known as Greenbelt Towns, as a part of President Roosevelt's New Deal. One of them was in Greendale Wisconsin. Built to demonstrate a new kind of suburban living, these towns were built so that housing was situated within easy walking distance of gardens, employment and the town center. Eleanor visited the project in 1936 – 1937 to see the housing being built. We also got a glimpse of Betsy Ross working the American flag on a float.

Ten Model A's, of various styles, and a 1936 Ford Roadster were present in the club's line up in the parade along with twenty-four club members. Everyone had a great time. We enjoyed each other's company, contemplated the day and munched on some goodies. I am happy to report, all cars performed well. This year we again had the pleasure of the UW Madison marching band "The Badgers", playing their instruments, and marching along with us as we drove our cars through the parade. We had the pleasure of following the Dancing Grannies who were very entertaining to the crowd and us. Thank you to all who participated and I hope everyone had a great 4<sup>th</sup> of July.
