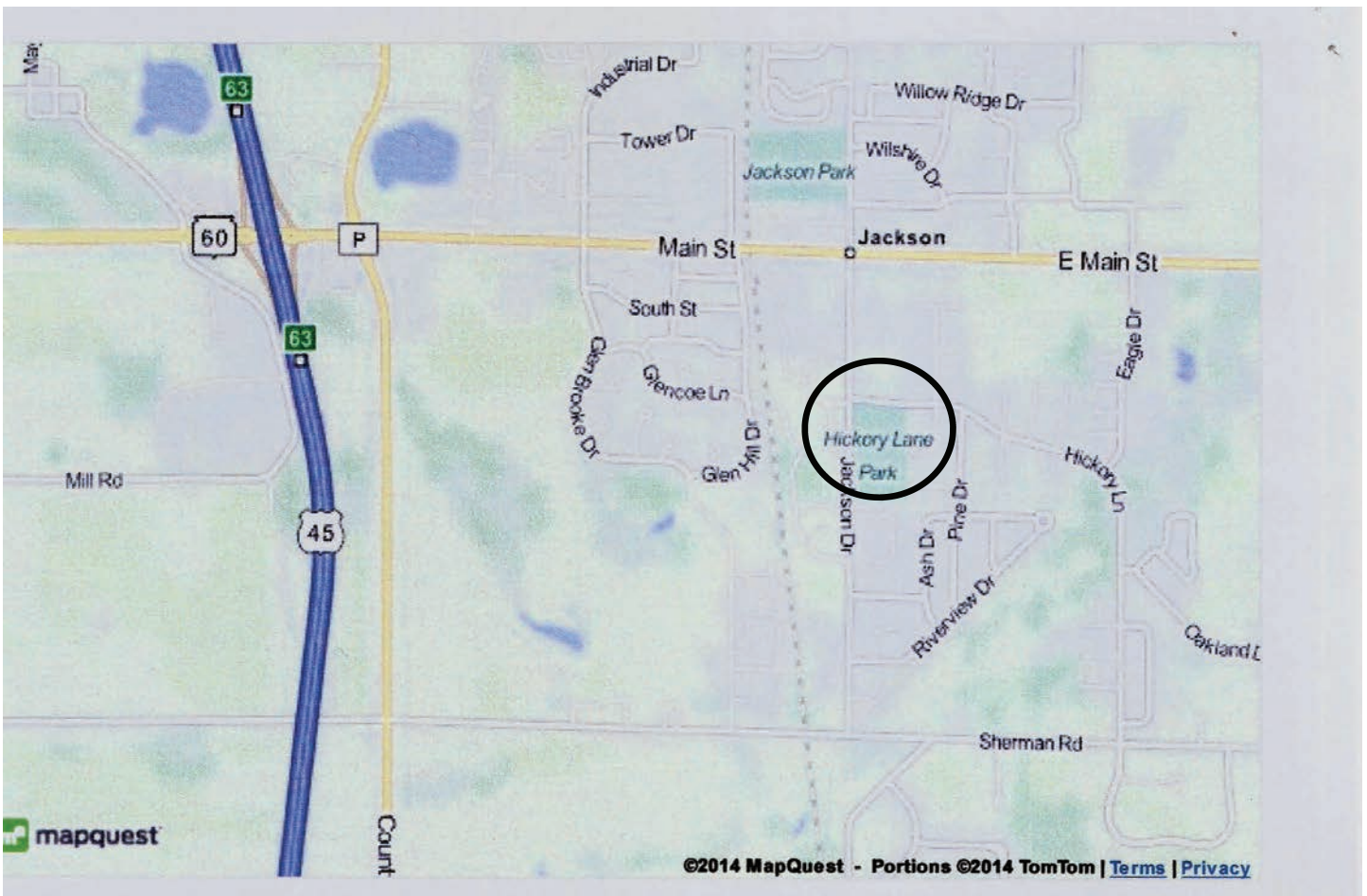

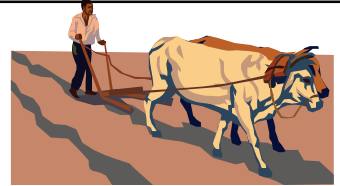

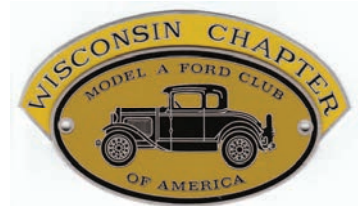

**Indoor** – Dave B. – The club is all set for the fall / winter indoor events. Dave mention he may need some help with the January event.

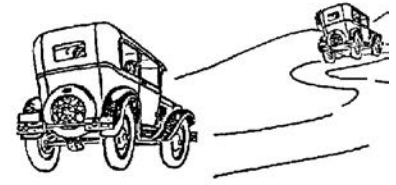
**Old Business** – none

The club purchased a 1 ½ inch socket and breaker bar for the inside nut (*hmmm, I can think of some inside nuts in this group – just kidding*) on shock absorbers. *A reminder that tools are available for loan to club members.*

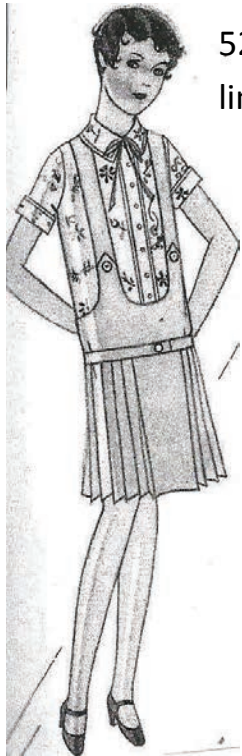

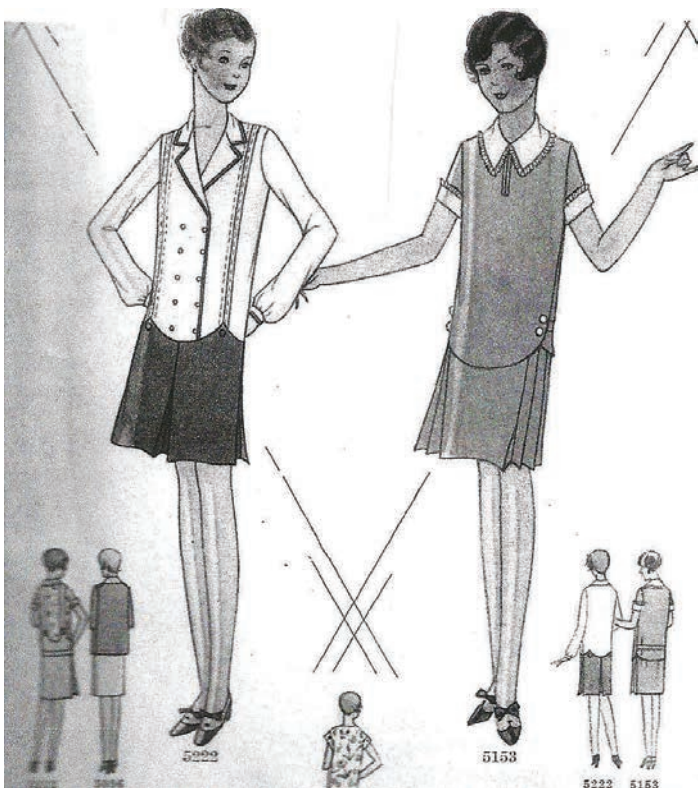
